

HOW TO INTERPRET THE "CHANGED HIGHWAYS" LIST

each change is separated by a semi-colon ;

CHANGE ORDER

higher classification to lower classification from left to right

-- Interstate -- US Highway -- State Highway -- Class 1 -- Class 2 -- Class 3 -- Class 3 -- Legal Trail
(I- ; US- ; VT- ; CL1 ; CL2; CL3; CL4; LT)

lower highway number to higher highway number from left to right

CHANGE FORMAT

(The list is based on fields in the road centerline data available through the Vermont Open Geodata Portal at

<http://geodata.vermont.gov/datasets/VTrans::vt-road-centerline.>)

aotclass rname (rdflname)

a slash / indicates a reclassification (you have to look at the Mileage Certificate to see which direction the reclassification went)

CLASS 3 - CLASS 4 RECLASSIFICATION

-- format example: CL3/CL4 TH-7 (Moulton St)

* this reclassification could be from 3 to 4 or 4 to 3

For expediency, Class 3 - Class 4 reclassifications don't have a space before and after the /.
The highway numbers rarely change.

OTHER TYPES OF RECLASSIFICATIONS

-- format example: CL2 TH-3 (New Class 2 Rd) / CL3 TH-56 (Sample Rd), CL3 TH-61 (Smith Rd)

* Interpretation: highways CL2 TH-3, CL3 TH-56 and CL3 TH-61 were involved in a reclassification

For ease of reading, non CL3-CL4 reclassifications have a space on either side of the / because several highways may be involved in the reclassification (especially when Class 2 transfers are involved).
