## **Vermont Statutes Annotated**

# 19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

## § 305. Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.

(d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.


(e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.

(f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.

(g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

## ORDER FOR DISCONTINUANCE AYERS LANE, SO-CALLED (HARTLAND TOWN HIGHWAY 60)

At a regular meeting of the Hartland Select Board on February 11, 2013, the Hartland Select Board, on its own motion, moved to begin proceedings to accomplish discontinuance of Ayers Lane (Town Highway 60) in the Town of Hartland, Vermont. The procedure for discontinuance is as described in 19 V.S.A. Chapter 7. The authority for commencement of the discontinuation procedure by the Select Board on its own motion is pursuant to 19 V.S.A. §708(a).

At the meeting of the Hartland Select Board on February 11, 2013, Ayers Lane as it is to be discontinued was described and the date of inspection for the portion of the road to be discontinued was set for April 1, 2013 at 6:00 P.M., with hearing on the matter to be held thereafter on April 1, 2013 at 7:00 P.M. at Damon Hall, Hartland, Vermont as required by 19 V.S.A. §709.

Pursuant to the requirements of 19 V.S.A. §709, notice, posting and publication requirements were satisfied as follows:

1. Notice by certified mail, return receipt requested was given to persons owning or interested in lands through which the highway may pass or abut. The notice included information describing the highway to be discontinued, as well as information about the time, date and place for inspection and subsequent hearing. Certified mail return receipt notice was also given to the municipal Planning Commission for the Town of Hartland, Vermont and, pursuant to 19 V.S.A. §775, certified mail return receipt requested notice was also given to the State of Vermont Commissioner of Forests, Parks and Recreation. As required, notices were sent to the following persons or entities (all notices were originally sent Friday, February 22, 2013, well within the requirement for notice of at least thirty (30) days prior to the inspection and hearing which occurred April 1, 2013):

Michel Guite; Michel Guite appears to be the only property owner where any portion of Ayers Lane as it is to be discontinued passes or abuts;

Michael C. Snyder, Commissioner of Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation (general notice required by statute);

Copies of return receipt cards are attached to this document and made a part hereof by this reference. Either by dates noted on the return receipt cards, or with reference to date stamps or delivery confirmation obtained by checking tracking information for each such mail article, the Hartland Select Board attests and certifies by signature hereon that all of these notices were sent well within the time required by statute and received at the addresses where the notices were sent. The notices sent to the State of Vermont, Vermont Department of Forest, Parks and Recreation was received on February 25, 2013; the notice sent to the Hartford Planning Commission was received February 25, 2013; the return receipt card for the mailing to Michel Guite was returned unclaimed without notice of delivery, but there is also attached hereto a statement of J. Michel Guite dated March 21, 2013 confirming his receipt of proper notice of the public hearing held on April 1, 2013 and Michel Guite also appeared at the inspection and the hearing on April 1, 2013, further evidencing his receipt of proper notice.

2. 19 V.S.A. Section 709 also requires that a notice of the proposed discontinuance be posted in the office of the Town Clerk. A copy of the notice which was posted and a certification by the Town Clerk that such notice was posted as required by the terms of the statute is attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference. This is the same notice which was sent to all the persons or entities referenced in Section 1 above.

3. 19 V.S.A. §709 further requires that notice of the proposed discontinuance procedure be published in a local newspaper of general circulation not less than ten (10) days before the time set for the hearing (which hearing occurred April 1, 2013). That notice was published in the Valley News in the "Legals" section on March 16, 2013, and a photocopy of the notice as published on that date is attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference.

The site inspection was held at the time and place specified in the notice, being April 1, 2013 at 6:00 P.M. at the point where Ayers Lane intersects with the southerly edge of Town Farm Hill Road, being Hartland Town Highway No. 5. Persons appearing were as follows:

Michel Guite (abutting landowner)

Various other parties were present at the time of inspection, including representatives of the Valley News and Vermont Standard, and members of the Hartland Select Board, including Thomas White, Gordon Richardson, Richard Waddell, Mary O'Brien and Martha McGlinn; also present was Robert Stacey, Hartland Town Manager. A brief discussion among the persons present occurred at the time of site inspection and the place where the road discontinuation would commence and then proceed to the present terminus of Ayers Lane, was pointed out to those present, being approximately .20 miles in length. Ayers Lane as it is to be discontinued lies wholly within the Town of Hartland, Vermont, so there was no reason for notification of any other municipality.

The Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation has the power to request (but not compel) that any discontinued town highway be designated as a trail. The Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation did not make such a request and the Town of Hartland Select Board specifically does not intend that any portion of the discontinued roadway have any status as a trail after discontinuance.


Although applicable sections of Title 19 of Vermont Statutes Annotated appear to provide for payment of damages or compensation only to parties whose lands may be taken in the course of road creation, and lay-out, it is noted, without conceding any entitlement to any such payment, that no person or entity has requested payment of any compensation or damages in connection with the proposed discontinuance and no such damages or compensation of any description are awarded by the Hartland Select Board.

19 V.S.A. §711(a) requires that this Report and Order be completed within 60 days of the date of site examination and hearing (which occurred April 1, 2013). At the regular meeting of the Hartland Select Board on <u>o</u> day of <u>May</u>, 2013, this Report was approved and adopted and by motion made, seconded and passed, it was and is hereby ORDERED that, the public good, necessity and convenience being served thereby, Ayers Lane as described and referenced above be and is hereby **DISCONTINUED AS A TOWN HIGHWAY**, not to continue as a trail or any other status allowing public passage. Further, title to the land over which the discontinued portion of Ayers Lane ran prior to discontinuance shall vest in Michel Guite and his heirs, successors and assigns, he being the owner of the land on both sides of the discontinued highway, as provided by 19 V.S.A. §775.

At a meeting of the Select Board of the Town of Hartland, Vermont on Monday, February 11, 2013, the Select Board, on its own motion, moved to commence the process of discontinuance of a portion of Ayers Lane (Hartland Town Highway No. 60). The discontinuance procedure is commencing on the Board's own motion, not as a result of private petition from landowner(s).

DESCRIPTION OF PORTION TO BE DISCONTINUED: The portion of Ayers Lane (TH60) to be discontinued may be generally described as the entirety of Ayers Lane beginning with its intersection at the southerly edge of right of way of Town Farm Hill Road, being Town Highway No. 5 and thence continuing .20 miles, be the same more or less, to the terminus of Ayers Lane. 

We are in receipt of the notice pursuant to the requirements of Title 19 V.S.A. that you propose to discontinue Town Highway #60, also known as Ayers Road, beginning at Town Farm Hill Road and ending at the end of Ayers Road in the Town of Hartland. The Department of Forests, Parks & Recreation has reviewed the proposal and finds that this will not affect any existing trail corridors and therefore, has no objection to the proposed discontinuation. For your information, it has been the policy of this Department to encourage towns to continue ownership of highway rights-of-way where they are of sufficient length or location to be of value to recreational users. Such existing rights-of-way can be valuable recreation resources for our growing population.

With the passage of H. 83 in the 1991 Legislature, the laws regarding Class 4 roads and trails give much more strength to towns in their ability to preserve these rights-of-way. Title 19 V.S.A. 711 states in part:

"...the selectmen may order that the petitioner bear the cost of upgrading a class 4 town highway to the class 3 town highway standards established in 19 V.S.A.  $\Box$  302(a)

(3)(B). Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a town to maintain a class 4 highway or to upgrade a highway from class 4 to class 3."

Enclosed is a copy of the "Town Policy on Class 4 Roads and Trails," issued by the Vermont Trails and Greenways Council. In addition, you will find a copy of the Department's policy on road discontinuance. You may want to consider a similar policy in Hartland. Having such a policy will help to ensure that you will not be required to maintain Class 4 roads or trails or upgrade them to Class 3.

This Department will not be represented at your meeting on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013 but we ask that this letter and attachments be entered into the proceedings. We also request that local trail organizations such as snowmobile clubs be notified of the proposed discontinuance.

Thank you for contacting us on this matter. We always appreciate the opportunity to comment on these important recreation resources.
