Policy, Planning & Intermodal Development Division

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

On February 15, 2017 at 4:15 PM "Alley, Kerry" < Kerry. Alley@vermont.gov> wrote:

Hello Jack,

I've received and reviewed Glover's 2017 Certificate of Highway Mileage. Thank you and everyone involved for seeing this through!

Could you verify for me that the class 3 portion of TH-40 extends to the same location (at house #540) as we discussed while conducting the field inventory on 8/20/2015? If that is correct, then the class 3 mileage after the partial reclassification should be 0.54 mile, leaving 0.14 mile class 4 assuming that the length of TH-40 matches the official 0.68 mileage on record (0.63 mile + 0.05 mile, split at Trevits Pl on the town highway map). Since we measured TH-40 in 2015, we should also include a remeasurement of this highway on the 2017 certificate. Where exactly does the public right of way end? The measure to the very end of the roadway (lined up with the end of the parcel of house #655 on attached map) is 0.66 mile, as measured on 8/20/2015. If this is the correct location for the terminus of TH-40, then the partial reclassification should have been based on that value instead of the 0.68 mile measure on record.

Yes, Cl-3 ends at driveway of house #540. We assume CL-4 goes to the end of lot #655, records on this are non-existent. Re-measure if you think it is needed. Go ahead and edit the certificate.



Also, just a heads up regarding the reclassification of Th-61...Although it is only explicitly mentioned that discontinuances of highways continuing into neighboring towns require notification of the adjacent municipality, I recommend that you notify the Town of Greensboro, as an interested party, about the change. We did notify the Town of Greensboro and had no response.



- 1. Meeting called to order at 6:47pm by Jack.
- 2. Minutes: Mike made a motion, seconded by Jack, to approve the minutes dated June 20, 21 and 23, 2016 as presented. The motion carried.
- 3. Appearances by Local Citizens and Visitors: none.
- 4. Announcements for Review: none.
- 5. Reports: none.
- 6. Old and Unfinished Business
 - a. Town Garage: none.
 - b. Road Re-Classification:
 - i. Town Highway 21, also known as Merriam Road: Jack made a motion, seconded by Mike, to retain the 0.02 miles of TH 21, Merriam Rd, as a Class 4 town highway. The motion carried.
 - ii. Town Highway 18, also known as Still Hill Road: Jack made the following motion, seconded by Mike: Whereas the 0.35 mile portion of TH 18, Still Hill Rd, beginning at the intersection with TH 16, Borland Rd, and running southerly to join the Class 4 portion of TH 18, does not presently meet Class 3 standards; and whereas the present and anticipated uses of this portion of TH 18 do not merit upgrading to Class 3 standards; and whereas the town will continue to maintain this portion of the road as it has in the past to insure access to abutting property owners and the general public; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed re-classification; therefore this 0.35 miles of TH 18 will be re-classified as a Class 4 town highway. The motion carried.
 - iii. Town Highway 19, also known as Person Road: Mike made the following motion, seconded by Jack: Whereas the entire 0.03 miles of TH 19, Person Rd, has not been maintained by the town as a public road for many years; and whereas the abutting landowners express no objection to the proposed discontinuance; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed discontinuance; therefore the entire 0.03 miles of TH 19 will be discontinued as a town highway. The motion carried.
 - Town Highway 17, also known as Cemetery Loop Road: Mike made the following motion, seconded by Jack: Whereas the 0.15 mile portion of TH 17, Cemetery Loop Rd, running easterly from TH 14, Parker Rd, has been maintained to Class 3 standards for a number of years; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover warrant the proposed reclassification of this portion of the road as Class 3; therefore the 0.15 portion of TH 17 presently classified as Class 4 will be re-classified as a Class 3 town highway. The motion carried.
 - v. Town Highway 30, also known as Buchanan Place: Mike made the following motion, seconded by Jack: Whereas the 0.09 mile portion of TH 30, Buchanan Place, beginning at the easterly end of the Class 3 portion of said highway and terminating at the southernmost intersection of said highway with TH 1, County Rd, was discontinued by a previous Glover selectboard in 1967; and whereas the selectboard's 1967 action has never been accepted by the VT Agency of Transportation; and whereas the said portion of TH 30 has not been maintained by the town in many years; and whereas the abutting landowner has no objection to the proposed discontinuance; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the

- inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed discontinuance; therefore this 0.09 portion of TH 30 will be discontinued, and the 0.06 mile portion will remain a Class 3 town highway. The motion carried.
- vi. Town Highway 35, also known as Telfer Road: Discussion regarding re-classifying this road was postponed until the July 28, 2016 meeting. The Board will meet to view the road Wednesday, July 20 at 9 am.
- vii. Town Highway 42, also known as Sand Hill Road: Jack made the following motion, seconded by Mike: whereas the easterly 0.50 mile portion of TH 42, Sand Hill Rd, is presently a Class 3 road but does not meet Class 3 standards; and whereas the present and anticipated uses of this portion of the road do not merit upgrading the road to meet Class 3 standards; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed re-classification specified below; therefore, the approximately 0.30 mile westerly end of this said portion, which begins 0.20 miles from the intersection with VT Route 16 and continues to the intersection with the first logging road leading in a southerly direction into the Westdyke property, will be re-classified as a Class 4 town highway in order to preserve access to the abutting properties by town road, and the remaining approximately 0.20 mile portion of the said road, the eastern end of which terminates at the beginning of Legal Trail 3, will be re-classified as a legal trail. The motion carried.
- viii. Town Highway 61, also known as North Greensboro Road; Jack made the following motion, seconded by Mike: whereas the entire 0.10 miles of TH 61, North Greensboro Rd, is presently deemed "functionally Class 4 Not Up To Standards" by the VT Agency of Transportation; and whereas the present and anticipated uses of TH 61 do not merit upgrading to Class 3 standards; and whereas the abutting property owners have expressed no objection; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed re-classification; therefore TH 61 will be re-classified as a Class 4 town highway. The motion carried.
- ix. Town Highway 53, also known as Tate Road; Jack made the following motion, seconded by Mike: whereas the entire 0.06 miles of TH 53, Tate Rd, does not meet Class 3 standards; and whereas the present and anticipated uses of TH 53 do not merit upgrading to Class 3 standards; and whereas the abutting landowners have expressed no objection to re-classification; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed re-classification; therefore TH 53 will be re-classified as a Class 4 town highway. The motion carried.
- x. Town Highway 40, also known as Stone Shore Road: Mike made the following motion, seconded by Jack: whereas the 0.09 mile westerly end of TH 40, Stone Shore Rd, does not meet Class 3 standards; and whereas the present and anticipated uses of this portion of TH 40 do not merit upgrading to Class 3 standards; and whereas the town will continue to maintain this portion of TH 40 as it has in the past to preserve access to the camps abutting the road; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed re-classification; therefore the 0.09 mile westerly end of TH 40 will be re-classified as a Class 4 town highway. The motion carried.
- xi. Town Highway 79, also known as High Drive Road; Jack made the following motion, seconded by Mike: whereas the 0.13 miles of TH 79, High Drive Rd, is no longer used to provide access to the Andersonville Farm milkhouse; and whereas the abutting landowner has offered no objection to the proposed discontinuance; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed discontinuance; therefore the entire 0.13 miles of TH 79 will be discontinued as a town highway. The motion carried.
- xii. Town Highway 49, also known as Dewing Road; Jack made the following motion, seconded by Mike: whereas the 0.02 miles of TH 49, Dewing Rd, provide access to the fields and camp of a single landowner; and whereas that landowner has no

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objection to the proposed discontinuance of TH 49; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover will not suffer from the proposed discontinuance; therefore the entire 0.02 miles of TH 49 will be discontinued as a town highway. The motion carried.

