Mr. Adams called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and Mr. Wagoner led in the pledge of allegiance.

IV. Citizen & Selectboard Comments

<u>Citizen Comments:</u>

Mr. Hazen presented the Selectboard with a letter that referenced the Boards decision to cut people from the Annual Awards Banquet. He reminded the Board that he helped institute the "original banquet", and the purpose was to recognize the many years of service of dedicated town employees and to say, "Thank You" to the elected and appointed Boards and Commissions who receive no stipend for their may hours of dedicated service to the Town each year.

Mr. Adams thanked Mr. Hazen for sharing his concerns and said this was not an easy decision by the Board. The decision was made in part because of the response of town employees who felt they were not being properly recognized at the banquet. The Board narrowed the list to full-time and part-time employees with the intention of having a separate function to recognize and thank the Boards and Commissions.

Mr. Grassi said he received quite a few complaints from people who were not invited this year.

The Selectboard agreed to send a follow up letter to reassure the Boards & Commissions that we do plan to honor them at a later date.

V. Appointments

VI. Board Reports, Motions and Ordinances:

A. Act 60 Update

Mr. Adams clarified an error in information distributed by the Coalition. They reported they had engaged the services of a lobbying firm in Montpelier, but they did not. At this point, they are reconsidering the idea. He also reported the Coalition has started suit in Superior court on behalf of three towns.

Mr. Rieseberg reported he and Bill Hall had a nice meeting with the staff at the State level. He will ask Commissioner Haase to hold a similar workshop for the staff and Selectboard.

Mr. Grassi said there are two separate issues here. He thought the discussion tonight would be about the nuts & bolts of Act 60 and our involvement in the Coalition. Personally, he does not want to be part of the Coalition. He felt it encouraging when Senator Rivers said they do have some problems and will address them in the next session. He thinks reality is perception and the perception is the Coalition is a group of • Gold Towns• who are suing the state. The statistics show that approximately 78% of this community will benefit from this law. He agrees that we would have never had any information provided to us by the State if we had not joined the Coalition. It has served its purpose and now we should get out. He would rather see us make our voices heard by the ballot box.

Mr. Adams said we could continue to be part of the Coalition without being parties to the litigation, therefore he sees no reason to get out. To date, our involvement in the Coalition has prompted a lot of talk in Town. Before that, nothing was being said about Act 60. One benefit we have achieved is we have generated some discussion and people now are starting to get involved.

Mr. Wagoner agrees with Mr. Grassi on the point of not having the town file a suit, but thinks it is a good idea to remain in the Coalition, if only to use it as another source of information.

Ms. Ottmann is concerned about the dues. The newsletter distributed by the Coalition has indicated they may come back to the Towns for additional funding. She also said she was pleased to hear VLCT will be forming two committees, the Act 60 Implementation Issues Committee and a Committee that will look at economic development, property tax exemption, tax stabilization and impact on local government.

Mr. Rieseberg said we are represented on both of those committees.

Mr. Adams stated he talked with Board member Richard Ballou and although he expressed his concerns about litigation, he is still interested in staying in the Coalition.

Ms. Ottmann wants to know how we can assure this does not become a political battle.

Mr. Adams said we have a seat on that Board and when we see that happening we would withdraw.

Mr. Adams thinks there are benefits of staying in the Coalition and has reservations about only being involved with VLCT. He thinks being involved with both is a good balance.

Mr. Grassi moved that we drop from the Coalition. Ms. Ottmann seconded. Mr. Grassi voted in favor of the motion, Ms. Ottmann, Mr. Wagoner and Mr. Adams voted against, motion failed.

Mr. Adams said he is no longer able to be the liaison to the Coalition. The Board unanimously agreed to have Town Manager, Hunter Rieseberg attend those meetings and report to the Board.

B. Review & Consider Adoption of Fund Balance Management Policy

Mr. Rieseberg said that for the past couple of years under his direction, the Board has tried to establish a positive balance in our fund surplus. GFOA suggests that municipalities carry a positive fund balance of between 5 and 8%. Where the fund balance falls in this range depends upon the stability of the fund or the community. With the revaluation underway, the Manager and the Finance Director feel very strongly that 7.5% of the general fund and 5% of the water/sewer funds should be accumulated as an undesignated fund balance. The fund balances are necessary to protect the town and taxpayers from unexpected events or tax spikes. This policy will guarantee some guidelines for future accumulation and use of these funds as it staves off the urge to spend down the fund, and feels this is a crucial element in sound financial planning. The taxpayers are not being deprived of these funds; they will at some point in future be called upon to serve their needs. We have worked hard over the past two years to establish these funds and we are very near the targeted number.

