

At 3:01 pm, David started the hearing on reclassification of the Sam Farr Road. No decisions will be made at this time. The group walked to the stone culvert for inspection.

The hearing will be convened to the Town Office at 3:30pm.

Mark Trienkman, Sandi Capponcelli and Tom Taylor joined the group.

At 3:30pm, David convened the hearing.

David asked for comments. Henry, Steve, Bob and Kate asked the road continue to have a public right of way. Hannah and Sandi asked it be reclassified as a trail and have an ordinance to support this. Mark commented he would like to see the land go back to the landowners. Denise and Tom commented to keep the road as a trail until further notice.

Discussion followed. At this hearing, a decision to discontinue this road cannot be done. A survey is not needed to discontinue the road. This hearing will determine whether to keep the road as a class four or turn it into a trail. An ordinance on top of the reclassification to a trail will help to keep vehicles off the trail. It would not be able to keep specific groups and people off the trail, but there could be a weight limit. David will be in contact with the lawyer about drafting an ordinance. To pass the ordinance the town will have to have two hearings.

David made the motion to reclassify Sam Farr Road starting at 1100 feet from Brookline Road to the Townshend town line from a class four town highway road to a town legal trail. Denise seconded. Put to a vote. The motion carried.

There being no further business, David made the motion to adjourn. Denise seconded. Put to a vote. The motion carried. The hearing adjourned at 3:45pm.

Dear Members of the Select Boards of Athens and Townshend,

My name is Mark Treinkman and I am a landowner in Athens. The western border of my property runs along the town line between Athens and Townshend and the property is most easily accessed by Billy Smith Road in Townshend.

As you know, Billy Smith Rd turns into a class 4 which in turn becomes Sam Farr Rd. at the town line. At that point, Sam Farr Rd has long ago washed away and goes through a large swamp and ANR recognized wetland.

Due to the rugged condition of Sam Farr Rd closer to Athens, a number of 4-wheel drive clubs are organizing trips here. Unable to cross the worst sections, they make the connection between Townshend and Athens by way of my logging roads.

In order to accommodate their vehicles on my property, they cut trees, move rocks, create ruts and cause a surprising amount of destruction to property they do not have permission to be on. A neighbor has also told me the clubs have crossed the wetland at times, likely causing damage to a fragile and protected ecosystem. Tommy and Danny Taylor have been kind enough to join me at the property and Tommy has attested to the damage at the February 2017 Athens Select board meeting.

I would like to kindly request the select board members of Athens and Townshend consider the harm this has caused and completely discontinue Sam Farr Rd, which will prevent all types of motor vehicles from having a legal right to be in the vicinity. If the road were only reclassified as a trail, ATV's would then have a right-of-way (which they do not now since they are not street-legal). It would be to my great dismay to substitute a new problem in place of the old one. In fact, ATV's are already abusing the situation.

The out-of-town clubs have been treating our land without concern or respect, which has been a sore point and complaint of many neighbors and residents in our area. They show up unexpectedly in groups of up to 50 vehicles, loud, dirty and destructive and have even posted their exploits on private land to the internet.

Thank you for your understanding and consideration. I am sure you can agree that use of private land should be reserved for considerate neighbors that treat it with the respect it deserves. Please feel free to call me anytime.

## NOTICE OF HEARING TO ADOPT A TOWN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING USE OF THE TOWN TRAIL ON SAM FARR ROAD (T.H. 15) TO NON-MOTORIZED TRAVEL

The Selectboard of the Town of Athens, Vermont gives notice that on December \_\_\_\_\_, 2018, the board will consider the adoption of an ordinance restricting use of the town trail on Sam Farr Road (T.H. 15) to non-motorized travel. The draft ordinance is as follows:

# ORDINANCE RESTRICTING TRAVEL ON SAM FARR ROAD (T.H. 15) TO NON-MOTORIZED TRAFFIC

Section 1. No motorized vehicles shall use that portion of Sam Farr Road (Town Highway 15) from the end of the Class 3 section of this highway to the Townshend town line. Traffic shall be limited to pedestrian, bicycle, and horseback uses, without express written approval by the Selectboard.

