
19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

Dear Mr. Clark:

In reviewing the changes that occurred as part of the Bridge 56 relocation under project BRO 1442 (24), we are requesting clarification about the status of the portions of TH-13 (Bonneyvale Road) that are adjacent to the old location of Bridge 56.

We believe that the former mainline section of TH-13 over the old bridge has been discontinued, based on minutes from the April 27, 2009 Selectboard Meeting, but have not received any of the documentation or the order of discontinuance for this section. I have included a reference from the Selectboard Meeting below:

"Bonnyvale Road — Old Bridge/Road Discontinuance — There will be a hearing to discontinue the portion of Bonnyvale Road (400'x50') that will no longer be in use after the new Ogden Bridge is completed and operational. The hearing will be on Monday, May 11, 2009 at 6:00 pm in the Town Office preceding the regularly scheduled Select board Meeting. The board drafted and signed a letter to Eileen Ogden informing her of the changes that will take place on her property."

We would like to get this highway change clarified for the upcoming Mileage Certificate to be sent to the Town in early January, and seek input from the Town. Please review the enclosed map of the project area and provide details regarding the changes to the alignment of TH-13.

Concerning the portion immediately west of the old bridge location:

Is the road portion identified in purple still a town highway or has it been discontinued and is now a private driveway?

If it is still town highway, is it Class 3 or Class 4?

Concerning the portion immediately east of the old bridge location:

Has the portion identified in beige been discontinued or is it a Class 4 town highway?

Depending on when we receive the clarification, we could process the changes on the 2013 Mileage Certificate and include these changes on the 2013 town highway map.

Please let me know if you have any questions. Thank you.


RIGHT OF WAY LAYOUT PLAN 2



GUILFORD SELECTBOARD MEETING

April 27, 2009

PRESENT: Richard Clark - Board Chair, Troy Revis, Jr. – Selectman, Anne Rider – Selectwoman, Dan Zumbruski – Road Commissioner, Katie Buckley – Administrative Assistant

I. <u>Call to order</u>, 6:30 PM.

II. Approval of Minutes -

- o Anne moved to approve the minutes from the 04/13/09 Selectboard Meeting. Troy seconded. Motion passed.
- III. Recognition of Public Charlie Whipple

IV. New Business -

- o Tree Removal Charlie Whipple Mr. Whipple explained that his neighbor had planted a row of trees along the edge of property line: the trees are clearly located on Mr. Whipple's property, no the neighbor who planted them. The trees have grown very large in size and Mr. Whipple wanted to know if he had the right to remove them. It was agreed that he did indeed.
- o "Certificate No Appeal or Suit Pending" This certificate states that there are no appeals pending from the action of the Listers, nor suits to recover taxes paid under protest. It legalizes the Grand List. Anne moved to approve the certificate. Troy seconded. Motion passed.

V. Old Business -

- o Mr. Handyman Property Services The terms of the annual contract for Mr. Handyman Property Service have remained the same as last year: \$960.00 for 6 months of services May through October. Anne moved to approve and sign this contract. Troy seconded. Motion passed.
- o Identity Theft Prevention Policy Anne review the information for the Identity Theft Prevention Policy from the VLCT in more depth since the last meeting. Because Guilford is such a small town and the way we are structured, it really doesn't apply to us. The board agreed that the Algiers Fire District would have to address the issue. This information was passed along to them.
- o Telephone System Upgrade Dick expressed the urgency of installing an upgrade to the Town Office telephone system. Anne questioned if this was a budgeted item. It is budgeted for FY10 however with the money we saved by canceling our trash removal contract there are funds to pay for half of the project now. Katie asked if she could get Southern VT Tel. Inc. to agree to install ASAP with half the money down and defer billing of the second half until July 1, 2009, could she schedule the service. Anne moved to accept this. Troy seconded. Motion passed.
- o Tontine Sidewalk There was a brief discussion about the background of the sidewalk issue in front of the Tontine building. Anne moved to have Katie contact Pat Beu (Town Agent) to determine what details remain to finalize the legalities surrounding the sidewalk ownership. Troy seconded. Motion passed.

