- (B) a new public right-of-way laid out as a trail by the selectmen for the purpose of providing access to abutting properties. -Added 1985, No. 269(Adj. Sess.), §1.



A. Legal Hearing Town highway 12 - 8:00 P.M.

Selectmen Present: Janette Holton, Chairman, Darwin R. Rogers and George W. Cote

Also Present: William E. O'Connor, Town Manager, Joan R. Sumner, Clerk to Board, Mark Lund, Road Foreman, Harold and Earline Hamilton. At 8:01 P. M. Martha Mitchell, Charles Degenkolb and Kate Lynnes arrived.

A letter was received from Maury McNaughton Joseph as she was unable to attend the hearing.

The legal hearing Town Highway 12 was called to order at 8:06 by Janette Holton, Chairman.

Chairman Holton and George Cote spoke briefly on the site visit held at 3:00 P. M. today.

It was stated the original petition dated 6/23/86 was not valid as it did not carry the required number of signatures.

Board is considering extending the road approximately 2,465 feet to a pipe on the northerly boundary of the Anthony R. Russo, Jr. property, Parcel number 2-27.

Chairman Holton read the letter received from Maury Joseph stating her reason for requesting the Town to take over the maintenance of Kimball Hill Trail Road as soon as possible.

Chairman Holton requested each resident at the hearing to state their name and the reasons why they would like Town Highway #12 become a town maintained road.

Harold Hamilton: To make it more convenient to travel in and out during the summer and plowed in the winter.

George W. Cote inquired if people in attendance were full time residents at the present time.

Mr. & Mrs. Hamilton (Yes) Martha Mitchell/Charles Degenkolb are now building and plan to be year round residents. Maury Joseph is a full time resident.

Martha Mitchell: Felt if road is not taken over soon all the money spent on road to date would be wasted. Would like access for fire trucks and school buses in the future.

<u>Charles Degenkolb</u>: Stated his reasons were the same as the others, also felt that road is in good shape now and if it is not taken over by the town the road will go steadily down hill.

Charles Degenkolb - cont'd.: At present he has been digging the ditches out by hand each year.

Janette Holton, Chairman stated due to the discussion at the road site with the landowners there would be building during the next few years showing a definite growth on the road.

Discussion between George W. Cote and Darwin R. Rogers re brush-hog being used on both sides of the road leaving 20' of surface for travel.

Janette Holton, Chairman, read over and people in attendance discussed with Board the "Road Reclassification Guideline Policy."

George W. Cote stated the road should be honed and crowned the whole length this fall, if taken over by the Town.

It was stated Lester & Darlene Kurpiewski are planning a summer home now with the idea of permanent residence in 3 - 4 years. Anthony R. Russo, Jr. was planning a camp.

Janette Holton, Chairman, stated if the Board decided to reclassify this road to a Class 3 the Town would need a turnaround - preferably at the north-westerly corner of the Russo property (#2-27). Also stated the Board has 60 days to make a decision which would give the residents time to check with Mr. Russo to see if he would be willing to supply the town with the turnaround.

MOTION: George W. Cote, (Darwin R. Rogers) moved to accept the road down to the northerly boundary of the Anthony R. Russo property (#2-27) south of the Kurpiewski property tentatively on an easement for a turnaround from Anthony Russo. Easement to be approximately 20' x 40' doing the least possible damage to the Russo property. This will give the residents on the road a week or 10 days to contact Mr. Russo to see if he would be willing to give the Town a 20' x 40' easement for the turnaround. Motion carried.

Martha Mitchell inquired if Mr. Russo will not give the easement for a turnaround would the Board be willing to accept an easement for a turnaround on her property or any other alternatives.

Board would like the easement on the Russo property and residents have until the next Selectmen's meeting (November 10, 1986) to supply the Town Manager with proof of easement pending or ready to be drawn up by an attorney. If a guaranty is received in writing the Board will O.K. grading of the road this year.

Hearing was called to a close at 8:37 P.M. by Janette Holton, Chairman.

All residents of Town Highway 12 left the meeting (Hearing) at 8:37 P.M.

All persons owning or interested in lands through which the highway may pass or abut may give testimony at the site visit or public hearing.




