



Hello Danielle and Alex,

If the "legal papers" mentioned in the 1/30/1995 minutes are the pages of the Road Agreement, which include the easement for the town turnaround, then this seems to fill the documentation gap. I don't see anything that suggests there were other legal papers involved. I will therefore add the discontinuance of TH-51 to the VTrans records and update the Town Highway Map accordingly. Please remember, though, that my decision to add this change to our records does not affect the "true" legal status of this road which is based on the Town's documentation.

So, in addition to the change I mentioned in my previous email on 2/22/2024 (below), add this change in the "Discontinued" section of Part II of the Certificate:

-0.14 mi CL4 TH-51 (Pumphouse Ln) discontinued in 1995

Hi Danielle,

I have sufficient documentation for the extension of Carle St, which can be added to the "New Highways" section of Part II of the Certificate as:

+0.03 mi CL3 TH-22 (Carle St) extended in 2006

Also, please don't forget to complete Part I of the Certificate.

Regarding the Pumphouse Ln (TH-51) discontinuance:

I've attached a pdf that includes all of the documentation I've received for TH-51, in what I think is chronological order:

- p 1-2. Dept of Forests, Parks, and Rec letter
- p 3. Hearing minutes 12/6/1994 Discussion only, states "It was agreed the parties involved should have the right of way established before a final decision was made by the board" (Was there a site visit? Was a final decision made?)
 - p 4. Minutes (undated, apparently from before the discontinuance) mentions a survey, need for easements
 - p 5. Minutes from 2/27/1995 authorization to sign road agreement
- p 6-8. Road agreement 2/28/1995 This appears to be an easement for town turnaround and rights of way for involved parties (one of the conditions for a discontinuance rather than a discontinuance)

I'm looking for the documentation indicating that the Selectboard indeed made a final decision, based on the plans stated during the hearing. Was the discontinuance supposed to have occurred after the hearing on 12/6/1994? Or after the Road Agreement was finalized on 2/28/1995? Is it possible that the Selectboard never officially made the final decision? If the answers to these questions aren't clear, then it would probably be best if the Town attorney weighs in on this.

For some reason that email was returned to me instead of being forwarded. Anyway, I've removed that address from my database and added your email address.

Do you know if Alburgh's 2024 Certificate of Highway Mileage has already been filled out and signed by the Selectboard? Would the Selectboard want to add the extension of Carle St onto it?

Also, while you're at it, can you also see if the Selectboard can clarify the status of the following:

Dump Road was also "opened" at the Selectboard Meeting on Feb 16, 2006 (along with Carle St Extension and Industrial Park Rd Extension, but Industrial Park Rd Extension had already been added that to VTrans records in 2003). So, just for clarification... Is Dump Road a class 3 Town Highway? Or is it gated? If gated, that is a little more complicated, as public highways should be open to the public. Pent roads (with unlocked gates) are allowed.

Regarding Pumphouse Ln:

The 1995 Road Agreement (see attached) does not appear to discontinue the road (shown as TH-51 on the Town Highway Map). It is unclear to me whether it was ever legally discontinued, or if the 1995 Road Agreement was assumed to be equivalent to a discontinuance. In order for us to remove it from the Town Highway Map, we need documentation indicating that it has been legally discontinued.

Hearing opened at 6:10 p.m. Present were John Beaulac, Gary Lockerby and James Gotshall, Select Board Members; Barbara Baker, Clerk; Cheryl Dunn, Lister; Ralph Tatro, Nicole Mountain and Vincent Mountain.

Opening of Carle Street:

Vincent said he thought the opening was for snowplowing in the winter only. He noted that in the summer motor cycles, dirt bikes and 4 wheelers do not obey the speed limits now. Nicole was concerned about the children. There are three autistic children that live on that street. John stated they will be repairing the north end of the street and will need an exit while doing so. He mentioned a new base is needed, ditching and eventually blacktopping. Jamie noted there shouldn't be a difference if they are already disobeying the speed limit. John also noted they would ask for better enforcement of speed limits in that area.

John Bostwick arrived at 6:15 p.m. Terry Tatro arrived shortly thereafter.

Opening of Dump Road:

No discussion ensued.

Opening of Industrial Park Road Extension:

Ralph Tatro asked where it was being extended. The Board explained. No other discussion ensued.

Interim zoning:


John motioned to change section 606 to include a 5 member Development Review Board instead of a 3 member Board of Adjustment. Motion seconded by Jamie and so carried.


John motioned to keep section 401 as it is in the draft. Motion seconded by Jamie. Motion carried.

Dear Board Members:

We are in receipt of the notice pursuant to the requirements of Title 19 V.S.A. that the Selectboard of the Town of Alburg proposes to abandon a portion of Town Highway No. 51 in said Town.

For your information, it has been the policy (copy enclosed) of this Department to encourage towns to continue ownership of highway rights-of-way where they are of sufficient length or location to be of value to snowmobilers, cross-country skiers, hikers, horseback riders, and other recreational users. Such existing rights-of-way can be valuable recreation resources for our growing population.

Town Highway No. 51 appears to have minimal recreation value and this Department has no objection to its discontinuance. However, the Town may want to consider discontinuing the road to "trail" status so that the right-of-way is retained for possible future use but the Town would have no responsibility for maintenance.

With the passage of H. 83 in the 1991 Legislature, the laws regarding Class 4 roads and trails give much more strength to towns in their ability to preserve these rights-of-way. Title 19 V.S.A. § 711 states in part:

"...the selectmen may order that the petitioner bear the cost of upgrading a class 4 town highway to the class 3 town highway standards established in 19 V.S.A. § 302(a) (3)(B). Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a town to maintain a class 4 highway or to upgrade a highway from class 4 to class 3."