Section 2. Violation of this ordinance may result in the imposition of a civil penalty of not more than \$800 per day. This ordinance shall be enforced pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1974a, as amended from time to time.

After you've adopted the ordinance, you'll need to post and publish this notice not more than 14 days following the adoption, plus post it in five public places in town. See 19 V.S.A. § 1972.

#### NOTICE

On November \_\_\_, 2018, the Athens Selectboard promulgated an ordinance limiting the use of a portion of Sam Farr Road (Town Highway 15) to non-motorized use from the end of the Class 3 section of the road to the Townshend town line. The ordinance will become effective on the 60<sup>th</sup> day following the vote, unless a petition signed by five percent of the voters is submitted to the Selectboard within 44 days of the vote by the Selectboard, requesting a vote on the question of whether the ordinance shall be disapproved.

If a petition is received within those 44 days, the Selectboard will call a special meeting of the voters to consider the question of whether the ordinance shall be disapproved. If the vote is to disapprove the ordinance, the ordinance will not take effect; if the vote is against disapproval, the ordinance shall take effect immediately.

#### Morning, Dave,

Sure, I can help. I've done a lot of these road reclassification hearings. I know the attorney, and how he goes about his adventures. Reclassifying it to a trail, and then adopting an ordinance banning vehicular traffic is just the ticket.

It starts with notice to all affected parties, including landowners, lenders, power and telephone companies, and those having rights-of-way. Thirty days prior to a hearing, plus a posted and published notice. I have the form, if you can supply the names and addresses, and details of the road—length (in Athens only), town highway number, etc. I don't suppose you have a layout. As we've learned, you're in a deficit in that regard.

Townshend only gets notice. Its consent is not required to reclassify. It could appeal, just as any affected person or entity could. Peter's group could not, however.

You have a site visit, and a hearing, and then 60 days to draft and issue a decision. Appeals are 30 days after that. I can write your decision if you like, if you get me good minutes of the hearing. Sometimes a board wants me to conduct the hearing, but it isn't necessary if you've comfortable with it. After that you send the materials to the State mapping people. Then you adopt an ordinance. That has its own notice requirements, and allows for a petition to object, which can be signed by any voter or landowner, which then forces a town meeting to disapprove the reclassification. There's no need for a

As I'm sure you can imagine, it's a pretty serious matter when towns arbitrary block certain users from accessing their public roads in licensed, registered motor vehicles. Without a passed ordinance closing the road and proper signage put in place, your Constable, acting on behalf of a private individual, committed a flagrant illegal stop opening up the town to substantial liability. I truly hope for the sake of other users that the town can keep this valuable jeep trail open to the public, but if it chooses not to, it should ensure that an ordinance is enacted and that signage is put in place.

Dear Members of the Select Board and residents and landowners in the town of Athens, Vermont,

I regret that I am unable to read this at the Selectman's meeting in person, but am very grateful to Sandi for presenting this in my absence.

Over the course of my time as a landowner in Athens, I have met many of you and am happy to call you acquaintances and friends. I have done my best to be a respectful neighbor and become a member of a great community. I regularly attend community events and spend money with local businesses and contractors.

As you know, I have been victimized by an organization that is taking advantage of the legal nuances of the class 4 section of Sam Farr Rd. I have suffered monetary, emotional and time damages as a result of their abusive behavior, which includes blatantly disregarding landowner property rights.

It is my understanding that the Select Board and members of the town are supportive of a plan to reclassify Sam Farr Rd. as a town trail. While I think this is an important step in the right direction, I am adamant in my opinion that it will not solve the long-term problems.

