Call to Order and Approve Minutes of the Meeting of January 2, 2007: Meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Chairman Thomas MacPhee Ann DiBernardo moved that the minutes of January 2, 2007 be approved as printed. Motion was seconded by Leslie Goldman. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment on Items Not on the Agenda (2 minutes per person) and Add Agenda Items: None

Agenda:

1. <u>Hotel Windham Parking Lot:</u> Richard Ewald, Development Director, noted that recently there has been some problem with the parking area behind the Hotel Windham. Ewald is requesting that the Selectboard make a motion that the parking area be for Hotel Windham tenants only. Ann DiBernardo moved that the parking area adjacent to the Hotel Windham be designated as parking for Hotel Windham tenants only. Motion was seconded by Leslie Goldman.

MacPhee then opened the meeting up for discussion on this motion. Joel Love, resident, stated that the present leases for the tenants at the Hotel Windham specifically stipulate that the lease covers the retail space only and no other areas, including parking. Salmon asked what other options would be available for tenants. Goldman stated that there was the Bridge Street parking lot that could be utilized. Roger Riccio, BF Trustee and Chamber Director, stated that there is also plenty of parking at the Waypoint Center and the parking lot across from there. Joanna Dickerson, resident and business owner in the Square, stated that parking in the downtown area is valuable for customers and that this parking area should serve the public. Interim Police Chief John Dunfee states that the BF Police Department is getting calls all the time about parking issues in this space. Schempf noted that this will be a non-issue in approximately 6 weeks as the Hotel sale will be finalized.

MacPhee called for a vote on the motion. Dibernardo stated she would like to amend her motion to add "to such time as the Windham Development Corp, LLC assumes ownership." Goldman, who seconded the motion agreed. Those in favor 1 (DiBernardo), opposed 3 (Harty, Salmon & Goldman). Motion defeated.

- 2. <u>Appoint Connecticut River Transit Representative:</u> Schempf noted that with the resignation of Tom Salmon from the Connecticut River Transit Board due to his new duties as State Auditor, the Town needs to appoint a new representative to this Board. Schempf notes that Roger Riccio has agreed to take on this responsibility and the Connecticut River Transit Board would welcome this appointment. Leslie Goldman moved that the Selectboard appoint Roger Riccio as its representative to the Connecticut River Transit Board to replace Thomas Salmon. Motion was seconded by Dennis Harty. Motion passed unanimously.
- 3. <u>VTCMA Membership</u>: Schempf is recommending that the Town have a membership to the Vermont Town & City Management Association. Leslie Goldman moved that the Town obtain a membership to the Vermont Town & City Management Association. Motion was seconded by Thomas Salmon. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Town Meeting Warning Articles:

a) Roberts noted that there are 2 articles that need to be submitted for a Town vote. The first one involves a change on how the rebate/pre-bate system is handled. Legislation Act 185 will this year make it so that these now come to the Town as a tax credit instead of individuals getting a check. Town's have to decide if they want it applied on the 1st installment or pro-rated over all 4 installments. Roberts read the article – "To see if the voters of the Town of Rockingham will authorize the Selectboard and Treasurer to apply property tax credits pro-rated over all 4 tax bill installments for eligible income sensitivity property owners as designated by Act 185 of the Vermont Legislature." Goldman moved to accept and add that article as read to the Town Warning. Motion was seconded by Ann DiBernardo.

Discussion: Schempf noted that the alternate motion would be to apply the credit to the 1st installment so the taxpayer would receive a bill with a smaller 1st payment and 3 larger installments. DiBernardo stated that she felt the article as read by Roberts was confusing and people would not fill this in at the polls. Schempf stated that this is not an Australian ballot article but would be on the floor at Town Meeting to be discussed and explained. Roberts stated that the reasoning for this credit was that in the past taxpayers had received a check and had not applied it to their taxes but spent the check. This way the State is assuring that this credit will be applied directly to the tax bill. MacPhee asked if this would be noted on the tax bill. Schempf stated that it would.

MacPhee called for a vote. Motion passed unanimously.

b) Roberts reported that the next article from the Listers' office relates to veteran's exemptions. Rockingham had voted many years ago that disabled veterans, at least 50% disabled and their qualified widows get a \$20,000 reduction on the value of their property. \$20,000 represents \$10,000 more than what the State of Vermont requires. There are 2 reasons that this has come up. This had previously been grandfathered and it is time to vote this again. The other reason is that legislature has made it possible for towns to vote more \$10,000. This only applies to 50% disabled veterans. The article

reads "To se if the voters of the Town of Rockingham will exempt qualified veterans (over 50% disabled) or their qualified widows from an additional \$10,000 of property value more than the state \$10,000 exemption, for a total reduction of \$20,000 listed property value, for a five year period commencing 2007." Leslie Goldman moved that the article be added to the Town Warning as read. Motion was seconded by Ann DiBernardo. Motion passed unanimously.

