

Hello Linda,

Please see my email below from December 19th below regarding the "Not Up To Standard" (NUTS) status. I had forgotten about that email when I spoke with you earlier today. The detailed instructions for changing TH-57 to NUTS on the 2020 Certificate are at the end of this most recent email message.

Before I go into more detail about TH-57, I want to bring it to your attention that Pownal already has 3 sections of highway that are designated NUTS (see the NUTS table pasted below from the 2018 Town Highway Map).

If any of the sections of highway listed in the NUTS table above are now being maintained to class 3 standards, then please let me know, as those miles should then be returned to the class 3 mileage totals.

New information regarding TH-57 (that might help guide a search for documentation):

The attached 1964 Mileage Certificate that includes the addition of TH-57. It is the change listed as "Map Ident. Letter G" on the Breakdown of 1963 Road Measurement Changes document. The best imagery of TH-57 that I could find is from 1972 imagery (see below). In 1973, "traveled" town highways became class 3 town highways via the process outlined in Act 63, and field inventory maps from 1968 and 1978 indicate that the road was inventoried (with both a state and town official present). However, the 1988 inventory map and notes indicate it was no longer being used as a road at that time. Although initially included on the 1989 Certificate, it appears to have fallen through the cracks. Please see the last page (p.3) of the 1989 Certificate. In section #4, changes A and C were moved to section #5, and change B (for TH-34) was delayed until the following year. Change E (for TH-57) is just crossed out. I think it was either crossed out in error and therefore not addressed (as the section of TH-34 was) on the 1990 Certificate, or may have been crossed out because it was going to be addressed some other way (maybe formal discontinuance). Maybe the above information will help guide a search for discontinuance documentation, if it was ever legally discontinued. Otherwise we recommend that the town formally discontinue TH-57. The designation of Not Up To Standard that you will be adding to the 2020 Certificate is simply a temporary measure.

We corresponded briefly last year regarding our records for Pownal's class 3 TH-57 (see below). Were you or anyone else able to find any documentation clarifying the legal status of this right of way?

A short-term option is for us (VTrans) to designate the highway as "Not Up To Standard" so that TH-57 does not continue to receive class 3 funding. However, that would not change its legal status or remove it from the Town Highway Map. It would merely postpone additional paperwork.




Thanks for helping me reach out to those who can help me figure out the history of TH-57! Two images clarifying what we think TH-57 is are pasted at the bottom of this email. Here's what else we know:

We've had TH-57 in our records since 1964 (See attached Mileage Certificate), and it seems to be an older alignment of SA-3 (now class 2 TH-3) based on a summary of changes (p. 4 of attachment) from an inventory taken in 1963. I'm \*guessing\* that the listed change "G" corresponds to TH-57, and change "X" corresponds to part of what is now TH-23, as shown in this image from the 1968 Town Highway Map (the first I found showing TH-57).


From 1957 Pownal Town Highway Map:

With regard to the completion of the enclosed Highway Mileage Certificates, all the traveled highways in your town were measured in 1963 by Mr. Richard Pudvah, Road Commissioner, with Mr. McCoy of this office, in accordance with Title 19, V.S.A., Section 15, as smended 1961, Act No. 28.

The resulting additions, subtractions and revisions are indicated on the enclosed map and explained on the attached breakdown sheets.

In order that Highways 4A, 7A and 9A may be added to your Town Highway mileage this year, a Selectmen's Certificate of Completion and Opening to Public Travel, (i.e. a copy of the description of the highways as shown in the Town Records), must be forwarded to this office as required by the statutes. This information should be returned with the Highway Mileage Certificates.


