



REPORT OF THE SELECT BOARD FOR THE TOWN OF WEATHERSFIELD, VERMONT, Policy, Planning & Improve Proceedings to LAY OUT A TOWN HIGHWAY IN WEATHERSFIELD Development Division KNOWN AS "DRUMLIN ROAD"

AND THE SIMULTANEOUS DISCONTINUANCE OF TH 119

On the 21st day of May, 2012, A.D., we, the undersigned Select Board members of the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, a municipal corporation in Windsor County, State of Vermont, prepared a notice, in writing, of the proposed laying out of a public Town highway (known as "Drumlin Road") and the simultaneous discontinuance of Town Highway ("TH") 119 in the Town of Weathersfield, in accordance with the provisions of Title 19, Chapter 7, of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.

The highway to be laid out is described as follows:

Being a portion of the property conveyed to Ronald E. Brown and Sandra H. Brown, husband and wife, by Deed of the Horace Z. Childs Estate, dated March 23, 1990, and recorded March 27, 1990, in Book 76, Page 452, of the Weathersfield, Vermont, Land Records; and being a portion of the land and premises conveyed to Ronald E. Brown and Sandra H. Brown by Deed of the Horace Z. Childs Estate, dated May 27, 1990, and recorded in Book 86, Page 274, of the Weathersfield, Vermont, Land Records. The documents relinquishing said roadway to the Town are recorded in Book 107, Pages 281 and 282, and Book \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Land Records of the Town of Weathersfield.

The premises conveyed are shown on a survey drawing by Gary Rapanotti entitled "Road Layout Plan, Drumlin Road, Weathersfield, Vermont", project No. 04-594, dated Sept. 8, 2004 and which was recorded in the Weathersfield Land Records as Map #500 (330A) on 12/13/11.

This roadway is more commonly known as "Drumlin Road."

TH 119 is described as follows:

Survey Bill of a Pent Road ----

A survey of a Pent road laid out from Prescott Lawrences pasture through Martin Bryants land to the road near the dwelling house lately owned by Israel Warner in Weathersfield as follows to wit. Beginning half a rod west of the south west corner of the lot that Martin Bryant lives on then running east 30 deg. north 33 rods; north 30 deg. east 18 rods; east 40 deg. north 12 rods; north 28 deg. east 19 rods; north 13 deg. east 44 rods; north 6 deg. east 51 rods to the Road near the Widow Warner's House Six gates or convenient bars is hereby permitted across said road --

Recorded in Volume 3, Page 221 of the Town Proceedings.

In a public notice dated August 30, 2011, posted at the Weathersfield Town Clerk's office and the U.S. Post Offices in Ascutney and Perkinsville, and published in

the newspaper of record (The Valley News) for the Town on October 3, 2011, stated that the Select Board would meet at 6:30 P.M., on the eighteenth day of October, 2011, at the site of the proposed Town highway, to consider laying out an existing private roadway, the so-called Drumlin Road, as a Town highway and simultaneously discontinue TH 119.

they being the owners of the land abutting the said highway to be laid out. A copy of the notice was also sent to the Chair of the Weathersfield Planning Commission.

At 6:30 P.M., on Tuesday, October 18, 2011, the Select Board met at the intersection of Town Highway 25, Maple Street, and the so-called Drumlin Road for the purpose of examining the premises. Present were Select Board Chairperson David Fuller and Select Board members Gordon Eglintine, Norman John Arrison, Richard Clattenburg, and Dan Boyer. Also present was Zoning Administrator deForest Bearse.

The public hearing was convened at 7:00 PM, on October 18, 2011, at the West Weathersfield Fire Department, at 7259 Route 131, to hear the parties interested. Present were Select Board Chairperson David Fuller and Select Board members Gordon Eglintine, Norman John Arrison, Richard Clattenburg, and Dan Boyer. Also present were Jim Mullen (Town Manager), Richard Brown (Police Chief), deForest Bearse (Zoning Administrator), Lisa Sade, Edith Stillson, Aleta Fenny-Brosseau, Paul Brosseau, Todd Hindinger, Alan Hudson, Michael Todd, Peter Korbet, Ian Lord, Sandy Brown, Ron Brown, Martha Cass Giammatteo, Paul Giammatteo, Thomas Villars, Alasdair Crawford, and David Moore.