c) Goldman noted that there was another article included in the Selectboard packet. MacPhee had requested that this be included in the packet. Goldman read the article "Shall the voters of the Rockingham School District vote to establish the River Valley Technical Center School District as described in the Governance Planning Committee Report approved by the Vermont State Board of Education on September 19, 2006?" Goldman briefly explained this article and stated she had spoken to a member of the River Valley Technical Center Board, who was strongly advocating the independence of this board from the local board. Goldman moved that the article be included in the Town Warning as read. Motion was seconded by Ann DiBernardo. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Road Classifications:

a) Accept Windsor Road: Schempf noted that the Board had previously voted to accept Windsor Road at a previous meeting but this was not formally warned on the agenda, so he is asking that the Board redo this motion. Dennis Harty moved that the Town accept Windsor Road as a town highway. Motion was seconded by Ann DiBernardo.

Goldman asked if there was a policy on the Town accepting roads. Schempf noted that there is a policy for constructing roads but not for accepting these roads as town highways. Ellen Howard noted that she had drafted a policy previously, which the Board has a copy of. Goldman states that she feels that the Town needs to have a policy on taking over roads. Howard noted that when the driveways were put in off this road, the property owners were not required to get access permits from the Town and believes that property owners should be required to get an access permit.

Harty withdrew his original motion, accepted by DiBernardo who seconded it. Goldman moved to accept Windsor Road as a town highway pending submission and approval of highway access permits. Motion was seconded by Dennis Harty. Motion passed unanimously.

b) Discuss Sand Hill Road: Schempf noted that a letter had been received from John Blake and Robert Pettit requesting that the Board rescind its decision of August 2004 to reclassify Sand Hill Road from a Class 3 to Class 4 road with no winter maintenance. Thomas Salmon moved that the Board take no action on this request. Motion was seconded by Ann DiBernardo. Motion passed unanimously.

Review & Approve Orders Bills & Warrants: Leslie Goldman moved that the Board approve and sign the orders, bills and warrants as presented. Motion was seconded by Thomas Salmon. Motion passed with 3 in favor, DiBernardo recused herself from this vote.

Other Business:

- DiBernardo stated that she had received an email from a Saxtons River Trustee stating that the minutes of January 2, 2007 were incorrect, stating that there was a section that stated that "Harty reminded the Board that both the Bellows Falls Trustees and the Saxtons River Trustees had come to the Board asking for help with their respective budgets." DiBernardo stated that the email she received stated that this was not true and would like the minutes to reflect this. Kerry Bennett, Recording Clerk, stated that this is the statement that was made and the minutes were correct. Harty stated that he recalls that both the Saxtons River Village Trustees and the Bellows Falls Village Trustees had requested help from the Selectboard on their budgets, and the committees formed for public works and emergency services was a result of this request. Louise Luring, Saxtons River Chair, stated that she did not believe Saxtons River had requested any assistance. Harty stated that he may have misspoke and apologized if he did so. However, the minutes are correct as printed.
- Salmon noted that after having spent a little time in his new position in Montpelier, he has noticed that the local control, self governance, problem solving locally, is a cherished commodity in Vermont and that we have to continue to work together.

Selectboard Comments/Reports: None

Manager Comments/Reports: None

<u>Executive Session</u> – Contract Negotiations: Schempf recommends that the Board wait to go into executive session following the Joint Board meeting next. All agreed.

Leslie Goldman moved that the Board recess until the Joint Board meeting is completed. Motion was seconded by Ann DiBernardo. Motion passed unanimously.

Leslie Goldman moved that the Board enter into executive session at 9:40 p.m. to discuss contract negotiations and that the Municipal Manager be invited to attend. Motion was seconded by Dennis Hartv.

The Board came out of executive session at 9:50 p.m. No announcements or decisions were made.

Adjourn: Leslie Goldman moved to adjourn the meeting at 9:50 p.m. Motion was seconded by Dennis Harty.

Whereas, at Rockingham aforesaid, on the 19th day of January A.D. 1932, more than three freeholders of said town of Rockingham, to wit, W. C. Hadley, H. A. Hatch, John H. Elodgett, F. C. Winnewisser, John T. Dizer and C. F. Wright presented to the selectmen of said Rockingham their petition in writing, hereunto annexed, therein asking that they "Will alter and/or lay out and cause to be surveyed a public highway from School Street to Westminster Street in the Village of Bellows Falls in said Town at a place about where the present cement stairs and gravel roadway is in use, and discontinue any portion of any present laid out highway not included in such layout or alteration."

