A. Review CVPS Plan for Pole Replacement

There is a plan for pole replacement in the Village submitted by CVPS. Mr. Swanson asked the Board to wait until the next meeting for discussion.

B. Name for Ancient Road to be Added to the Map

Mr. Swanson presented a resolution relating to the Ancient Road 1V to be added to the map. A road name was discussed. The Board favored Doubleday Way.

There was mention of the possibility of whether the one way direction of the road should be discussed further. It was agreed the road does not get a lot of use and that discussion can be at another time.

On a motion of Mr. Miller, second Mrs. Compton, the Board of Village Trustees voted to sign the resolution to add Doubleday Way to the Village road map. Motion approved.

C. Consider Listing Parking lot on State Park 'n Ride Directory

Sustainable Woodstock has requested listing the Municipal Lot on Pleasant Street on a State Park 'n' Ride Directory.

Mrs. Compton is concerned about Alsup property discussion earlier, and expressed her concern for the need of a lot more delineation and parking designation than currently exists. This has brought about the concern that people could be parking on private property. Sheadded this will require a lot of monitoring by village authorities

It was agreed that the municipal lot off Pleasant Street is used a lot, and most don't really see a problem as is. There is no overnight parking allowed, as the east end is developed more, there is additional use. Now that the WASP is open more regularly and use has increased, there should be more attention given to making it look like a organized parking lot,

Mrs. Compton added that there is a space that could have a river park without not moving the snow dump because it is used for snow in winter and park use would be during summer months.

Trustees agree to look at a plan and from Sustainable Woodstock and review possibilities. They agreed to hold off on allowing this lot to be listed in the park n ride for a variety of reasons including concern about adjacent landowners.

Mr. Swanson will request a plan from the individual who has contacted him about this issue.