Peter Vollers, the owner of Vermont Overland, not only organizes 4x4 vehicle outings, but also a mountain bike outing with as many as 700 participants. Based on the interactions and correspondence I and others in Athens have had with Peter, it is a guarantee that Peter will bring these bikes to Sam Farr Rd, if for no other reason than to assert his superiority over the town. If Sam Farr Rd is only reclassified as a trail, we will still have no legal right to prevent him from using it with bikes.

Mr. Voller's past behavior, and more recent legal threats against Athens, should be proof enough of his future intentions. No landowner will suffer more than me when he abuses the law and property rights for his own profit.

Therefore, I strongly encourage the Select Board and townspeople to support and move forward with a plan to discontinue Sam Farr Rd. It is my understanding that some people are concerned they would then lose access to hiking, but I'd like to take this opportunity to publicly state on record that I will not block access to Sam Farr Rd, and do not have a legal ability to do so anyway because my property line does not extend across its entire width.

The constable was called and responded to the road and told the 4x4's that hadn't started up the road that they couldn't proceed. In talking with him he did this for 2 reason the bridge / culvert damage and the fact that a section of the Sam Farr road is under a beaver pond and to travel through to Townshend one would need to cross private property. This didn't please an attorney in the group and he has sent an email and made calls to several people in town suggesting it was illegal and citing a case where the Town of Jamaica had to pay a group that was prevented traveling on their class 4 roads. One of the local residence has contacted the Agency of Natural Resources and I believe an investigation is underway however I haven't heard that officially. The 4 x 4's did travel over and through wetlands and the complainant to the state did take some photographs.

The town has now gotten a petition to ban 4 x 4 vehicles on the road. The Selectboard voted at the last meeting to consider the classification of the road.

We are wondering if you would be able to assist us in the process, so we do not miss a step or cause ourselves headaches while considering the roads classification.

I know if we were going to discontinue the road we would need to work in concert with Townshend. The early feeling I am getting is we might wish to change the classification to a trail but not discontinue the road.

Any assistance you could give us would be appreciated.

Dear Selectboard and Town Clerk,

This email is to let you know how the Vermont Wetland Rules pertain to the Town-owned Sam Farr Road in Athens. Attached is a standardized report form filled out with specific information regarding the classification of your wetland. Please take a look and let me know if you have any questions. I encourage you to contact me directly if you have any questions about wetlands for this project, or any other projects proposed in my district. Consultation with wetlands staff early in your project plans can help to determine if the project is permittable, and if so how to avoid impacts to wetlands and reduce the cost of permitting a project.

Class II significant wetlands are protected under the Vermont Wetland Rules (VWR). Any activity in a Class II wetland or its buffer zone that is not an allowed use designated in Section 6 of the VWR will require a State Wetland Permit. Motorized vehicle tours through wetlands and their buffers is not an Allowed Use. Driving through the wetland identified in the attached report would likely result in vegetation removal and ditching which would adversely affect the wetland's function. Both landowners and agents of an activity may be held liable.

Sam Farr Road has completely naturalized in the area where it is now wetland and Bull Creek. Therefore, if the Town were to want to make it back in to a road, this activity would require a Vermont Wetland Permit. The Wetland Program provides the following guidance document about how naturalized "roads" are regulated under the Vermont Wetland Rules: <a href="http://dec.vermont.gov/sites/dec/files/wsm/wetlands/docs/VWRRoads2017.pdf">http://dec.vermont.gov/sites/dec/files/wsm/wetlands/docs/VWRRoads2017.pdf</a>. I understand that there are no plans to do this, but want to make you aware of this fact.

The Town is exempt from municipal road general permit requirements (MRGPs) in the area of the wetland/buffer zone because the work would trigger a Wetland Permit and/or Army Corps permits. The Town may consider reclassifying Sam Farr Road, in the area of the wetland and buffer zone, as a legal trail (the Town retains ROW) or "throwing the road up" (the Town gets rid of road all together, with no right of way any longer).
