# 19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

#### § 305. Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.

(d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.


(e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.

(f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.

(g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

Hello Jason,

I took a look at the town highways that you included on your Scenic Roads Mileage tables, and edited it to also show mileage totals based on the 2016 Town Highway Map to reflect our current data.

Comments and Questions: I did not include VT-100B because it is not a town highway, so only the state can designate it as a scenic highway or byway. The Lover's Ln (TH-9) mileage is different because of a realignment documented on the 2011 Mileage Certificate. The TH-9 difference might be due to a typo, as I have no record of that highway as 4.47 mi. The only question I have is whether the class 4 portion of TH-44 (Washbowl Rd) is also considered Scenic? It is shown on the 2008 Town Plan map, but not included in the mileages. Also, please note that a portion of US-2 is highlighted on the map, which I assume is simply an error.

If you agree with the adjustments I've made on the attached table and illustrated on the attached map, and confirm whether or not to include class 4 TH-44, I can preload those changes onto your 2018 Certificate of Highway Mileage.

Hi Johnathan,

The long weekend gave me time to put together a spreadsheet with the mileage of the Moretown scenic roads designated in the 1987 town plan and the 2002 town plan. Please let me know if this looks correct to you. As you may recall from our telephone conversation a few weeks ago, I am trying to document the scenic roads Moretown has previously designated but apparently not reported to the Agency of Transportation.

I based the spreadsheet on the records in the Moretown Town Office, where the Planning Commission keeps a couple of file drawers filled with unsorted old papers. Inasmuch as Moretown lost countless records in the Irene flood, I am glad that these records still exist. The papers in the file drawers included the 1974 and 1987 Town Plans, and a copy of the newspaper warning for the 1974 town plan. I also used the 2008 town plan, which is online at the Town of Moretown website. All Moretown town plans go through the warning and public meeting process required for town plans.

Dan Currier emailed me a copy of a letter from the CVRPC approving the 1997 Moretown Town Plan along with a few pages from the Moretown town plan that reference scenic roads in Moretown. Dan Currier suggested that the aggregate of the papers that he sent me (attached), along with what I found in the town records (also attached) should be sufficient to document that the statutory requirements for designating scenic roads have been met. I look forward to your opinion. I will follow up with a telephone call this coming week. Thank you – Jason Aronowitz

Hi Johnathan,

Thank you for your suggestion to contact CVRPC to try to find documentation of Moretown having designated scenic roads.

Dan Currier, in his email below, was able to provide some records he found in CVRPC files that indicate that Moretown does have designated scenic roads. He gave me enough information that I was able to go through old Moretown Planning Commission files and find the Moretown 1974 Town Plan and the public notice and advertisement for that Town Plan. I have scanned and attached the pages relevant to designated scenic roads.

I also found the 1987 Moretown Town Plan, which states, "Roadways depicted on the Scenic Road map are hereby designated as scenic." I have scanned and attached the relevant pages from the 1987 Town Plan, including the 1987 Scenic Roads map, as well.

Is Dan Currier correct in his thought (below) that this may be enough documentation to meet the designation process of these scenic roads? Please let us know. Regards - Jason

Jason,

I spent some more time looking this morning and I have attached a scan of the oldest records we have here at CVRPC that talk about Moretowns designated scenic roads.

Page 2 of the Town Plan Transportation Goals pdf goal 8 says that "the scenic roadways are hereby designated as scenic" The map attached after that in the pdf is the map in referenced as "depicted on the scenic roadway map".

Unfortunately these pages are the only pages I have of this document and there is also no date on the pages so I'm not sure what plan this is from. I have an educated guess that it's the 1997 Moretown Town Plan because of the reference to the 1990 US census data.

Also attached is a copy of CVRPC resolution stating that the 1997 Town plan conformed to all statutory goals and is approved by CVRPC.

I wonder if this may be enough documentation to meet the designation process of these scenic roads. I say this because for CVRPC to approve your 1997 town plan the Town Planning Commission and Selectboard would have had to of held public hearings and voted to approve the plan. Which is document in the letter from ACCD. Now this may be a bit of a stretch but is worth a try as proof for VTrans. The one thing that would really help this out is having a full copy of the 1997 Moretown Town Plan and the hearing notice for the meeting when the plan was reviewed and adopted by the town. Perhaps one of your planning commission member would have a copy of the 1997 town plan and the netice.

Let me know if I can be of any more help on this.



# The State's House and Mad River Valley

Termont's small but lovely capital and the beauty of the Mad River Valley are the high points of this tour.


Before starting, spend some time in Montpelier. The Vermont State House is an architectural and historical gem, and there's a new exhibit at the Vermont Historical Society in the Pavilion Building (the brick building with big white wrap-around verandas just down from the State House) that tells Vermont's story. It's called "Freedom & Unity," and every visitor and Vermonter should see it.

Then, hop in your car and follow Route 2 west to Middlesex, where you'll turn south (left) onto Route 100B toward Moretown, Waitsfield and Warren. But we're not going to stay on the main road for long. About three miles south of the junction of routes 2 and 100B, turn left onto Hathaway Road (the turn is just before a highway bridge over the Mad River.) You'll go fairly steeply uphill to Moretown Common, a rural crossroads.


Follow the Moretown Common Road downhill to Moretown village and then follow Route 100 south to Waitsfield. In the center of town, turn left onto Bridge Street, cross the covered bridge (one lane) and bear right, up the hill on the East Warren Road. It's a lovely six-mile drive to East Warren and then a two-mile plunge downhill into Warren, where you should spend a little time, walking, visiting the Warren Country Store and taking in the lovely Mad River, which runs right through town.

Return to Montpelier on routes 100, 100B and 2.
