

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate

There is just one more thing that I want to have completely clear before I make an adjustment to the measure of Campers Ln on the 2016 Mileage Certificate. Meeting called to order at 7:00 P.M. by chairman Phil Sorrell.

Minutes of the August 14th and 23rd meetings were read and approved as written.

The Temples presented documentation on the number of times they feel they were being harassed by dogs barking and automobile horns blowing by people living on the Bunnell Road. Phil stated that he had contacted Sheriff Amos Colby to send a deputy to the area to see evidence for himself that these people are violating the dog ordinance by allowing their dogs to bark and whether or not they are actually harassing the residents by blowing their car horns.

Selectmen approved a coin drop for the Fire Department to be held on Saturday September 29th.

Connie asked permission to purchase a sign for the parking lot at the town clerk's office stating that it is reserved for the town office and library only. Violators will be towed at their expense. So approved.

Harry Morehouse offered, via Connie, to purchase the former Cordon house before October 9th when the selectmen will be officially opening submitted bids. Selectmen stated that they would not be accepting any bids before that time.

Selectmen will ask Jo Guertin to visit those owners of dogs who have failed to license their dogs and direct her to issue them a citation to appear in court.





Dear Mr. Morehouse:

The VTrans Mapping Section was unable to process the changes submitted on the 2014 Certificate of Highway Mileage. The updated mileage for TH-25 submitted on the Certificate erroneously lacked the portion of TH-25 that coincides with Leonard Hill Rd. There was insufficient documentation to process the addition of Campers Lane and include it on the Concord Town Highway Map.

The addition of Campers Lane can be resubmitted on the 2015 Certificate, along with additional documentation indicating that the changes were made according to the statutory process defined in 19 V.S.A. Chapter 7, §709 - §711. More specifically, we would need evidence of Selectboard action regarding the acceptance of Campers Lane. The meeting minutes from June 12, 2001 only refer to a tentative reclassification of Setter Hill Rd, with no mention of Campers Lane. A hearing notice suggests that any action regarding Campers Lane may have occurred on August 14, 2001. If this is true, then the minutes from that meeting would help us process the establishment of Campers Lane. Statute also requires that you provide us with surveys and a description of the affected highway. We would also like to mention that, based on imagery of the area, the length of Campers Lane extending from Beach Drive to the entrance of Miles Pond Access is closer to 0.16 miles than 0.20 miles, but a survey of this road will help clarify this measure.

Please feel free to contact me with any questions or comments regarding the request for additional information detailed above. Thank you in advance for your assistance in providing any clarity to the establishment of this town highway in compliance with the statutory process.

Selectmen set the meeting date for regular meetings as the second Tuesday of every month, the meeting place to be at the Town Clerk's Office for the months of October through April and May through September at the Town Hall.

Selectmen chose the Caledonian Record as the main newspaper to be used for advertising.

Philip Sorrell was chosen to sign orders. James Hayes was chosen to sign them in Phil's absence.

Minutes of the February meeting were approved as written.

Selectmen decided to inspect Setter Hill Road sometime during April to decide whether or not they want to consider reclassifying it to a town highway as requested by Dorothy Morton. Phil stated that there had been a policy adopted some time back regarding the requirements needed to reclassify a private road to a town road. Connie will try to locate the policy.

Selectmen approved liquor license applications for Barnie's Market and North Concord Country Store upon their receipt, providing there are no changes from the previous year.

Phil noted that the mileage from Beach Drive to the fishing access is not currently on the highway map. Phil will measure the distance and selectmen will hold a public hearing on June 12th in order to get it added to the map.

