


§ 305. Measurement and inspection


- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.









2014 VTrans Map which shows the mileage and classification as agreed upon between the Town and VTrans.









The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by Selectboard Chair, Richard Clark. Mr. Clark stated that the purpose of the meeting was to hold a public hearing for Town Highway 64 in Guilford, known as Grist Mill Road, and receive testimony from persons interested in the matter to determine whether the following described portion of Town Highway 64 may be discontinued by the Selectboard pursuant to Subchapters 2 and 7 of Chapter 7 of Title 19 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, consistent with the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town:

Beginning at a one inch iron pipe in the south line of Town Highway 64 at the westerly extremity thereof. The point of beginning lies in the common corner of the south line of Town Highway 64, premises now or formerly owned by Gail Hartley and premises now or formerly owned by Reed T. Sr. and Mary L. Fisher;

thence N 89 36' 22" E for a distance of 205.96 feet along line L8 and the south line of Town Highway 64, and along the north line of the Fisher premises and then premises now or formerly of Tara N. Brooks, to an unmarked point;

thence N 58 16' 45" E for a distance of 63.47 feet across Town Highway 64 along line L7 as shown on the Survey to an unmarked point in the north line of Town Highway 64;

thence S 89 36' 22" W for a distance of 271.74 feet along Line 10 and the north line of Town Highway 64 as shown on the Survey to an unmarked point;

thence S 55 55' 25" W for a distance of 59.50 feet along the west line of Town Highway 64 to the one inch iron pipe at the point of beginning.

For the purposes of this metes and bounds description, the word "Survey" means the survey map by Eric M. Morse, Land Surveyor, dated October 10, 2007 and last revised titled:

"Boundary Survey, Guilford Center Road, Coolidge Highway (US Route 5) and Grist Mill Road, Part of Algiers Village, Guilford, Vermont"

Mr. Clark, a native of Guilford, commented that in his lifetime he has used this portion of Grist Mill Road 10 or 15 times. Ms. Rider, a long-time resident, added that she has used it even less. While Mr. Revis uses the lower portion of the road to retrieve his mail, he explained that the upper part (the portion in question) is extremely dangerous when exiting from it onto Guilford Center Road due to lack of visibility. Mr. Morse said that he has spoken with the people who live there and they also agree that it is dangerous.

Mr. Clark indicated that he had spoken with Dan Zumbruski (Guilford Highway Commissioner and Road Foreman) to learn his opinion on this matter. He said that Mr. Zumbruski opinion is in accordance with that of the Selectboard; he is in favor of this discontinuance. In addition to it being very hazardous, it is a very difficult road to plow in the winter and maintain in general. Mr. Zumbruski's only concern was being able to turn the Town plow truck around should it become a dead end. Mr. Morse explained that this had been taken into consideration (refer to Selectboard Meeting minutes from 9/27/2010 for the dialogue creating the basis of the new design) and addressed through a proposed easement between FOAVI and the Town for 20' X 30' hammerhead turnaround (identified on the Boundary Survey).

No abutters were present for comment. A general discussion took place about the current and future layouts of the road and how it may be marked when the discontinuance process is complete.

The meeting was recessed at 6:09 PM to allow time for any persons with concerns to appear. None did.

Ms. Rider moved to adjourn the Grist Mill Road Discontinuance Hearing at 6:25 PM. Troy seconded. Motion carried.

Working with the existing data I have access to (and in the absence of a current field inventory), I would recommend that the reclassification of the Class 4 section of TH-19 be handled as a reclassification/remeasurement.

The most recent inventory record I have access to (dated 1990, copy attached), has a distance of 0.49 miles for the western Class 3 portion of TH-19 and 0.05 miles for the eastern Class 3 portion, which is reasonably close to the official AOTMILES of 0.50 and 0.04 respectively.

With a total geometric mileage of 0.85 (ARCMILES), this would leave 0.31 miles left over for the Class 4 portion. Class 4 town highways are rarely field inventoried, so the actual field mileage is unmeasured.

If you don't want to include a remeasurement of the Class 3 portions in this year's Certificate process (which should include a field inventory under clear, dry road conditions), go ahead with the reclassification of Class 4 TH-19 and include a remeasurement from 0.34 miles to 0.31.
