

Enclosed you will find the 2018 Mileage Certificate for the Town of Granville.

We have made two changes to our highway system during the past year. Each is attached as a separate packet. To assist in your review, here is a brief overview:

- 1. Addition of Short Hills Way as a Class 4 Highway. This addition to our road system with a length of 889 feet or 0.17 miles overlays an existing private road across the property of two private landowners. It was supported by the landowners involved. The advantage to the Town of Granville is that it moves traffic off bridges on Town Highway #16 and Town Highway #36. The TH#36 bridge, in particular, over Albee Brook has proven difficult and expensive to maintain. Short Hills Spur connects TH#16 Kennedy Road with TH#36 McDonald Road with no bridges involved. TH#16 and TH#36 will remain unchanged on our Town Highway Map.
- 2. Map Adjustment of Kennedy Road TH#16. The western terminus of TH#16, as shown on the Town Highway Map, does not match the original survey, and that has raised a conflict with historic archaeological sites on the Green Mountain National Forest. The Town Highway Map shows TH#16 turning to the North at its western end, routing the road through archeological sites protected by the Forest Service. This northerly turn does not exist in the original road survey (10/22/1850; Book 8; Page 106. Copy attached). In fact, the final call on that survey is North 36 West (approximately N43W to True North in 2018) for 29 rods. It appears that over the years it became convenient to drive through an old farm yard to connect with Forest Service Road #101 rather than stay on the original right-of-way. In 2015, the town and local District Ranger agreed road maintenance equipment should not be driven through the archaeological sites. Instead, the original terminus of TH#16 was found just 345 feet to the south. Some clearing of the old right-of-way was needed, but all parties are satisfied as to the location. We have suggested a simple map adjustment to place TH#16 in the correct location and solve the problem. No change in mileage (1.5 mi.) is needed.







SHORT HILLS SKI CLUB MINUTES OF OCTOBER 10, 2017 BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

The meeting was held at the Elks Lodge and was called to order at 6:25 p.m. by Chairman of the Board Nick Kaltneckar.

In attendance: Joel Blank, Kerry Coffman, Larry Goldberg, Monica Hahn, Chuck Hinz, Nick Kaltneckar, Dave Kapner, Ken Ottesen, Ann Rice, Don Willmot and Jen Willmot. Absent: John Straus.

After discussion, it was agreed that the August Board meeting Minutes can be approved if we revise the last sentence under the "New Family Weekend Sign-Up Policy" to read: "This only includes first night sign-ups for the designated family weekends." Motion to approve: 1st: Nick Kaltneckar; 2nd: Dave Kapner. Vote taken; all were in favor. The August Board meeting Minutes are approved.

Any corrections to the September 12, 2017 Board meeting Minutes? None. Motion to approve: 1st: Ann Rice; 2nd: Ken Ottesen. Vote taken; all were in favor. The September Board meeting Minutes are approved.

OFFICER'S REPORTS

PRESIDENT, Joel Blank: The President sent his report out under separate cover. In addition, with regard to the Club's taxes, we are asking for an extension. Joel picked the materials up from Frank, the accountant. We have to cross some T's and dot some I's; then the materials will be re-submitted to Frank for filing.

Joel advised that over the past few days he has been receiving emails relating to the Winter weekend trip assignments. In the past, if you wanted to captain a weekend, you would fill out a form or contact the Lodge V-P and advise him, and after October 31, the Lodge V-P would notify you if you received your requested weekend. A very lengthy discussion ensued in connection with whether the Trip Chair or the Lodge V-P makes the decision as to whether a requested weekend is approved and the chain of events that brought this issue to light. The outcome of the discussion was that the Members should be made aware that the Trip Chair reports to the Lodge V-P. The Trip Chair and the Lodge V-P have a very good working relationship and that they work as a team; however, weekend assignments are not official until the beginning of November. This is not really a Board issues, and all inquiries in this regard should have been directed to the Lodge V-P. Joel clarified that when he receives an email on any given topic, he does not respond to them, but rather, he forwards them on to the appropriate party for response.

Joel advised that Mike Dalton at Ski Barn offered us a table at his tent sale over Columbus Day Weekend. Joel represented SHSC and was very busy. Joel noted that many of the visitors to our table were families with children and were interested in a "family club". The point was made that although you must be 21 to be a Member of our Club, we do in fact have Family Weekends once a month, and children are welcome during those times. Many of the Members have children who have grown up spending weekends at our Lodge.

MEMBERSHIP VICE-PRESIDENT, Jem Willmot: The V-P Membership's report was submitted via email. Jen also advised that she pulled the PayPal report. Quite a few Members have renewed via PayPal. Jen has a spreadsheet indicating who has paid via PayPal and who submitted an application. Those who pay via PayPal still need to sign the waiver form; Jen will have to chase people down for that. On our new website, maybe we can add a waiver on PayPal.