Reg Stuart has retired in respect to mowing cemeteries and town greens. Ernie Guyer also stated that he can no longer mow the beach area at Miles Pond and requested that the selectmen find someone else to do that. Residents of East Concord have contacted Connie wondering if someone will be mowing the park there. Currently, North Concord residents are mowing the North Concord Community Park but at sometime may not be able to. Bill and Pearl Foster stated earlier that they would volunteer to mow the back cemeteries and selectmen hired Richard Fisher to mow the common, the town hall, the town clerk's office and the area around the fire station. Phil stated that perhaps the town will have to purchase a line trimmer (because Reg had used his own) and a riding mower in order to address the other areas in town that need mowing.

Selectmen discussed the Setter Hill Rd situation. If Mortons want the town to reclassify the road as a class three highway then the Mortons will have to make a level turn around area and add crusher run to the entire road surface. The Mortons will also have to deed the road to the town. Phil stated that he and Jim Hayes will visit the Mortons.

Richard Tetreault, Agency of Transportation, sent a sample of the latest model policy for town road and bridge standards. He suggested that we either amend our previous policy or adopt a new one. Selectmen decided to adopt a new one. Connie will prepare the paperwork for the June meeting.

Regular monthly meeting called to order at 7:05 P.M. by chairman Edward Bunnell.

Minutes of the January meeting were approved as written.

Dorothy Morton requested that Setter Hill Road be reclassified as a town road. Connie will find out what the procedure would be for such action and the selectmen will come to a decision at the next regular monthly meeting.

Selectmen decided to change the meeting place of the informational meeting from the town hall to the school cafeteria.

The public hearing regarding the proposed discontinuance of a portion of highway #26 and #25 was held at the school cafeteria prior to the selectmen's meeting. Those present were: Philip Sorrell, Edward Bunnell, Albert Wood, Connie Quimby, Roger Joslin, Steve MacDonald, Harold Morton, Dennis Willson, William Chadburn, R. Terry Williams, Bruce Quimby, William Chadburn, Sue Brasmar, Pauline St. Hilaire, Shane St. Hilaire, Ruth MacDonald, Howard MacDonald, Stanley MacDonald and Dorothy Morton. The selectmen received written opposition to the proposed discontinuance from David R. Lunnie, a Concord resident; Dennis Wilson, a land owner; and Pauline St. Hilaire, a land owner. Harold Morton expressed his opposition verbally and Roger Joslin was representing Ronald Crisp, a land owner who was opposed to the proposed closing of the highways.

Based on the outcome of the public hearing, the selectmen voted not to discontinue a portion of highway #26 (known as the Bombard Road), beginning on the south side of Mink Brook bridge and continuing in a southerly direction for a distance of .5 miles and also voted not to discontinue a portion of highway #25 (known as Temple Hill Road), beginning at the junction of highways #26 and #25, continuing in a westerly direction a distance of .66 miles.

Selectmen added the words "per day" to the boarding fees for impounded dogs.

Ed Bunnell had spoken to Janice Peaslee regarding whose responsibility it was to keep the sidewalks free of snow. She will get back to the selectmen with an answer. Selectmen will have a public hearing on August 14th regarding the acceptance of Setter Road and two tenths of a mile of Campers Lane.

Selectmen will inspect the former Cordon property at 2521 Cross Road which now belongs to the town.

Realtor Roger Joslin informed Phil that an individual has offered \$4000.00 for town property on Leonard Hill Road (formerly the gravel pit). Selectmen decided to accept the offer.

Selectmen received a letter from Verizon indicating that the town will be liable for the repairs made to the telephone cable when it was damaged during the beaver dam break on Shadow Lake Road. Selectmen will respond by stating that it was an emergency situation, that the telephone cable is within the town right-of-way and that they do not feel responsible for its being damaged. If they wish to avoid future problems then they are to remove the cable from within the town right-of-way.

Selectmen signed a resolution giving Audra Girouard and Connie Quimby authority to exercise the following: open or close any deposit accounts in the name of the town of Concord and to endorse checks and orders for the payment of money or otherwise withdraw or transfer funds on deposits at any financial institution.

