
19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate



Martha Sullivan (Town of Salisbury selectperson) called about TH-22/TH-25 Pidgeon Rd in response to my email dated 2016-03-07.

She said it was ok for VTrans to change the mileage. The mileage submitted on the Mileage Certificate was a guess by the Selectboard.

She suggested that the split between Pidgeon Rd East and Pidgeon Rd West be at the bottom of the gully. I reviewed the orthophotos and lidar data we had and placed the split between TH-22 and TH-25 such that CL4 TH-22 was 0.17 miles and CL4 TH-25 was 0.18 miles.


I am processing Salisbury's 2016 Certificate of Highway Mileage which included an addition of 0.50 miles of Class 4 town highway located between the existing sections of Class 3 TH-22 and Class 3 TH-25.

Based on the data in our GIS road centerline data, I am coming up with a distance of about 0.36 miles between the two Class 3 sections, instead of 0.50 miles.

Also, based on email correspondence in our records, I wonder if it the Class 4 addition should be split into two parts: a 0.11-mile section for TH-22 Pidgeon Rd West and a 0.25-mile section for TH-25 Pidgeon Rd East.

Please review the attached map and let me know if the Town of Salisbury agrees with the change of mileage and with the assignment of the Class 4 to TH-22 and TH-25.



Members Present: Martha Sullivan, Tom Scanlon, John Rouse, and Jackie Devoid.

Also Present: Mindy Goodrich, Brenda Burchard, Sue Scott, Tracey Goodrich, Toby Welch, Renita Welch, Tom Barker, and Jim Reynolds.

Select Board meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Martha Sullivan.

Agenda Changes: Some updates to go along within the agenda.

Minutes of 11-10-15 and Hearing: Under Conservation Commission: Spelling changes, trail work is not to help clarify boundaries, delete comment that could extract some sand and gravel. Tom Scanlon makes a motion to approve minutes as revised. Motion Carried 4-0.

Minutes of 10-13-15: Pidgeon Road Hearing: John Rouse makes a motion to accept minutes as written. Motion Carried 4-0.

Public Comment: none

Officers, Departments & Committees:

Clerk: Sue spoke about updates around the town office. Server is done and they are still working on some bugs with the Patriot program. Have 3 vacancies for Justice of the Peace.

Highway: Tom Barker said he gave the treasurer information on the insurance coverage changes (town buildings and equipment). Gave the board updates of what he has done this summer.

- a) Preston Road: Tom Barker said Preston road was being blocked off by rocks and an old gate. Tom Barker said he knows who it was and he spoke to them. The road is not blocked anymore.
- b) Pidgeon Road: The board decided to make sure it was classified as a class 4 road and keep it unmaintained. Jim Reynolds said he would rather not see a gate put in because the person that has keys would be the closest land owners and Toby Welch concurred. Martha said the gate would not be allowed to be locked. Tracey Goodrich said he feels it should just be left alone but needs better signs. Tom Scanlon agrees there needs to be better signage and Mindy said there should be a sign at the beginning of Pidgeon Road West to state it is a dead end. Jim Reynolds asked how the land owners were notified of the hearting they held on Pidgeon Road because he wasn't aware of it. Jim gave the board information about reclassifying roads. Tracey Goodrich mentioned the speed limit being unsafe at 35 mph. Jim asked about the land owner's possibility of maintaining the part of the road that the town is not maintaining. Tom Scanlon said they would need a permit to do any maintenance on a class 4 road. Tom Scanlon motions that the select board judges that the public good, necessity, and convenience of the inhabitants of the municipality requires the currently unmaintained section of Pidgeon Road be classified as a class 4. Put signs at the beginning of the road that says no outlet and at the end (middle section) of the road put signs that state it is a unmaintained road. Motion Carried 4-0.
- c) Tom Scanlon discussed right of way issues and found some information about the process of anyone doing anything to a right of way. It says the town can charge impact fees with right of way work. Tom Scanlon feels like they should come up with a simple form that people can fill out when they want to do work to or on a right of way. Board discussed this simple form land owners can fill out and made corrections to charge an impact fee of \$20.00 and states the person submitting this form will get a response within 20 days. John Rouse makes a motion to adopt this form. Motion Carried 4-0.

SALISBURY SELECT BOARD HEARING MINUTES

October 13, 2015

Members present: Tom Scanlon, John Rouse, Jackie Devoid, Jonathan Blake, Martha Sullivan

Public present: Toby Welch, Renita Welch, Dean Rheaume, Maurice Rheaume, Chris Goodrich, Shawn Desautels, Ceci Desautels

Hearing commenced at 6:30 PM at Pidgeon Road West on a dark and stormy night.

Purpose of the hearing was to listen to testimony regarding the consideration of discontinuing the middle section of Pidgeon Road that is not currently maintained by the town.

The Board explained that it had received information about people using this short section of roadway as a party spot, resulting in trash left, vehicles getting stuck in the mud, excessive noise and disturbance. Some residents who live on the roadway asked for action by the Board to help control access to the roadway especially by cars and trucks. Although the town highway map issued by VTrans shows this section as being 'discontinued', neither VTrans nor Salisbury has any record that it ever was officially 'discontinued' Holding a public hearing is part of the process to consider discontinuing it. Currently the section is probably a Class 4 and is not maintained by the town and has not been for over 50 years.

Toby Welch – he has a right-of-way from the middle area of this section that is gated; would hate to see more gates placed along the roadway;

Chris Goodrich – he feels the town should not give up any rights-of-way as we would probably never get any back;

Dean Rheaume – he feels it is short-sighted to let the ROW go; he thinks the vandalism/problems can be dealt with in some other way:

Ceci Desautels – she believes the gully area where vehicles get stuck may be a classified wetland; although there is trash left on this roadway, it is no different than many other places where trash is scattered;

Maurice Rheaume – maybe the town should think about putting in a culvert and upgrading the road so all of Pidgeon Road is passable for traffic.

The Select Board will be discussing this issue at the October 27, 2015 meeting.