- o Ordinance Review There was a discussion about the need for a rolling review of Town Ordinances. Since we are approaching the time of year when the Selectboard business slows, now would be the time to take that project on. There was a brief discussion about the idea of a Noise Ordinance but all agreed that it isn't necessary. Anne asked Katie to prioritize which ordinances should be addressed first and have it ready for the next meeting.
- o Bonnyvale Road Old Bridge/Road Discontinuance There will be a hearing to discontinue the portion of Bonnyvale Road (400'x50') that will no longer be in use after the new Ogden Bridge is completed and operational. The hearing will be on Monday, May 11, 2009 at 6:00 pm in the Town Office preceding the regularly scheduled Select board Meeting. The board drafted and signed a letter to Eileen Ogden informing her of the changes that will take place on her property.
- o Federal Economic Stimulus Bill Application for Transportation Enhancements & Application for Non-Class 1 Roadway Paving Projects Katie had followed up with Matt Mann from the Windham Regional Commission to learn what town projects could be eligible for funding. There was a discussion about the difficulty in actually getting any of the Federal Stimulus money for Guilford. We are not eligible to receive any of the paving money because we do not have any federally obligated roads in town. The money for Transportation Enhancements is largely dedicated to establishing bike paths and pedestrian ways that would enhance the roadways neither of which is a practical application for Guilford, at this point in time. Matt did mention we could possibly apply for funding under "Transportation Enhancements" for a feasibility study for the Covered Bridge. Katie will follow up with Matt to find out more on this.

VI. Road Commissioner -

- o The Road Crew is on a brush detail right now. When they are through they will start on cleaning ditches. Dan will start to seek reimbursement through FEMA for this work. The town probably won't see the money for at least 6 months.
- o Crack filling will start. Dan also explained that because of the price of asphalt the realistic plan for paving will be two (2) miles instead of three (3).
- o Dan will call John Alexander, AOT, to see when the State will be coming down to determine how much funding we will receive for this year.
- o As soon as the State inspects the asphalt plants, work on the new Ogden Bridge will resume.
- o We haven't heard anything yet on Green Up Day. Dan said there will be three (3) trucks used for it: one for tires, one for metal and one for rubbish. When more details are discovered, Katie will post it on the website and ask the school to include it in the newsletter.
- o Anne asked Dan if he had a sense of where he currently stands with his budget. He stated that he is \$30,000 over budget in gravel. According to his initial calculations he indicated that we might be over-budget in a lot of areas. Anne suggested that during one of the July meetings we have an overall FY09 budget recap for the town. Dan suggested that a budget update be added to the agenda for the May 11th meeting.

VII. Finances –

- o There was a discussion about the Fairpoint (telephone) bill for the Town Office. There are a number of long distance charges for calls made during non-business hours. Dan Z. mentioned that he had a similar situation occur for the garage phone bill in the past. He called Fairpoint to have the charges removed. The board will ask Jackie to research this matter and inquire whether or not we should be on a different service plan to save money.

II. Approval of Minutes -

- • • Troy moved to approve the minutes from the 05/11/09 Selectboard Meeting. Anne seconded. Motion passed.
- III. <u>Recognition of Public</u> Sgt. Eric Albright VSP, Chris Garofolo The Reformer, Herbert Meyer EMD, Maddy Meyer, Alan Moos, Lise Sparrow GCC, Dan Zumbruski Road Commissioner

IV. New Business -

- Vermont State Police Sgt. Eric Albright, VSP, was present to answer questions from the Selectboard and public. There were questions regarding a white van with Florida plates, driven by an older man who was thought to be a sex offender. This individual has been seen driving down some back roads in Guilford. Sgt. Albright confirmed that there is a registered sex offender (from FL) living in Vernon who meets the description of the person/vehicle in question. (The State website for the Internet Sex Offender Registry is: http://www.dps.state.vt.us/cjs/s_registry.htm) He explained that the importance of acquiring a license plate number when reporting suspicious behavior. There was a general discussion about policing in Guilford. Anne mentioned that there is coverage during commuter hours but it is lacking during the night hours.
- Sparrow explained to the board that she received a grant which would allow her to employ 12 "at risk" kids, ages 14-24 years, from Guilford. The program will run for 6 weeks, July through the middle of August, from 9:00 am − 3:00 pm. The group will work on a variety of community related projects including helping at the school, the Grange, the Fairgrounds, etc. The hope is that by working in the community, the kids will grow an attachment to the community. Lise is also seeking a director for the program. She came to the board requesting use of the EM van for field trips. The board agreed as long as drivers are over 21 years of age. They also must provide a photo-copy of their valid driver's license which will be kept on file in the Town Office. Lise asked the board to suggest additional projects that could be done around town. There was a discussion about some possible ideas. Anne moved to allow Lise Sparrow to use the EM van for field trips for her youth employment group this summer. Troy seconded. Motion passed.
- Resident Issues Alan (Micky) Moos Mr. Moos has approximately 6,000 feet of phone wire running from an interface at his mailbox at the intersection of Abijah
