19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

Policy, Planning & Intermodal Development Division

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.

(d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.


(e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.

(f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.

(g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate



FINDINGS OF FACTS

- Town Highway 49 provides access to one ± 21-acre lot (R22253L) presently owned by Peter and Ina Anderson. Mr. Anderson requested the road be discontinued as a Class 3 town highway. At a duly-warned Selectboard meeting on July 8, 2015 the Selectboard agreed to proceed with the statutory process to discontinue.
- 2. Town Highway 49 is not shown on state highway maps until after 1969. But the Town has no record of any official proceedings to lay out the town highway as a



FINDINGS OF FACTS

1. 1.4

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- 2. Town Highway 49 is not shown on state highway maps until after 1969. But the Town has no record of any official proceedings to lay out the town highway as a class 3 town highway in accordance with state statutes.
- 3. Town Highway 49 begins near the end of the Class 3 portion of Chapel Hill Road (TH22) (via Norwich) at approximately 2.070 miles, and proceeds .05 miles in a westerly direction to a dead-end in the dooryard of a dwelling at 3131 Chapel Hill Road.
- 4. On July 20, 2015 Mr. Anderson, the affected landowner, received notice of the public hearing via certified mail pursuant to Title 19 Sec. 709;
- 5. Pursuant to Title 19 Sec. 709, a public hearing notice was published in the Valley News on August 5, 2015; notices of the hearing were forwarded to the Town Clerk and Sharon Planning Commission. Additional notices were posted throughout Town.
- 6. The Selectmen's public hearing was held on August 17, 2015; the hearing was continued on September 9, 2015. A site visit was held prior to the public hearing.
- 7. During the site visit with affected landowner, it was noted there were two culverts on TH49, one being clearly outside the ROW to Chapel Hill Road, and one potentially within the ROW to Chapel Hill Road.
- 8. A second site visit and measurements confirmed the second culvert lies approximately 2 feet <u>within</u> the Town's Right-of-Way to Chapel Hill Road TH22. Therefore, the Town will continue to maintain the culvert, which currently exists as a 24" pipe but is scheduled for an upgrade. The first culvert will become the responsibility of the landowner to maintain after discontinuance.
- 9. Discontinuance of TH49 does not create a landlocked parcel, which would be in violation of the Sharon Subdivision regulations.



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

3. Approval of Minutes:

Mary Gavin made the motion to approve the minutes of August 17, 2015 with 1 amendment (change "September" to "August" p. 4 item 10). Second by Mary Gavin. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Warrant Review:

Selectmen reviewed and approved payroll and check warrants.

5. Public Comments:

Carol Langstaff met with Selectmen and asked the Board to put the funding request for the community nursing initiative in the upcoming town budget. After some discussion concerning past policies and procedures, Selectmen agreed to revisit the Board's community appropriations policy and revise if needed.

Margy Becker agreed to review statutes and consult with the VLCT concerning the Town's appropriate response to petitions for appropriations to community organizations.

It was acknowledged Randall Eastwood could not attend the meeting to further discuss the Selectboard's denial of his request for a blind drive sign on Rte. 132. Mary Gavin inquired whether driveway permits can be rescinded. Margy Becker is to research the answer to this question, and she will contact the VTrans Traffic Engineer and request a site visit.

6. Public Hearing Continuation: Discontinuance of TH49

FINAL ACTION

Chair Paul Haskell reconvened the public hearing on the question of whether or not to discontinue Town Highway 49, a short spur road at the end of TH22 (Chapel Hill Road).

Landowner Peter Anderson joined the public hearing. Discussions resumed concerning the proximity of a culvert on TH49 to the right-of-way to TH22. Margy Becker reported that she and Lister Galen Mudgett, in addition to the road crew , had taken measurements of the culvert layout with respect to the centerline of Chapel Hill Road. The consensus is the roadway culvert lies approximately two feet inside the right-ofway to Chapel Hill Road. This means the Town would continue to maintain the culvert, even if TH49 is discontinued. Tim Higgins stated the culvert is 24" in diameter and that the road crew would replace it with a larger culvert with a stone header.

