Dear Mr. Harvey:

I am writing to request two corrections to the Agency of Transportation highway map for the Town of Waitsfield. The Selectmen have reviewed a number of materials researched by Brian T. Sweet, General Manager for Ward Lumber Company, in regard to the correct layout of Town Highways #16 & 28. We ask that you review the enclosed materials from Mr. Sweet and make the corrections as noted. The corrections are briefly outlined below.

The State map currently shows TH #16 ending considerably short of the Northfield town line. Records indicate that this road was once laid out to go over the mountain and into Northfield. Some of this road is untravelled, but we can find no record of any discontinuance or change in layout of the road. We ask that you reinstate this mileage onto the official highway map as Class 4.

The State map currently shows TH #28 as heading easterly from TH #4, then taking a southerly bearing before meeting Pine Brook. Records indicate the actual Town highway continues easterly over the brook and then bears northerly to its end at a total mileage of 1.65 miles. The southerly turn is the State's leased right of way which accesses the former fire tower on Scrag Mountain. The section of road in question is also Class 4.

A review of the State's maps for the Town will show that both of these roads have previously been shown as described above. We do not know how the changes came about, but we have been unable to find any record for them in our offices. The older maps should prove useful in reviewing this matter.

We hope that we have provided adequate documentation for these changes. If further information is needed, please contact our Administrative Assistant, Bill Bryant. He and Mr. Sweet would be glad to meet with you to review all the records.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Enclosed are copies of Findings and Orders for the reclassification of portions of Town Highways #28, 38 & 40. The reclassification of these roads was undertaken in an effort to make their legal status consistent with our annual Certificate of Highway Mileage and with Agency of Transportation measurements of Waitsfield's roads done by Mr. Jay H. Kilton on July 25, 1989.

Town Highway #28 was originally designated as a Provisional Class 3 for one mile and Class 4 for the remaining .65 mile. Since that time, the Town has improved .56 mile. The current reclassification designates the improved section to Class 3, an additional .13 mile to remain Provisional Class 3, and the remaining .96 mile to be Class 4.

Town Highway #38 has been reclassified exactly as outlined by Mr. Kilton. A portion of Town Highway #40 has been officially reclassified to conform with its listing on the official State map of the Town as Class 4.

Mr. Kilton also advised that a portion of Town Highway #14 should be improved or reclassified from a Class 3 to Class 4. The Selectmen have chosen to have the Road Department make necessary improvements to keep this portion as a Class 3 road. We are confident the Agency of Transportation will agree upon inspection & to restore this section to our highway aid.

Dear Bill:

This letter will serve as a brief summary of my meeting with the Board of Selectmen on Tuesday evening, September 3,-1991 and a summary of the situation regarding Town Highway #28, Palmer Hill Road, and Town Highway #16, East Road or Northfield Mountain Road.

The general situation is one of errors in mapping done by the Vermont Agency of Transportation, Planning Division and involves either wrong location or elimination of parts of the subject town roads from the town road system.

Town Road #28, Palmer Hill Road

The present map prepared and distributed by the Agency of Transportation dated 1986 shows a total mileage of 1.65 miles on Town Road #28. The 1.65 miles is separated into 1.00 miles of Class 3 road and 0.65 miles of Class 4 road.

The location of the 0.65 miles of class 4 road is in error in the following manner. The road extends easterly from the end of Class 3 toward Pine Brook and abruptly turns southerly before crossing Pine Brook. Previous maps have shown the road crossing Pine Brook and then abruptly turning southerly.

The error in location is as follows. As the road extends easterly it should cross Pine Brook then turn <u>northerly</u> for an approximate distance of 0.20 miles. I have included a copy of a USGS topographical map which shows the proper location as described above.

In support of the above described location please refer to the enclosed copies of highway road sheets I obtained from the Vermont Agency of Transportation.

Exhibit #1 is titled "Breakdown of 1960 Road Measurement Changes" for Waitsfield. Item E shows a -0.32 miles from TH#28 and describes it as being "Now untravelled beyond road to Fire Tower." road to the fire tower, a private road, turns <u>south</u> and the actual location of TR #28 continues easterly 0.32 miles and turns <u>north</u> after crossing Pine Brook. There is no identifiable roadway easterly of Pine Brook which turns to the south however the now travelled portion of TH #28, 0.32 miles, which was reclassified to Class 4 in 1974 [See Exhibit #2] does in fact turn northerly and appears to terminate at or beyond the boundry location of the Alice Schwendler property an estimated 0.2 miles from the Pine Brook crossing.

