19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

RECLASSIFICATION FROM CLASS 3 TO CLASS 2 OF A PORTION OF LAKE STREET BY THE SELECTBOARDS OF BRIDPORT AND SHOREHAM

Pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Vermont including but not limited to Sections 790, 792, 708, 709, 710, and 711 of Title 19 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, the respective Selectboards of the Towns of Bridport and Shoreham, Vermont, have taken the following actions:

Prior to and on March 8, 2010, the Bridport Selectboard proposed and prior to and on March 10, 2010, the Shoreham Selectboard proposed --- that the portion of the public highway known as Lake Street from its northerly end at its intersection with Vermont Route No. 125 in Bridport running generally southerly through Bridport and then through Shoreham to its intersection with the public highway known as Lapham Bay Road, which is already a Class 2 Town Highway, in Shoreham, be reclassified from Class 3 to Class 2. Said portion is about 5.9 miles long in Bridport and about 4/10ths of a mile long in Shoreham.

The Bridport Selectboard on March 8, 2010, and the Shoreham Selectboard on March 10, 2010, --- set forth that on Tuesday, April 27, 2010, at 6:00 o'clock in the evening, each respective Selectboard would hold a meeting at Lake Street where it crosses the Bridport-Shoreham Town Line for the purpose of consideration of the above matter, including the holding of a hearing for the purpose of proceeding to examine the premises that would be affected and to hear from any persons interested in this matter, including any claims for damages. Attached as Exhibit--A is a copy of the BRIDPORT AND SHOREHAM ROAD NOTICE respectively dated March 8 and 10, 2010, on behalf of the Selectboards. By March 22, 2010, the Bridport Selectboard caused a copy of said BRIDPORT AND SHOREHAM ROAD NOTICE to be posted at the Bridport Town Clerk's Office and in two other public places in the Town of Bridport. By March 22, 2010, the Shoreham Selectboard caused a copy of said BRIDPORT AND SHOREHAM ROAD NOTICE to be posted at the Shoreham Town Clerk's Office and in two other public places in the Town of Shoreham. Attached as Exhibit--B is a copy of said BRIDPORT AND SHOREHAM ROAD NOTICE as published in the Addison Independent's April 8, 2010, issue.

On March 17, 2010, the Bridport Selectboard caused additional legal notice of this matter in the form of a copy of the attached Exhibit--C dated March 16, 2010, to be sent by certified mail to each of those shown with respective addresses (being their respective official residence insofar as individual persons and the best respective address known to the Town insofar as other entities) in the attached Exhibit--D as persons understood to be owning or interested in lands through which Lake Street passes or abuts in the Town of Bridport. The Bridport Selectboard also gave a copy of the notice/form of the attached Exhibit--C to the Bridport Planning Commission.

On March 19, 2010, the Shoreham Selectboard caused additional legal notice of this matter in the form of a copy of the attached Exhibit--E dated March 17, 2010, to be sent by certified mail to each of those shown with respective addresses (being their respective official residence insofar as individual persons and the best respective address known to the Town insofar as other entities) in the attached Exhibit--F as persons understood to be owning or interested in lands through which

Lake Street passes or abuts in the Town of Shoreham, also including the Shoreham Planning Commission.

On Tuesday, April 27, 2010, at 6:00 o'clock in the evening near and within sight of the appointed location at Lake Street where it crosses the Bridport-Shoreham Town Line, the Bridport Selectboard held a meeting and the Shoreham Selectboard held a meeting, which meetings included a hearing for the aforesaid purposes and both Selectboards examined the affected premises. Attending were Bridport Selectboard members: Stephen Huestis, Margaret Sunderland, and Arthur Provencher. Attending were Shoreham Selectboard members: Paul Saenger, Karen Shackett, Marthe Fisher, Steve Goodrich and Robert Warren. Also attending were: David A. Bronson - attorney for the Town of Bridport, Amy Douglas - Shoreham Town Clerk, Duane Torrey, James Inglis, Richard Swinyer and Julie Swinyer.

Stephen Huestis opened the discussion with an explanation of the reason for holding the hearing in this matter.

---It was pointed out Section 302 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated provides as follows:

"Class 2 town highways are those town highways selected as the most important highways in each town. As far as practicable they shall be selected with the purposes of securing trunk lines of improved highways from town to town and to places which by their nature have more than normal amount of traffic."

"Class 3 town highways are all traveled town highways other than class 1 or 2 highways."

All of the affected portion of Lake Street is paved except a small part at the southern end of such portion in Shoreham. The affected portion of Lake Street connects Vermont Route 125 with Lapham Bay Road, which is already a Class 2 Town Highway, that runs to Vermont Route 22A. With Lapham Bay Road, this reclassification of Lake Street would provide a Class 2 Town Highways roads connection between Vermont Route 125 and Vermont Route 22A serving various lands that include lands along Lake Champlain with many seasonal and year-round residences thereon. It also serves a State so-called fishing access area.

- ---It is expected each Town would receive more State of Vermont money for use in the care of this portion of Lake Street as a Class 2 Town Highway than is received with its present Class 3 Town Highway status.
- ---No one in attendance made any claim for damages or otherwise against the proposal and neither the Bridport Selectboard nor the Shoreham Selectboard has otherwise received any notice of anyone making any claim for damages or otherwise against the proposal. Since the proposed reclassification actually raises the importance and status of this portion of Lake Street and does not propose to lower standards of its care or condition, there was no known reason expressed as to why anyone would have any claim for damages.
- ---A copy of the April 16, 2010, Letter from Mike Fraysier as Vermont Agency of Natural Resources Lands Director to the Bridport and Shoreham Selectboards was presented, a copy of which Letter is attached as Exhibit--G. Since what is proposed

does not involve any discontinuance of any portion of a town highway, the issue of trail status does not come up.

FINDINGS AND ORDER

Concerning the proposed reclassification, the Bridport Selectboard and Shoreham Selectboard find as follows:

THAT said portion of Lake Street is mostly paved and serves, with Lapham Bay Road, as a trunk line highways connection between Vermont Route 125 and Vermont Route 22A serving various lands that include lands along Lake Champlain with many seasonal and year-round residences thereon.

THAT it is expected each Town would receive more State of Vermont money for use in the care thereof as a Class 2 Town Highway than is received with its present Class 3 Town Highway status.

THAT no person will be damaged thereby.

THEREFORE, insofar as the Towns of Bridport and Shoreham are concerned, the Bridport Selectboard and Shoreham Selectboard have decided that the public good, necessity and convenience of the respective inhabitants of said Towns require the proposed reclassification be done; and

- ---the Bridport Selectboard ORDERS the portion of Lake Street located in Bridport from its intersection with Vermont Route No. 125 running generally southerly through Bridport to the Town of Shoreham be reclassified as a Class 2 Town Highway; and
- ---the Shoreham Selectboard ORDERS the portion of Lake Street located in Shoreham running from the Town of Bridport generally southerly to its intersection with Lapham Bay Road be reclassified as a Class 2 Town Highway.




