Decision and Order of the Selectmen Of the Town of Andover For the Discontinuance of a Portion of TH #38 a/k/a Christmas Tree Road

At 7:00 p.m. on September 11, 2000, at the Town Hall in the Town of Andover, the Selectmen held a duly warned hearing for the purpose of taking testimony of interested persons and adjoining landowners as to whether the discontinuance of a portion of TH #38, (Christmas Tree Road) was for the public good. A site visit was held on September 16, 2000 at 10:00 a.m. to provide the opportunity for interested parties to view the proposed discontinuance.

The following persons were present at the hearing:

Matthew Neely, Chairman of the Select Board Robert Sydorowich, Select Board Christopher Plumb, Select board Gary Hale, Select Board William Bourque, Select Board Joseph Fromberger, Public Albert DeCell, Interested Party, Mortgagee Linda Bargfrede, Clerk

At the site inspection the following were present:

Christopher Plumb, Select Board Albert DeCell, Interested Party, Mortgagee

During the course of the Hearing, the following exhibits were introduced by the petitioners:

(1) Copy of a survey done by Michael Engineering Company, P.C. entitled "Division of Land of Albert G. DeCell and Karnie G. DeCell" dated February 24, 2000, drawing #99-85.1

Based on the evidence and the exhibits presented at the Hearing, the Board of Selectmen make the following findings:

- 1. The portion of TH #38 that is petitioned to be discontinued begins 390' North of the Andover/Windham Town Line and continues in a Northerly direction approximately .45 of a mile to the northerly boundary of property now owned by Thomas Pease.
- 2. That the only landowner adjoining said Town Highway #38 is Thomas and Susan Pease.
- 3. That the public good will not be inconvenienced by this discontinuance.

Based on the preceding findings, the Andover Board of Selectmen hereby orders that Town Highway #38 (Christmas Tree Road) be Discontinued as described in paragraph 1. Said Discontinued portion of TH #38 may be further described as follows:

Being the northerly extremity of the public highway known as Andover Town Highway No. 38, a/k/a Christmas Tree Road, as it runs through property formerly of Albert G. DeCell and Karnie G. DeCell, now of Thomas E. and Susan Pease.

Beginning at a point in the established centerline of Andover TownHighway No. 38, also known as "Christmas Tree Road" said point being 390 feet northerly of where the centerline of said highway crosses the town line between Windham and Andover; thence from said point of beginning preceeding northerly 138 feet along the centerline of said highway to the northerly extremity of said highway.

Also discontinuing any public highway if one so exists between the northerly extremity of the existing Class 3 section as described herein above and extending northerly to Andover Class 4 town highway No. 18, also known as "Boon road", so-called.

Reference may be had to a survey prepared February 24, 2000 by Michael engineering Company, P.C., entitled "Division of Land of Albert G. DeCell and Karnie G. DeCell".

TOWN OF ANDOVER SELECT BOARD MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 23, 2000

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M. by Matthew Neely, Chairman.

- 1. <u>MINUTES:</u> The minutes of the October 9, 2000 meeting were reviewed. Bob moved to accept the minutes as written. Chris seconded. So moved.
- 2. <u>HIGHWAYS:</u> Ralph addressed the Board concerning the following Highway related issues:
- a. Ralph and Kevin black topped the section of road where the culvert was replaced on the Oxbow. It's a little rough but they will fix it in the spring.
- b. Ralph asked the Board about getting the trucks undercoated. It has not been done in the past but the Board thought it was a good idea. The cost is \$85.00 per large truck and \$45.00 for the 1 ton. Ralph had gotten the quote from Carrara.
- c. Londonderry Highway Department is working on the Little Pond Road again and has gone over the town line about 300 feet. Ralph and Kevin have installed a culvert and will apply some gravel tomorrow.
- d. Parker, Morton and Allard have inquired as to cutting the trees on the Upper Marsh Road to the Weston town line for the wood. Ralph asked the Board if they had any objection to this arrangement. The consensus was that if it wasn't going to cost the town anything they can go ahead. Gary noted that we should stress they need to do a good job on clean up. Ralph will inquire as to whether they are going to burn the brush as well.
- e. Ralph asked if we could get quotes on the cost to widen Little Pond Road where necessary. Chris stated that it would not hurt to get quotes even if we don't do the job right now. Ralph will speak with Chaves as well as Jason and Andy.
- f. Ralph asked Edwin about installing the emergency lights in the Town Garage. Edwin will take care of it. The problem was that the batteries went bad and we cannot get new batteries.
- g. Ralph stated that they will not be putting shurpac on East Hill Road as there is not enough time left this year.

- h. Gary Hale requested that the Horseback Riding sign that is near the Oxbow be moved to the North end of Middletown Road as there are no longer horses at the Oxbow. He also suggested that the speed limit sign should be moved down the road for better visibility. Edwin stated that the weight limit sign also needs to be changed to 24,000 lbs as well.
- i. Bob stated that Joe Brady had spoken to him concerning the broken guardrails by his house and wanted to know if the Highway Crew would fix them. Ralph will take a look at it.
- j. Bob also asked the Board if the problem that Paul Kalinen had concerning the Albee Road was taken care of. The town did install a culvert and a catch basin to correct the problem. It was determined that the town has done all it needs to do in this matter.
 - 3. FINANCIAL ORDERS: Financial orders were reviewed and signed.

4. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. The 2 for 1 Paving Claim Form for partial payment was signed. Linda will submit to Bill Noyes.
- b. Edwin Bentley spoke on behalf of the Andover Snowmobile Club requesting that they be allowed to ride on the last 1/4 mile of the upper end of Marsh Hill Road and also on Newton Road. Chris moved that the Snowmobile Club be given permission to ride on Newton Road and the last 1/4 mile of the end or Marsh Hill Road. Gary seconded. So voted.
- c. Linda told the Board that we have received the reimbursement of the 90/10 bridge money from the State in the amount of \$22,397.40.

5. OLD BUSINESS:

- a. The Decision Report concerning the discontinuance of a portion of TH #38 (Christmas Tree Road) was reviewed. Matt moved to accept as written. Bob seconded. So voted. The Decision Report was signed by the Board.
 - 6. CORRESPONDENCE: Correspondence per Attachment A was reviewed.

Bob moved that Gerry Williams continue as Green Up day Coordinator.

7. At 7:04 P.M. the motion was made and seconded to adjourn.