Mary Gavin made the motion to discontinue Town Highway 49. Kevin Blakeman seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

Margy Becker will prepare the Selectboard's report and Order to Discontinue for proper filing with the Town and VT Agency of Transportation. Discussions regarding preparations for winter operations ensued. Tim Higgins noted that junk is now being deposited on Ogden Lane and is preventing highway trucks from turning around. The road has become impassable for fire trucks. He informed the Board the crew cannot plow the road as is. He recommended the Town consider discontinuing the road, which serves as a driveway. After further discussions the Selectboard directed the Administrative Assistant to contact the landowner via letter.

Residents will once again be notified of proper snow removal etiquette, which includes the longstanding statutory BAN on plowing across roads.

Tim Higgins confirmed the crew has finished applying hard pack the entire length of Fay Brook Road.

Tim Higgins recommended the Selectboard change the policy concerning the Town's participation in installation and maintenance of driveway culverts. The Administrative Assistant was asked to research policies of other towns.

The possibility of privatizing snow removal from Sharhart Road was discussed. A draft RFP will be prepared. Deb Jones will estimate costs for the Town to continue plowing.

Kevin Blakeman noted a washout on Quimby Mountain Road needs to be tended to, in addition to the hole in the pavement on Fay Brook Road. Tim Higgins stated there was no hole on Fay Brook Road until the trail was constructed from the school property. The Administrative Assistant was asked to research which entity to maintain the trail. The expenses of developing the trail were covered by a grant. Convene Public Haring

6. Public Hearing: Discontinuance of TH49

Chair Paul Haskell convened the public hearing on the question of whether or not to discontinue town highway 49, a short spur road at the end of TH22 (Chapel Hill Road).

Attendees: all who were in attendance at the Selectboard Meeting, inclusive of Galen $rac{1}{2}$ Mudgett and Peter Anderson.

It was noted TH22, Chapel Hill Road, ends just beyond the intersection with TH49 – the drive to a house owned by Peter and Ina Anderson. Margy Becker indicated the remaining ROW to TH22, which is visible and heavily rutted, was reclassified as a legal trail in 1960 per Selectboard records.

Mr. Anderson reported that two culverts on TH49 were observed during the course of the site visit. He stated the Town had been maintaining the upper culvert, which is located near the intersection of TH49 and TH22. This culvert now appears to collect surface water runoff from the discontinued portion of TH22. Not all runoff is shedding into the ditch. Hence in storm events water is over-topping the culvert.

There is a stream which runs along TH22 at this same location. Galen Mudgett indicated there was a possibility the stream is within the ROW to TH22.

Mr. Anderson then questioned whether the upper culvert is within the Town's ROW to TH22. The answer to this question is not known.

Paul Haskell stated that should TH49 be discontinued, and if the culvert is outside the ROW to TH22, the landowner will be responsible for culvert maintenance and/or replacements.

Mr. Anderson stated that the intersection is used as the turnaround for plow trucks. The Town of Norwich plows Chapel Hill. In return the Sharon road crew plows a portion of Mitchell Brook Road.

After brief discussions with Peter Anderson, Chair Paul Haskell announced the public hearing would be continued to September 9th, which is the date of the next Selectboard Meeting. The hearing will reconvene at 7PM.

7. <u>Changes to the Grand List:</u>

Galen Mudgett presented the Listers' request for modifications to the grand list. Said adjustments are related to changes in the Current Use Program. He noted that the grand list figure on which the tax rate had been based had already accounted for the 4 changes being presented, which include the following:

DST Corporation: Change Current Use Reduction from \$.00 to \$269,300. Change in Grand List Value from \$10,092.00 to \$7,399.00.

Josler, Richard: Change Current Use Reduction from \$0.00 to \$130,800. Change in Grand List Value from \$3,687.00 to \$2,379.00.