Town Highway #16 [East Road or Northfield Mountain Road]

Town Highway #16 is a matter involving the elimination of a layed out Town Road from the map.

A significant portion of the road was layed out in the early 1800's and the description of the location can be found in Minutes Book 1 on Page 250. The actual starting point was in what is now the Town of Northfield and proceeded Northwesterly over the mountain to the Waitsfield side of the mountain to the approximate location of the original lot line common to original lots 73 and 64 in the first division.

Additional layout work, though sometimes difficult to decipher from the early records, appears to have been recorded in Book 1 page 161 to 163 and Book 1 page 107. There are some gaps in layed out roads in the land records however it should be noted that all of the historical maps of roads in the Town of Waitsfield show the "Mountain Road" in its present location from the intersection of TH #10 to the present Waitsfield-Northfield town line.

In 1893 the Selectmen stated and recorded a total mileage of Forty Three Miles and 295 rods in Minutes Book 3 on Page 421. The mileage stayed pretty much the same except that over the years the 295 rods was recorded as 285 rods then 205 rods.

During the period from 1893 to 1914 there was only one discontinuance action which is recorded in Book 4 Page 209. This action by the Board of Selectmen, "Discontinued the cross Highway from C.D.Joslyn's to O.H.Joslin's. October 2, 1914."

Starting in 1915 the road mileage was identified as 43 miles and that mileage was attested to annually and duly recorded in each year in the Minutes Book. The last recorded affadavit is in Minutes Book 5 on Page 11 and states a mileage of 43 miles, May 15, 1929. I am reasonably sure the 43 miles included that part of now numbered TH #16, the Mountain Road to Northfield, as no discontinuance action had ever been taken to discontinue any part of the road.

Starting in 1931 the State of Vermont Agency of Transportation began a coordinating effort with each of the Towns in the State to show by mapping all travelled roads in the Towns. The State of Vermont was paying State Aid to each Town at this time and the coordinative and overseeing effort was being made to maintain some control on what State Aid was being paid for mileage on which roads.

The original map of 1931 [See Exhibit #3] showed 0.8 miles of road for that part of TH #16 easterly of the intersection of now number TH #10. A notation on the copy of the original map sent to me by Ed Chabot of the Agency of Transportation indicates the following on that part of TH #16 from the end of the 0.8 miles to the Town Line viz: "Original Map on file shows erased road".

From the foregoing it appears that the road was merely eliminated from the map because maintenance was abandoned for that portion of the road from the travelled portion to the Town Line common to Waitsfield and Northfield. There is no evidence of any action having been taken to discontinue the road during the period in question or after. The original map for Northfield [See Exhibit #4] shows 2.6 miles of the subject road in Northfield and shows it extending into the Town of Waitsfield as a travelled road.

The Town may have been correct in not showing the 0.9 miles as a travelled road in 1931 however no action having been taken at that time or since it would appear that the road should be shown as a Class 4 road untravelled.

I have included for your information a copy of a USGS map which shows both TH #16 and TH #28. The present Class 4 status or provisional Class 3 roads are shown in yellow and the untravelled [Class 4] is shown in blue. A recent discussion with Don Harvey of the Agency of Transportation Planning and Mapping division indicates that to correct the problem a USGS map showing the proper location of the roads and a request from the Town to change or add location along with a certificate of mileage for the additional class 4 mileage on TH #16 is needed by the agency signed by the Board of Selectmen.

The additional mileage that should be shown for TH #16 is 0.93 miles.

I respectfully request that the Board of Selectmen take the above identified action on the subject Town Roads and provide Ward Lumber Company a copy of that action.

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If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the Agency for purposes of apportionment under Section 306 of this Title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

Title 19 Section 302(C) - A highway not meeting these standards may be reclassified as provisional Class 3 highway if within five years of the determination, it will meet all Class 3 highway standards.

These mileages which have been deducted will by law remain assigned to their original class, but for bookkeeping purposes, they will be shown on the town highways map as Class 4 with an asterisk.


