Dear Mr. Rook:

We are returning herewith the single copy received of your 1960 Road Mileage Certificates.

Title 19, V.S.A., Section 15 states, "The selectmen of each town, with the assistance of a representative of the State Highway Board shall measure the travelled highways, at least once every ten years, not including pent roads and trails." This was done in 1959 by Mr. Rook, Selectman and Mr. Cakes, Road Commissioner, with Mr. Cookson of this office. This measurement showed 1.06 miles not travelled and 0.09 mile discontinued.

Title 19, V.S.A., Section 15, further states, "Annually, on or before March 15, the selectmen shall file with the Town Clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all highways, including all new highways built, and all highways discontinued, during the year previous thereto, not including pent roads and trails." You have indicated no change on your certificates, which seems to be at variance with the remeasurement.

We have enclosed a copy of the letter and explanation sheet, dated February 16, 1960, regarding the additions, subtractions and revisions resulting from the 1959 remeasurement, in the Town of Concord, noting that none of these changes were incorporated on the Road Mileage Certificate recently submitted to this office.

It is possible that you did not want to make all of the additions as listed, but we respectfully suggest that some of the larger ones would add materially to your Town Highway mileage. We refer to highways such as T-13, T-11 and T-23 as listed on the explanation sheet.

In any event, highways not travelled and discontinued highways should be deducted from your Town Highway mileage.

We would appreciate the return of one white and one yellow copy of these mileage certificates, when they are completed.