Whereupon, the said selectmen did order and appoint that, on the 16th day of February A. D. 1932, at 9 o'clock A. M. They would meet at the Selectmen's room in the Town Hall Building in said Rockingham, from which place they would proceed to examine the premises, hear the parties interested, consider claims for damages and determine if the public good or the necessity and convenience of individuals requires the opening of a public highway and/or discontinuance of any part of the highway as called for in said petition; and did give notice thereof to W.C. Hadley, one of the petitioners, and to E. P. Cray, S. J. Cray, who claim an interest in lands of John W. Suter and Martha C. VonStulpnagel, S. J. Cray for John W. Suter, also for Martha C. VonStulpnagel, now residents of Vermont, Martha A.L. Allbee, Martha A.L.Allbee for Robert Allbee now resident of Vermont, Dr. Ralph Knight for Mrs. Georgianna Fiori, Caroline Arms, by placing under front door of residence of Caroline Arms. Imogene Parker, Clerk of the First Baptist Church of Bellows Falls, Town Clerk of Rockingham one copy each for J.W.Suter, Martha C. VonStulpnagel and Caroline Arms, persons owning or interest in the lands through which said proposed highway may pass, or interested in lands in which highway now lies, by written notices delivered to each of said persons named as above at least twelve days before the time fixed for hearing, and stating that said selectmen would then examine said premises and hear the parties interested, and would also consider claims for damages. Copies of said notices were also posted at the same time at the ends of said proposed street.

And, afterwards on the said 16th day of February A.D. 1932, all of said selectmen, met, did examine the said premises, according to said appointment, and after hearing the parties interested, among them being E. P. Cray, Martha A.L.Allbee, Mrs. Georgianna Fiori, Robert Ailbee, W. C. Hadley and F. C. Winnewisser of the petitioners, Geo. H. Thompson as Attorney for the Bellows Falls Village Corporation the hearing was adjourned for one week for further hearing and for hearing upon any claims for damages.

Upon February 23, 1932, all of said selectmen reconvaned according to adjournment, and among those present were E.P.Cray, Martha A.L.Allbee, Georgianna Fiori, Ralph E. Edwards, as attorney for said Martha A.L. Allbee, Georgianna Fiorey and for Robert Allbee, W.C.Hadley one of the

Said Selectmen after hearing the parties interested were then and there of the opinion that the public good, and the necessity and convenience of individuals requires an open public highway to be laid out as claimed in said petition; and, therefore, they did cause the same to be surveyed by the following metes and bounds.

Beginning at a nail (a) set in the concrete on the northerly line of School Street, as surveyed in 1816, which said pin is eighty four and seventy five hundredths (84.75) feet westerly of the easterly end of said School Street as laid out in 1816 thence running easterly along the northerly line of School Street eighty four and seventy five hundredths (84.75) feet to an iron pin (b) at the easterly end of School Street as above referred to; thence to the left with an interior angle of 104° 23' and running thence fifty seven and three hundredths (57.03) feet to a cross out in the concrete (c); thence to the right with an exterior angle of one hundred twenty six degrees and forty seven minutes (126° 47') and running thence twenty one and fifty two hundredths (21.52) feet to a drill hole in the concrete (d) on the westerly line of Westminster Street; thence to the left with an interior angle of one hundred one degrees and twenty four minutes (101° 24') along the westerly line of Westminster Street and thence thirty six and thirty four hundredths (36.34) feet to a drill hole in the concrete (e) on the westerly line of Westminster Street; thence to the left with an interior angle of forty seven degrees and fifty six minutes (47° 56') and thence sixty and seventy five hundredths (60.75) feet to a drill hole in the concrete (f) at the south westerly corner of lands of John W. Suter et als said iron pin being twenty three and ninety three hundredths (23.93) feet from the point above designated as (c) and with an angle BCF of sixty four degrees and twenty eight minutes (64° 28'); thence to the right with an exterior angle of sixty seven degrees and ten minutes (67° 10') one and three tenths (1.3) feet to the northerly face of the concrete retaining wall (g) abutting the land of the First Baptist Church Society; thence westerly along the northerly face of said retaining wall ninety four and fifty four hundredths (94.54) feet to (h) the easterly line of Church Street; thence to the left and following the easterly line of Church Street one and three tenths (1.3) feet to the point of beginning.

The meeting then adjourned until 2 o'clock P. M. of the same day to hear claims for damages.

When the selectmen met according to adjournment, further discussion was had relative to the lands over which said highway was laid and when the question of damages was presented for determination, no damages were asked and none were awarded.

Whereupon, it is ordered by the said selectmen that the said highway as above laid out and surveyed be established. Said selectmen further find that with the laying out of the aforesaid described highway, that the public good, and necessity and convenience of individuals does not require such part or parts of the old highway as lie without the bounds of this new highway between School and Westminster Streets and they are hereby discontinued.