I am enclosing a copy of the "Town Policy on Class 4 Roads and Trails" issued by the Vermont Trails and Greenways Council. You may want to consider a similar policy in Alburg. Having such a policy will help to ensure that Alburg will not be required to maintain Class 4 roads or trails or upgrade them to Class 3. Also enclosed is a "Class 4 Highways and Trails Fact Sheet" that may help to answer some questions you might have about this issue.

This Department will not be represented at your meeting on December 6, 1994, but we ask that this letter and attachments be entered into the

proceedings. We also request that local trail organizations such as snowmobile clubs be notified of the proposed discontinuance.

Thank you for contacting us on this matter. We always appreciate the opportunity to comment on these important recreation resources.

Re: Town Highway #18

Donald explained the Board had been approached by the residents on TH #18 to close the road.

The attached letter from the Forest & Parks Department was read.

It was discovered that Louis & Anna Martell had a right of way to their property if the road is given up but there was no right of way in the deed of Leonard & Sharon James.

It was agreed the parties involved should have the right of way established before a final

decision was made by the Board.

Paul P., Louis, Anna and Henry left at 7:30 p.m.

Re: Woods Lane

It was explained that Woods Lane had been brought up to State specs and turned over to the Town. There was no further discussion.

Re: Extension of Industrial Park Road

It was explained that a grant had been received for infrastructure work including the road extension and the road work was finished. No further discussion ensued.

Re: Winter's Lane Extension

Jamie Gotshall stated that it was a condition of the Act 250 permit that that road was supposed to be blacktopped by October of 1990. The road was deeded to the Town in October of 1992 and the blacktopping was not done. He wants to know who's responsibility it is to do the blacktopping. The Clerk is to check with the State and VLCT.

Jamie, Linda, Matt and Nickie left at 7:55 p.m.

Re: Intersection of Town Highways 6 and 45

Joan stated a member of the SelectBoard authorized th utilities to be put on their land. Now she wanted the road moved or the utilities moved. Donald noted the moving of the road was not supposed to be top priority when the former Selectman gave the authorization. The power lines should not have been moved so quickly and the property then left in a mess.

The Selectmen are to check the ditch on the side of the road near Mr. Hakey.

Ron noted he had a different concern. He is President of the Alburg Springs Water Association. The water lines would be in the discontinued portion if the road is moved. Before the road is discontinued and turned over to the adjacent landowners a right of way for the Water Co. should be established.

Winona mentioned that last year when the Town plowed Peterson Place the snow was piled against the garage. She dosen't mind them turning on her property but she doesn't want the snow against the garage.

It was suggested that permission be obtained from Peter Beck to clean the ditch so the

culvert will drain.

Hearing adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

Discussion ensued on equipping one of the ford trucks to plow intersections and the

school yard if requested to do so in the future.

Postmaster, Diana Morgan authorized removal of the old mail boxes on Poor Farm Road at the foot of the hill going to the sand beach.

The hearing for the Grant request for the Parent/Child/Community building is scheduled

ROAD AGREEMENT

February

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 29 day of January, 1995, by and between HENRY BRINGOLF (hereinafter referred to as "BRINGOLF"), LOUIS MARTELL and ANNA MARTELL (hereinafter referred to as "MARTELL"), LEONARD JAMES and SHARON JAMES (hereinafter referred to as "JAMES"), and TOWN OF ALBURG, VERMONT (hereinafter referred to as "ALBURG").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, BRINGOLF, MARTELL, and JAMES own land adjacent to Town Highway #51 in Alburg, Vermont; and

WHEREAS, Alburg is relinquishing said road and intends to no longer maintain said road; and

WHEREAS, Alburg needs to use the first fifty (50) feet of said road for a turn-around; and

WHEREAS, BRINGOLF, MARTELL, JAMES, and ALBURG desire to reduce to writing their agreement as to the use of said road and the maintenance of said road, and to make this agreement binding upon BRINGOLF, MARTELL, JAMES, and ALBURG, and their heirs, successors and assigns.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of One Dollar and other good and valuable consideration, it is mutually agreed as follows:

- BRINGOLF hereby grants to MARTELL and JAMES, their heirs, successors and assigns, an easement for ingress and egress over that portion of said road which passes through the property of BRINGOLF.
- 2. MARTELL hereby grants to JAMES, their heirs, successors and assigns, an easement for ingress and egress over that portion of said road which passes through the property of MARTELL.
- 3. Except as provided below, the necessary expenses of maintaining or repairing said road shall be shared equally by BRINGOLF, MARTELL and JAMES. No one hereunder shall have an obligation to improve said road to a condition superior to its present condition and if one party elects to improve said road, as opposed to maintaining or repairing it, that party shall bear the full expense of said improvement at no expense to the other

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parties, unless the other parties consent in writing to said improvement. If the parties to this agreement desire to plow snow on said road for any reason, then the party who elects to plow snow shall bear the full expense of plowing at no expense to the other parties.

- BRINGOLF grants to ALBURG an easement to utilize the first fifty (50) feet of said road for the purpose of turning around town vehicles. ALBURG will be solely responsible for maintaining the first fifty (50) feet of said road and shall maintain it in its present condition or comparable to its present condition.
- 5. No party to this agreement may prevent any other party to this agreement from exercising the rights granted hereunder and except as provided herein for maintenance, no party hereunder may charge any other party hereunder for the use of said road.
- 6. This agreement is to be recorded in the Alburg Land Records and shall be binding upon the heirs, successors and assigns of all the parties to this agreement. FEBRUARY
