

> 1955 the Potash Bay section of Lake Street was reconstructed as the first road (relocated in 1940) was in the lake. Town of Addison Land Records Vol. 31, pages 211, 260-261, & 263. Map Cabinet Section K.

1973 the Potash Bay Section of Lake Street was reconstructed as the road was also sliding in the lake. Both the north end and the south end of the old road were kept by the town. It was decided to keep the end near Calvin Dow's to prevent development of a non-conforming lot. The southern end was kept for access to the lake. Title to the old road reverted to the owners of the adjoining lands by Vt. Statute.

Dear Mr. Buskey,

This is in response to a letter dated September 18 from Town Clerk Jane Grace, informing us that the Selectboard had reviewed our year 2001 map and had noted revisions needed.

- 1) In response, we are updating the pavement / surface changes and bridge information as noted on the marked-up map sent in with Town Clerk's letter.
- 2) Your revisions also include changing status of: Town Hwy 31 from class 3 to class 4 Town Hwy 33 from class 4 to discontinued

Before we make these changes, we would appreciate a copy of Selectboard's proceedings in making these classification changes. Our previous maps and records show the following:

- → TH 31 has been a class 3 Highway dating back to at least 1973 and state aid to Addison has included its mileage.
- → TH 33 (Potash Bay Rd) has had a .16 mile section of class 4 "untravelled" portion since 1982. Although a class 4 road may be closed or impassable to vehicular traffic, town right of way remains. If the road is actually "discontinued", right of way is generally understood to be conveyed to adjacent property owners.

Procedures for classification changes are outlined in Title 19, chapter 7 of the Vermont statutes.

We appreciate towns keeping us updated on the accuracy of the town highway maps. Thank you for your correspondence. Feel free to call if you wish to discuss any of these matters.

This is in response to your letter dated December 20. Thank you for sending the information.

We are still wary of recognizing TH 31 as being officially a class 4 road.

The documents for TH 33 indicate that the Select Board intended 'closed' to mean discontinued or thrown up.

TH 31

The copies of documents you sent show that Selectmen added this as a Town Highway in 1972. This predates the Class 3 / Class 4 classification process that the Legislature put into effect in 1973. Selectmen Briggs, Moorby, Atherton and Clerk Carpenter signed Mileage Certificate in 1972 attesting to TH 31 being a traveled Town Highway. When the Class 3 process went into effect the next year, travelable roads became Class 3.

I believe the Selectmen have 3 choices if they wish for this road to not be marked as an open and maintained road.

- 1. Selectmen can simply declare that road is not maintained by town. We will then show it as untraveled on town map. But legally the road might remain class 3.
- 2. Submit documents to us showing that Select Board already went through the process of legally reclassifying this road to class 4.
- 3. Selectmen can start the process as outlined in VSA Title 19 Chapter 7 to reclassify a town highway.

TH 33 (Potash Bay Rd)

The .16 mile section currently shown as Class 4 will be shown as discontinued on this year's map.

ADDISON MEETING OF THE SELECTBOARD

The Selectboard for the Town of Addison met January 2, 2002 at 6:30 pm at the Addison Town Clerk's Office. Present were Kim Provencher, Alden Harwood, Tim Buskey, Roger Waterman, Bryan Nolan, Larry Blacklock, Ric Kadour and Richard Thurber.

Tim gave the board the town's annual 2002 Certificate of Highway Mileage to be reviewed, completed and signed from the Agency of Transportation in order to qualify for highway state aid. Jane included information about TH33 (0.160) Potash Bay. This section was thrown up by the town and should be deleted from Class 4 status. She also included information about TH31 (0.220) portion of Gage Rd. which is shown as Class 3 status. The question is should this go to Class 4 status.

The board reviewed the file on TH33 which concurred that this portion of Potash Bay Road was reverted back to abutting landowners by Vt. Statute. The file shows that the end by the Calvin Dow property was kept by the town in order to not create a non-conforming lot and the end by the Moorby farm was kept for access to the lake.

The board reviewed the file on the 0.220 portion of Gage Road. The 1972 Certificate of Highway Mileage does not show what class this portion of Gage Road is. Bryan said maps he has back to 1970 show it listed as Class 4, but the 1970 map shows it as a Class 3 road. Bryan said Quennie told him they never plowed it, but have mowed it and have been receiving Class 3 mileage money for it. He said it is the same as the Farr Cross Road, but if someone built a house on the end, it would have to be plowed. Bryan determined if it was designated a Class 4 road, the town would lose \$280 a year aid. Alden said he thought this looked like something that could be ignored.

Tim asked for a motion to sign the Certificate of Highway Mileage deleting TH33 Potash Bay (0.160) mileage and leaving TH31 (0.220) portion of Gage Road as is. This was moved by Roger and seconded by Alden. All were in favor.

Tim reviewed a letter from Megan Peace, Claims Representative, with Massamont Insurance Agency, the town's liability insurance carrier, stating that there is no negligence or liability to rest with the town regarding the Harry Veldman claim when a tree fell on his truck on Nortontown Road. Her letter stated that the tree is actually on land owned by the State of Vermont, Fish & Wildlife Department.

Bryan told the board that he has received notice that his health insurance is going up. He said it is going up \$107.00 a month. He said it takes effect in February and wanted to let the board know prior to preparing the budget.

Bryan told the board he is working on figures for Country Club