Putnam, John & Janine: Change Current Use Reduction from \$52,000 to \$136,800. Change in Grand List Value from \$930.00 to \$82.00

Sears, John & Janet: Change Current Use Reduction from \$34,600 to \$61,100 for. Change in Grand List Value from \$429.00 to \$164.00.

Mary Gavin made the motion to approve and sign the changes to the Grand List, which are a result of changes in current use values. Kevin Blakeman seconded. Motion carried 3-0-0.

8. <u>T-Mobile Request to add microwave dish and cabling to Telecommunications</u> <u>Tower on Baxter Mountain.</u>

Selectmen teleconferenced with Amber Debole who was representing T-Mobile. Ms. Debole reviewed the major facts concerning T-Mobile's "microwave project", which entails installation of a small microwave dish at 127 feet above ground level, plus cabling. This microwave dish will broadcast to a tower in Royalton, which will improve telecommunications.

Paul Haskell then indicated the Selectboard continues to be very concerned about the highly visible profile of the Baxter Mountain telecommunications tower. He further

10. Tri-Town Ambulance Service Study Group:

Mary Gavin reported on the schedule for a Tunbridge vote on matters pertaining to the formation of the tri-town service. Subsequent to the Tunbridge vote, there will be a meeting convened of all three Selectboards.

11. Hartford Ambulance Contract: FY16

Selectmen Mary Gavin noted an approximate 3% increase in the annual per capital fee charged the Town of Sharon for ambulance service to approximately 10 residents living in areas of Town not served by South Royalton Rescue (Kenyon Hill Road and Sharhart Road). The Town of Hartford currently charges \$35/capita, up from \$35/capita.

Margy Becker was asked to consult with the Town of Hartford regarding suggestions as to how the Town might recoup its expense for non-hospital related emergency response on I89. Hartford charges \$175 per incident. This rate is proposed to remain level for FY16. Selectmen agreed to revisit the proposed contract at its next regularly scheduled meeting on July 20th.

12. Discontinuance of Town Highway 49:

Selectmen agreed to the proposed schedule for public hearing and notifications for the discontinuance of a short Class 3 town highway which originates at the end of Chapel Hill Road and continues westerly for .050 miles. It is essentially a 'dooryard'. The landowners have requested the discontinuance, and the Board had agreed to initiate proceedings. The public hearing will be warned for August 17.


13. Health Officer Report:

Margy Becker reported she had accompanied Police Chief Bob Hull, who is Royalton's Health Officer, on a recent inspection. He has just completed his report, which includes observance of some violations of the rental housing or fire codes. But the violations are easily addressed. A health order is not recommended at this time. The property owner will be sent the inspection report and deadlines for compliance.

14. Sharing Health Officers:

Town health officer, Gary DeMara, has resigned. Margy Becker confirmed that though the statutes do not expressly mandate such action, the current Dept. of Health practice is to appoint the Chair of the Selectboard as default Health Officer. Paul Haskell agreed, noting that he has had to conduct several inspections over the years.

Towns may agree to share a health officer. Title 18 of the Vermont statutes provides for establishment of 'health districts'. According the recent correspondence with the VLCT and Dept. of Health, no such 'health district' exists in the State.

Good afternoon Margy,

I have reviewed the information in our files and found that TH-49 was added in 1972 and has the notation – "Old Town Hwy". It was added as a "traveled" highway, then became class 4 town highway during the Act 63 review process and was assigned class 4 in 1977. TH-49 was changed from class 4 to class 3 in 1982 as an error correction.

I am not seeing any specific documentation in the file or the Mileage Certificates that provide definitive evidence of laying out through the statutory process or through "dedication and acceptance", other than the note signed by the Selectboard Feb. 25, 1972.

This spur road appears on VTRANS maps after 1969......I see it on a 1973 MAP...but NOT on the 1969 map.

Do you by chance have any documentation? I would like a "description" if possible.

Otherwise, we will discontinue merely as shown on the map...."a dead-end Class 3 TH of .050 miles in length commencing at mile 2____ on TH22 (which originates in Norwich) off of Beaver Meadow Road.