Selectmen changed the wording on the Sick/Personal Day policy to read as follows; employees will be eligible for five (5) sick/personal days per year, based on the number of hours normally worked that day.

Selectmen changed the wording on the number of weeks vacation policy to read number of weeks vacation based on the hours normally worked per week.

Selectmen changed the wording in the first sentence of the holiday policy to read as follows: employees will receive 8 hours pay per day for seven (7) holidays each year.

Selectmen decided to pay Mary Bolton 30 cents for mileage and two dollars per day for the times that she has to tend dogs at the town pound.

Meeting adjourned at 9:20 P.M.

INSURANCE:

An employee must be employed on a thirty (30) hour employment basis or more per week. The employer will pay one hundred percent (100%) of a family rate. Any other additional coverage will be the responsibility of the employee.

HOLIDAYS:

Employees will have seven (7) paid holidays each year. The holidays will be: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If the holiday is worked the employee will receive time and a half (1 ½) for hours worked in addition to the holiday pay.

An ad will be placed in the newspaper seeking someone interested in serving as town health officer as Arlene Hovey has stated that she no longer wants to carry out those duties.

Meeting called to order at 7:05 P.M. by chairman Phil Sorrell.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as written.

Selectmen signed the letter requesting membership in the Northeast Kingdom Waste Management District and also signed the agreement and terms of admission for the town of Concord to join the District.

Selectmen discussed painting the front of the town hall. An ad asking for an itemized estimate for the job will go in the newspaper and Connie will make up spec sheets for interested parties to pick up at the town clerk's office.

Selectmen decided to leave the boarding fees for dogs at \$5.00 per day. Because the pound is now at the town garage, the town will keep all of the impound and boarding fees. Phil will contact Mary Bolton regarding the amount of pay she expects to receive as pound-keeper.

The question of constable's salary was tabled. Selectmen felt that Bill Smith should be present when it is discussed.

Selectmen agreed to pro-rate the liquor license for Barnie's Market. They will be charged \$25.00 instead of the \$50.00 annual fee.

It was noted that there is a problem with All Terrain Vehicles speeding. Phil has ordered the speed signs and will get the roads posted so that the limits can be enforced.

Selectmen re-wrote the employment policy to read as follows:

NEW EMPLOYEES:

The board of selectmen have the responsibility for all hiring of new

employees and will establish the pay rate.

SICK/PERSONAL

DAYS:

Employees will be eligible for five (5) sick/personal days per year

with a total accumulation of thirty (30) days.

VACATION DAYS:

Employees will have vacation based on the following chart:

INSURANCE:

An employee must be employed on a thirty (30) hour employment basis or more per week. The employer will pay one hundred percent (100%) of a family rate. Any other additional coverage will be the responsibility of the employee.

HOLIDAYS:

Employees will have seven (7) paid holidays each year. The holidays will be: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If the holiday is worked the employee will receive time and a half (1 ½) for hours worked in addition to the holiday pay.

Selectmen approved Rodney Lamothe's request to operate a junk yard.

Connie asked selectmen if the town would pay the additional cost to update the 911 wall map to include insets for North Concord, East Concord, Miles Pond and Shadow Lake. The estimated cost is between \$120.00 and \$165.00. So approved.

An ad will be placed in the newspaper seeking someone interested in serving as town health officer as Arlene Hovey has stated that she no longer wants to carry out those duties.

That the Selectboard pursue a plan to build a nuclear power reactor in the town of Concord by authorizing preparation of a general plan to be presented to the voters at the March 2002 town meeting. The vote shall be preceded by one or more informational meetings.

No cost to the town shall be incurred. If approved, retroactive payments for actual incurred expenses and fair labor reimbursement shall be negotiated and paid by the selected contracting agency. One percent of the operating budget after operation begins shall be included in the operating overhead to be paid to the undersigned or designee each year thereafter.

The town of concord will reap substantial returns as taxes or possibly through a negotiated profit sharing agreement or both.