Mr. Wagoner asked if the policy would address annual borrowing in anticipation of revenue. Mr. Rieseberg said this is a separate issue, but it could under the right circumstances.

If you were to eliminate the back taxes owed to us by QLC, not only would Hartford be in very good condition, the need to borrow in anticipation of taxes would most probably be gone.

Mr. Grassi asked if this was an interest bearing account. Mr. Rieseberg explained the undesignated fund balance is not cash in any account. It is the sum total of excess revenues and under expended appropriations. It is when all the balance sheets come together. The money is out there on paper, some may be cash and some may be accounts receivable, and will fluctuate often.

Mr. Hall explained the undesignated fund balance is the difference between the assets the town has and the liability the town has.

If adopted, the Board may, by two-thirds majority vote, use a portion of the undesignated fund balance, and in case of an emergency, the Board could vote at a public meeting and make a plan to repay those borrowed funds.

Mr. Wagoner moved to adopt the Fund Balance Management Policy as presented and to direct that the staff incorporate this policy into its management of the Town's finances and to thereby accomplish the desired objectives over the next 1-2 years. Ms. Ottmann seconded. All voted in favor, motion passed.

C. Reaffirm Approval of ISTEA Grant - Railroad Row (motion requested)

Ms. Hirshfield asked the Board to reaffirm the vote taken by telephone poll on November 3, 1997, as this grant requires the Board to act on the grant application at a public hearing.

Mr. Adams asked if this was the same ISTEA grant we applied for in the past. Ms. Hirshfield said it was not. This one is \$40,000 and will be used for the clean up Railroad Row, sidewalks and benches. We have an agreement with Valley Land Corp. who will help clean up the area and remove the asphalt, so we may use the area where the public easement is.

Mr. Adams asked where are we now with the various plans we have had for Railroad Row.

Ms. Hirshfield- we have two classes from the University of Vermont who are taking on this project. They are evaluating the whole area particularly as a linkage to the river. They will make their presentation to the Board upon completion.

The proposal for the assisted living project has been put on hold for now. Recently, we have been dealing with the Housing Authority to deal with the revitalization of the other section of the downtown area.

The improvements or vision that we have the area will take a long time to accomplish and are working at it in small increments.

Ms. Ottmann asked about the reallocation of funds from the bike path. Mr. Rieseberg responded that we have received word that they will not reallocate the funds from the bike path but will look for additional funding for the underpass project.

Mr. Grassi moved to reaffirm action taken by the Board of Selectmen via a telephone poll on November 4, 1997 to approve and authorize the Town Manager and Planning & Development Director to sign for and otherwise apply for the ISTEA grant as presented. Ms. Ottmann seconded. All voted in favor, motion passed.

D. Request to Accept 700' Upgrade of Neal Road from Class IV to Class III

Mr. Rieseberg said we are prepared to start the Public Hearing process. Mr. Lavalla said the road may need a survey and was concerned about who would pay for it. Mr. Rieseberg estimated the cost at between \$500 - \$700.

The Board agreed all associated costs would be the responsibility of the applicant.

Mr. Grassi moved to authorize the staff to schedule the proposed reclassification of the effected portion of Neal Road for public consideration pursuant to 19 VSA, Section 709 with all costs (Surveys) to be borne by the applicant. Mr. Wagoner seconded. All voted in favor, motion passed.



E. Request to Accept Truell & Ry-Kris Roads

Mr. Rieseberg said there seems to be a lack of clarity of why a subdivision is approved at a given point in time, would it then be required to construct a road subject to conditions that are imposed at a later date. Town Council referred to Section 9.3.05, of the Town's Road Acceptance Policy that states: Road specification in effect at the time of the initial inspection will be applicable for a period of two years from that date after which time any new road specifications will apply. This sub-division was approved approximately eight or more years ago, so the two-year period has turned over several times thereby making it subject to the current road specifications, which at this time require paving.

Mr. Lavalla said in 1990 the Highway Regulations were updated and Class III roads were to be asphalt paved, except under certain instances. The regulations are clear on what the exceptions are and this sub-division does not meet any of the criteria.