LODGE VICE-PRESIDENT, Don Willmot: We recently had a Work Weekend. The back deck was stained. There was a lot of scraping and painting. Some of the toilets were reseated. The work room upstairs was cleaned out. A lot of junk was thrown away. Ken Ottesen and Don insulated under the Bilco doors. The biggest accomplishment was when we threw out the old water heater. John Orrecchio dismantled it, and it went out the back door. All of the garbage has either been picked up, or it went home with Don in his truck to be disposed of.

Don advised that we have a new garbage company -- a local guy, Mike McIntyre. He does not charge a monthly fee, as Able does. He will charge for what we put out. He will take the recycling from the Mud Room. Able is done, so if Kerry receives another bill from Able, he should check with Don before paying it. It was mentioned that the trash barrels outside in the little shed are full and the barrels in the Mud Room were not taken out. We should call Mike and tell him to take them out.

On a recent weekend, here was a power outage for 2 1/2 - 3 hours because a storm cut out the power. It was noticed during that time that on the first floor of the new wing, the Exit light near Room 5 is dead.

GENERAL TREASURER, Ken Ottesen: The General Treasurer submitted his report previously, and it is incorporated herein: "Checking: \$18,447.04; Money Market: \$14,524.51, for a total of \$32,971.55".

LODGE TREASURER, Kerry Coffman: Checking: \$11,227.88; ATM: \$1,613.09; Money Market: \$18,448.5, for a total of \$31,289.52. This includes a transfer of \$1,000 to the ATM. This does not include: the check to the cook for Columbus Day Weekend; \$2,000 for taxes in November; \$1,000 that is due in early November for insurance, the wood payment, or the payment for the hot water heaters, so the report will look different in November. Revenue for Summer and Fall are down 40% from last year. Kerry has not yet received the money from Bike and Hike Weekend.

Kerry advised that our internet and phone provider was bought out, and we received a big bill on which there were a lot of mistakes. It was a \$300 bill, and our bill is usually about \$77.00. We were charged for a new wireless router. This has now been straightened out.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Open Trustee Position: There are five applicants for the one open Trustee position: Tracy Dragos, Eileen Kealy, Larry Posner, Tatia Stettner and Jan Zymroz. We need a motion to nominate the applicants. Dave Kapner made a motion to nominate every person on the list; 2nd: Kerry Coffman. We will vote by paper ballot, and the person who receives the most votes will be our new Trustee. If there is a high vote tie, we will vote again only on those who tied; everyone else is out at that point. The Board Members then voted via paper ballot. The votes were counted by the President and the Secretary. Jan Zymroz received the highest number of votes and is our new Trustee.

Membership Renewals / Delinquent Letters: Delinquency letters were not sent out last year. In the past when a Member received a delinquency letter two years in a row, they were set back to "Applicant". That has been the policy we have followed for at least the last ten years, but it was not actually changed in writing in the Policy. At the last meeting, we did discuss that maybe we should change the policy. Discussion ensued during which Ann Rice read Section F.2. of the Bylaws under "Suspension; Expulsion; Failure of Interest; Rescission" aloud. It was also noted that a previous Membership V-P re-wrote the description for the Membership V-P job, but went off-track with it and it does not coincide with the Bylaws. Jen Willmot noted that when she was Membership V-P previously, when a person was deficient and their name came up at a Membership meeting, she called them and explained to them what requirements they were missing and explained how they go from Active to Associate if they wanted. Jen Willmot made a motion that she make the Membership V-P Guide description match the Bylaws. 2nd: Joel Blank. Vote taken: 9 in Favor; 1 Opposed; 1 Abstention; Motion passes.

Vermont Land Trust Update: There are two documents that have to be notarized and mailed in; then our part is done.

Vermont Current Use Program Update: The documents were filed by the Forrester. We have to wait a few months for review and approval. Hopefully, we will get our taxes reduced as a result.

Kennedy Road: Kennedy Road joins with McDonald Road. The bridge that joins them has been washed out. The Town would like us to give them a right of way to a road on our property in order to bypass the washed out bridge. The Town would take care of any drainage problems and cut down any trees that are in the way. Our allowing the Town to do this will save them \$28,000. This is goodwill on our part. We should get something in writing saying that we should be held harmless, and we should also notify our insurance carrier. This does not have to go before the Membership for vote. For Granville's part though, it will have to be announced and posted. We will either have to be present for a meeting or send a statement of our position. Nick made a motion that we approve allowing Granville to have access to our private road and have it classified as a Class 4 road and that they give us a statement that we will be held harmless. 2nd: Don Willmot. Vote taken. All were in favor. Motion passes.

Nick showed the Board a book given to us by the Forrester. It is a history of Granville's Roads.

Date for Next Board Meeting: The next Board meeting will be Tuesday, November 14 at the Elks Lodge.

Family Weekend Policy: Discussion on this topic tabled until the next meeting.

Website Replacement: Jen advised that the new website is being delayed until December 1 so that the renewal process will have been completed. Ken gave Jen the check today to pay for the website work.

Firewood: Three cords were ordered. There is no green wood available. We had to pay a lot of money for three cords of kiln dried wood. This will be added as a new policy item for next month's meeting.

Motion to adjourn: 1st: Larry Goldberg; 2nd: Jen Willmot. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned.