After the Select Board's examination of the premises, and discussing the same with those parties present, the following facts relative to the laying out of Drumlin Road were determined:

1. On October 1<sup>st</sup>, 1992, Ronald E. and Sandra H. Brown were issued a land use permit, No. 2S0818-3, to create an eleven lot subdivision off Maple Street in Perkinsville, Vermont. This

permit is recorded at Book 83, Pages 132 through 136, inclusive, in the Weathersfield Town Land Records.

2. Condition No. 11, of said permit, states, in part:

The Homeowners' Association shall be responsible for necessary maintenance of the stormwater management system and the project road until such time as they may be taken over by the Town.

- 3. On February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2000, Ronald E. and Sandra H. Brown executed a Quit Claim Deed to the Town of Weathersfield, assigning fee simple ownership of a strip of land, fifty feet wide containing the first portion of the so-called Drumlin Road to the Town. This is recorded at Book 107, Pages 281 and 282, of the Weathersfield Town Land Records.
- 4. On May 14, 2012, Ronald E. and Sandra H. Brown executed a Quit Claim Deed conveying ownership of the entire 50 feet wide right-of-way from Maple Street to the terminus at a cul-de-sac as shown on Rapanotti survey no. 04-594 dated Sept. 8, 2004 and entitled "Drumlin Road," and which was recorded in the Weathersfield Land Records as Map #500 (330A), on 12/13/11. The deed is recorded at Book \_\_\_\_\_, Pages of the Weathersfield Land Records.
- 5. The roadway is gravel surfaced.
- 6. During construction, the Town's Highway Superintendent inspected the roadway, and determined that it complies with Town standards.
- 7. The roadway serves a low density residential subdivision, with eleven lots, with a 12<sup>th</sup> lot accessed via a private right-of-way off of the roadway in the former gravel pit area.
- 8. The roadway ends in a reclaimed gravel pit, once leased and operated by the Town of Weathersfield.
- 9. Based upon the Board's on-site observations, the roadway is currently accessible to emergency vehicles.
- 10. The roadway is fairly level with no steep grades.
- 11. There are two private roads connecting with this roadway, Pine Pitch Road which serves three properties, and Grouse Lane, which serves one lot.
- 12. There is a town-owned dry hydrant near the end of the road.
- 13. The roadway is marked with suitable monuments.

The facts relative to TH #119 are as follow:

1. TH 119 was laid out by the Town in 1820 as a pent road.

- 2. TH 119 was added to the Town's highway map in February 2010.
- 3. The so-called "Drumlin Road" was laid out roughly coincidental with the path of TH 119, unbeknownst to the developer.
- 4. TH 119 is approximately 400 feet longer than the layout of the Drumlin Road.
- 5. No one uses the 400-ft. unused segment of TH 119 to access their property.

After considering the laying out of a Town highway and the discontinuance of TH 119, and after hearing the parties interested, we find that:

- A. The convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Weathersfield requires that the so-called "Drumlin Road" be laid out as a Town highway; and
- B. The public good of the inhabitants of the Town of Weathersfield requires that the so-called "Drumlin Road" be laid out as a Town highway; and
- C. The necessity of the inhabitants of the Town of Weathersfield requires that the so-called "Drumlin Road" be laid out as a Town highway.
- D. The convenience, public good, and necessity of the Town of Weathersfield require the discontinuance of TH 119.

Now, therefore, we order that the private roadway now known as Drumlin Road be laid out as a Town highway, and TH 119 be discontinued. Upon full compliance with the terms of the condition, preceding, the Town of Weathersfield will accept the roadway as a Town highway, and maintain the roadway as such.







# Weathersfield Select Board Minutes May 21, 2012

- 1. Call to Order: Mr. Boyer called the Weathersfield Select Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at Martin Memorial Hall.
- 2. Comments from Citizens and Select Board: Mrs. Slade announced the Weathersfield Veterans Memorial Committee will be having their sixth annual walk-a-thon on Saturday June 2nd and encouraged participation and/or sponsorship. She also mentioned there will be a small ceremony at the Perkinsville Green on Monday in honor of Memorial Day.
- 3. Review Minutes from Previous Meeting(s): Mr. Arrison made the motion to approve the minutes dated May 7, 2012, Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Corrections were noted. Motion carried 4 - 0 with one abstention.

