

#### § 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

# Decision and Order of the Selectmen Of the Town of Walden

At 8:00 a.m. on May 21, 2016, the Selectboard held a site inspection and at 9:00 a.m. convened a hearing for the purpose of taking testimony of interested persons and others on the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the town of upgrading TH 45 Lower Harrington Hill Road (0.70 miles) from Route 15 to the top of the hill from Class 4 to a Provisional Class 3 in the Town of Walden.

During the site inspection, the board and others walked the road, inspected the drainage and ditching, and viewed the condition of the Lower Harrington Hill road.

A hearing then followed at the Town Clerk's office where abutters and land owners and other Walden residents were heard.

Based on the testimony presented at the hearing, the board makes the following findings and decision:

- 1. There is 0.70 miles of road from Route 15 to the top of the Harrington hill that is currently Class 4. The rest of Harrington Hill road is currently already Class 3.
- 2. The estimated cost of upgrading this road is \$1260.00 per year over the next five years.
- 3. The upgrade of the road will aid in providing fire protection services to residents, in maintenance of drainage, and is a requirement in securing a grant for the replacement of the Harrington Hill Bridge giving the abutting property owners and farmers access to land on both sides of the brook
- 4. The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the town require that the 0.70 miles of road from Route 15 to the top of the hill be upgraded from Class 4 to a Provisional Class 3 road.

Based on the findings, the Walden Board of Selectmen so orders that the 0.70 miles of Harrington Hill road from Route 15 to the top of the hill to be upgraded from Class 4 road to a Provisional Class 3 road.
