The next item for discussion was to set the tax rate for the 1985/1986 fiscal year. The Town amount to be raised by taxes was \$589,747. Mr. Brown recommended that the rate be set at 66¢. A motion was made by James Patch, seconded by Mary Neal and duly carried that the <u>85/86 Town Tax Rate be 66¢</u>. (64¢ plus 2¢ additional for Equipment (Town & Fire) as voted by taxpayers).

The amount to be raised by taxes for the Ludlow School District was \$627,731. Mr. Brown recommended a rate of 69¢. A motion was made by James Patch, seconded by Milton J. Bixby and duly voted to have the Ludlow Tax Rate at 68¢ for 85/86.

The amount to be raised by taxes for the Union #39 school was \$784,856. Mr. Brown recommended 85¢. A motion was made by Mary Ann Neal, seconded by James Patch and duly voted that the 85/86 Union #39 Tax Rate be 85¢.

A request from Francis Preedom and Howard Barton to the Board was read relative to the Town of Ludlow accepting approximately 1,389 feet of road which has been rebuilt to town specifications by Norton Excavating, Inc. This road is part of Town Highway #11 which is owned by the Town of Ludlow as shown in Town Records Book 2, Page 82. Mr. Patch questioned if there were any houses on this road. Mr. Bixby asked Mr. Brown if he had seen this piece of road. Mr. Brown stated he had ridden over this piece of road and that it meets the specifications as far as he could see. A motion was made by James Patch, seconded by Milton Bixby and duly voted to accept approximately 1,389 feet of the Preedom/Barton road which connects on to Town Highway #11.

Mr. Brown advised the board that he had received a phone call from Carl Merz relative to a piece of property near the Lake Rescue Dam. This is a non-conforming lot and cannot meet the criteria for on-site septic system. Mr. Merz would like to have a hearing before the Board of Selectmen to see if he can or cannot put a system on this site. Mary Ann Neal stated that the Town will have this concurring problem and we must have a person who can advise us on these situations. A motion was made by Mary Ann Neal to have the Municipal Manager hire an engineer to draw up specifications to address this issue for non-conforming lots. This motion was seconded by Milton Bixby and discussion followed. Mr. Patch stated he thought this was a waste of morey, that the baid had set a precedent tonight. 11 Mr. Merz's lot is the same situation as Susanne Smith, how can he be turned down? Mr. Patch stated that he thought Mr. Michael was a reputable engineer and that Mr.Michael would not stamp and seal a design that would not work. If another engineer is hired it will only cost the Town money. Mr. Bixby wondered if the Town could hold Mr. Michael liable if his system didn't work. Attorney Richards advised that the property owner could sue but the Board of Selectmen cannot. Francis Preedom stated that Mr. Michael advised him that towns usually have an engineer check his drawings. Mr. Patch stated he would go along with that. The motion was carried.

The board was then advised by Mr. Brown that the present regulations governing on-site septic systems did not make any provisions for non-conforming lots. These regulations are being