Mr. Arrison made the motion to approve the minutes dated April 16, 2012. Mr. Fuller seconded the motion which passed 3-0 with two abstentions.

#### 4. Zoning

A. Public Hearing/Height Limitations: Mr. Boyer opened the Public Hearing. Mrs. Bearse said this proposed change is on height limitations with the maximum building height remaining at 35'. The change is to clear up definitions and makes it more clear on how the height is determined. Mr. Arrison asked if there were any intentions of looking at the maximum height limit. Mrs. Bearse said yes.

Mr. Boyer closed the Public Hearing.

Mr. Todd made the motion to adopt the proposed amendment to section 4.3.2(a) - (g) Section 6.12 Height Limitations Section 8 Definitions. Mr. Arrison seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

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- B. Receive Zoning Bylaw Amendments (Section 7.23 Self-Storage Facility et al) and set date for Public Hearing: Mr. Todd made the motion to hold a Public Hearing on Section 7.23 Self Storage Facility on June 18, 2012 at the Highway Garage. Mr. Arrison seconded the motion which passed without dissent.
- 5. Martin Memorial Hall Trustees Update: Mrs. Daniels said HB Energy Solutions has worked on the drainage in the slop sink which is located in the furnace room so it now drains properly. She said they also installed a de-humidifier (in the wall) that will drain automatically. Lastly, they installed a voltage thermostat on the heater that is in the kitchen so when the kitchen is being used it won't get so hot in there. She said they have no idea at this time how that heater was controlled but this should help the extreme heat when the kitchen is being used.

Mrs. Daniels said the sump pump isn't up to code and it needs to be vented. She said this work will probably cost a couple thousand dollars so it is something the Board should consider sending out to bid. The consensus of the Board was to solicit proposals. Mrs. Daniels asked the Board to also consider installing fans and looking at the ventilation in the upstairs office area. Mr. Fuller made the motion to have the Town Manager spend up to \$1,000 to seek solutions on the heating and ventilation system in the office area, Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Mrs. Daniels noted the Trustees of Martin Hall have used rental monies for the recent repairs down stairs as well as the plantings outside. Motion carried unanimously.

# 6. Bids/Contracts/Grants/Requests for Proposals

- A. Three Dry Hydrant Grants Received: Mr. Mullen said we have received \$2,500 for Perkins Hill Road dry hydrant, have been reimbursed \$960 for the repair on the Perkinsville hydrant that was damaged by Irene, and received \$7,000 to improve the dry hydrant at Weathersfield Inn. He said that he has applied to raise the Weathersfield Inn grant to \$10,000 in order to install a second dry hydrant at the Weathersfield Inn. He said there is a 50% match. It was noted there is about \$30,000 in the budget for hydrants. Mr. Mullen said since there are wetlands in the area a "wetlands" person will be looking at the site next week.
- B. Replace Air Compressor in Highway Garage: Mr. Arrison made the motion to approve the purchase of a new air compressor for the highway garage for the purchase price of \$6,379. Mr. Clattenburg seconded the motion. Mr. Hazeltine said this compressor would take care of most of the sand blasting needs. Mr. Todd noted this type of air compressor is extremely expensive to repair. Motion carried unanimously.
- C. Bank-run Gravel Purchase Option: Mr. Boyer said Carl Wyman has bank run gravel at his property at the intersection of Route 106 and 131 and has offered to sell it to the Town for \$6.00 per yard. Mr. Hazeltine said he has looked at it and feels there are too many large rocks in it to use as bank run gravel but it could be used for other projects. He said to truck it to the highway garage you would have to add \$2 \$3 per yard. Mr. Fuller said there is no sense in trucking it to the highway garage, we should ask Mr. Wyman if we can just leave it there and truck it from there directly to the job site.

Mrs. Slade asked what limit of insurance the Town was requiring and mentioned that a normal person would have a hard time providing the Town with a Certificate of Insurance for the purpose of setting off fireworks. Mr. Mullen said the Town did not need a certificate they just needed to know that the person doing the fireworks has liability insurance. There is no specific limit of coverage was required. Motion carried unanimously