- c. Town Hall Roof Estimates: Jack received four bids to replace the roof on the town hall. Mike made a motion, seconded by Mike to accept the bid from Black Ox Roofing to replace the existing roof with a Standing Seam metal roof for \$31,000.00. The motion carried. Jack will contact Black Ox to schedule the work around the Senior Meals program.
- d. Pavement Sealing Project: Nicom has completed the pavement sealing project. They completed the project in three days as opposed to four days, as quoted.

7. New Business:

- a. 2016 Tax Rate: Mike made a motion, seconded by Jack, to approve the 2016 Tax Rate for Homesteads at \$1.9183 and Non-Residents at \$1.9587, as presented. The motion carried.

Thursday, November 10, 2016

Present: Brian Carroll, Mike Ladd, Jack Sumberg, Nick Ecker-Racz, Sue Medor, Dale McAllister.

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm.
- 2. Amendment to the agenda: add Sheriff's report.
- 3. Minutes: Jack made a motion, seconded by Brian, to approve the minutes dated October 27, 2016 as presented. The motion carried.
- 4. Appearances by Local Citizens and Visitors: none.
- 5. Announcements for Review: none.
- 6. Reports:
 - a. Sheriff's monthly report was reviewed.
- 7. Old Business:
 - a. Road Classification for TH35, Telfer Road: The following motion, made by Jack at the previous meeting (Oct. 27, 2016), seconded by Brian and then postponed for 2 weeks was read again:
 - "Whereas the entire 0.60 miles of TH35, Telfer Rd, has not been maintained by the Town of Glover for many years; and whereas portions of the road as it presently exists are outside of the original town right of way; and whereas one or more portions of the original right of way cross areas that are now considered by the State of Vermont to be wetlands or wetland buffers; and whereas the town has been advised by a VT Agency of Natural Resources wetlands ecologist that a wetlands permit would be necessary in order to rebuild the road in the original right of way and that such a permit would not be issued unless compelling reasons can be brought forward for such a project; and whereas this selectboard does not believe that a compelling argument can be made for rebuilding and maintaining TH35 as a town road; and whereas considerable expense would be incurred by the town in order to have the original right of way surveyed and have the wetlands and buffers delineated and a permit application prepared by a qualified surveyor and wetlands consultant with little chance of obtaining that permit; and whereas the actual cost to the town of rebuilding and maintain the road in the original right of way, if permitted by the state, would be out of all proportion to the benefits derived from such a road project by the residents of Glover, and whereas, until public notice was given in May, 2016, of the selectboard's intention of discontinuing TH35, over many years no concern had been expressed by abutting landowners regarding the lack of maintenance and unusable condition of the road; and whereas the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Glover do not require that TH35 be rebuilt and maintained as a town road; therefore the entire 0.60 miles of TH35 will be discontinued."

Selectboard members had received an email this morning from David Kelley, representing Norman Auger, informing the board that Mr. Auger had transferred ownership of the portion of his farm accessible from TH 35 to Diane Kipp as custodian for Maya, Reiley, and Benjamin Auger with the intent that this would preserve a private right of way in lieu of the town's right of way for TH 35, as provided in Title 19 VSA §717, in the event that the town highway is discontinued. After a short discussion, **Brian called for a vote on the motion and it passed unanimously**. TH 35 (Telfer Rd) will be discontinued.

- b. Town Garage: The board reviewed a revised site plan with the new garage oriented perpendicular to the road with the doors facing south to better address issues relating to access control of vehicles entering and leaving Route 16.
- c. Sewer Update: Jack presented copies of the new Sewer Maintenance Plan prepared by Phil Laramie of Laramie Water Resources and discussion ensued on implementation of the plan.

8. New Business:

- a. Attendance at Town Meeting: Nick presented some thoughts related to increasing attendance at Town Meeting.