Mr. Adams expressed his concerns that the Town made representation that the road would not have to be paved prior to acceptance.

Mr. Davis produced a letter written in 1992 stating the Town of Hartford will take over the road at any such time the roadway has been completed in accordance to highway specifications. In another letter dated 1992, Mr. Blaisdale states he has inspected the road and agrees it has been built according to the standards contained in the ordinances. He sees no reason why the Board of Selectmen will not accept the road for maintenance when proper application is made for the acceptance.

Mr. Davis does not understand this, the Board just took over a Class III road (Barrister Drive) in the Simpson Development that is not paved.

Mr. Rieseberg said Barrister Drive was approved because it is use was intended as a secondary access only. It was a separate agreement made with the former manager and Mr. Brockway.

Ms. Hirshfield said the application is not valid. It is over two years old and is expired and said the Davis' signed an agreement with the Town.

Mr. Adams says he understands what Mr. Davis is saying. If Town officials have stated that the road has been inspected and meets the highway specifications, how can we go back on it, regardless of whether or not those making the representation are no longer employees of the Town.

Mr. Rieseberg agrees with Mr. Adams but is not sure there was reliance in the sense that no decision or action was taken based on that information. If the applicant had applied for the road to be accepted at that time, there would have been an effort to rely on that representation. He also said these people had no authority to make such representations. This is not a personal matter against Mr. Davis but rather a matter of deviating from established policy. He again warned the Board to be aware of setting a precedent.

Mr. Grassi asked how much it would cost to blacktop the road. Mr. Davis estimated it would cost him \$30,000 but thinks it would not be that expensive for the Town.

Mr. Wagoner said if the specifications changed in 1990 and his letters from the Highway Superintendent and the Town Manager are dated in 1992, he believes it would have been approved at that time. The letters presented do not have an expiration date.

Mr. Grassi said if you base this on facts, there appears to be an indication that in 1992 the Selectboard did tell him the road was acceptable. He agrees that the Town Manager is correct, policy is policy but there are human errors here that need to be corrected.

Mr. Adams said he recognizes policy, but at the same time, the Board needs to consider fairness. Due to the complicated circumstances and representations made by former Town employees, he is inclined to accept the road, fully understanding the potential ramifications that may come along with this acceptance.

Mr. Wagoner moved to accept Truell & Ry-Kris Roads in its present condition as of May 1, 1998 with the understanding that structural maintenance will continue to be the responsibility of the applicant (Mr. & Mrs. Davis) for one year after acceptance or until April 30, 1999, as referenced in Section 9.3.06 of the Town of Hartford's Highway Rules and Regulations. Mr. Grassi seconded. All voted in favor, motion passed.

Mr. Rieseberg wanted to make sure the Board is very clear about the precedent this will establish and that they fully understand this action will result in a \$30,000 unbudgeted expenditure.

The Board asked Mr. Davis to leave copies of all correspondence from the Town regarding the take-over of the road.

 - a. River City Christmas December 19, 1997 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Grassi moved to approve the Special Event request as submitted by David Briggs for a River City Christmas. Mr. Wagoner seconded. All voted in favor, motion passed.

b. Hartford High School - Interscholastic Athletic Games

Mr. Grassi moved to approve the Special Event request as submitted by Hartford High School for Interscholastic Athletic Games. Mr. Wagoner seconded. All voted in favor, motion passed.

c. Sale of Christmas Trees - November 28 through December 24 2 Norwich Ave. Wilder

Mr. Rieseberg explained the applicant does not have permission by the owner who does not want vending or sales operation on his property. The Special Event request form is being modified and will include a signature line for the property owner.

Mr. Wagoner moved to approve the Special Event request as submitted by Aaron Gilbert to sell Christmas trees. Mr. Grassi seconded. No one voted in favor, all voted against, motion failed.

G. Request for Article on 1998 Town Warning - Joint Senate Resolution

Mr. Adams read a request to place an item on the 1998 Town Warning supporting the Joint Senate Resolution to decrease the federal defense budget and increase the distribution of those monies to other areas of federal and state government. Although it passed through the Senate, Mr. Adams thought that Congress was probably in a better position to make the decisions on the defense spending policy and suggested the Board not support the resolution.

Mr. Wagoner moved that Joint Senate Resolution J.R.S. 8 be placed on the 1998 Town warning. Mr. Grassi seconded. No one voted in favor, all voted against, motion failed.
