
19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection


§ 305. Measurement and inspection


- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.







TH-88 Original mileage from 1992 change should have been ~0.70 mi (not 0.73)

The extension ROW, according to survey provided, overlaps the end of the original ROW by ~208', albeit with a slight shift in alignment. Although the extension survey indicates 1586.95' (0.30 mi), we should only add the mileage that extends beyond the original right of way (0.26 mi). Additionally, the original mileage of TH-88, according to the survey map, should have been 0.70 mi instead of 0.73 mi, so we've processed the extension of TH-88 as +0.23 mi CL3 TH-88, reflecting only the portion beyond the original right of way and adjusting the measure of the original right of way.

I have to close out the Mileage Certificate changes, so I made a few assumptions and guesses while processing those changes. Can you review my list of adjustments below and see if If any are incorrect? I need to know sooner rather than later so that I can clearly document what might need to be added to next year's certificate while it's still fresh in my mind. I've also attached an Excel Table that summarizes the mileage added and subtracted for each TH with changes, with the before and after totals that will be shown on the Mileage Certificate. I believe all of the changes I haven't discussed below were processed without any adjustments.

Also, can you confirm that you've received this information and know that these updates are being added to the 2020 Certificate, and note whether any of my assumptions are incorrect so that they can be addressed on next year's

TH-17

From the Selectboard's Return documentation, I see that TH-17 now ends at a plow turnaround near Sighs Dr. I've pasted an image of that intersection below, and indicated with a red arrow what I think might be a plow turnaround area, and a red line where the road now ends. The measure to that location is 0.33 mi as described in the Selectboard's Return document, but I'd like to verify the location with a landmark too. Can you confirm that this is where TH-17 now ends?

CORRECT - that is the turnaround area (to the northeast).

The TH-17 mileage we had on record was 0.50 mi instead of the measured length of 0.48 mi. In order to have the remaining TH-17 measure 0.33 mi, we will need to subtract 0.17 mi from the mileage total instead of 0.15 mi (800 ft) as described in the Selectboard's Return. We're not saying that more than 0.15 mi was discontinued, but that we need to subtract 0.17 in order to accurately represent the remaining roadway, which would make this year's change a combination of the discontinuance and a remeasurement. Therefore I think the change for TH-17 should be:

-0.17 mi CL3 TH-17 (Bornemann Rd) discontinuance and remeasurement

AGREE - working with the old mileages from the old process of drive by so please make the corrections that match aerial/landmarks.

TH-88

I also realized that the previous VTrans mileage for TH-88 was probably incorrect. The survey map that was provided with this year's certificate indicates where TH-88 ended previously, as well as the layout of the new extension. My inference from that survey is that the previous mileage should have been ~0.70 mi instead of 0.73 mi. I can't confirm this because the survey you provided only has two pages: the first and last sections of TH-88. Also, the survey of the new loop indicates that a small portion of essentially overlaps the pre-existing right of way (by ~208' or 0.04 mi). Based on map measures, the new total comes out to be 0.96 mi. Does that sound right to you? For now I'm going to assume that, and we can undo any errors I might have made on the next Certificate.

Yes, 0.96 miles if the entre TH88 and once around the loop (5,065 feet or 0.958mi).

When all is said and done, we had 0.73 mi assigned to TH-88, and it currently appears to be 0.96 mi, so I think the appropriate change should be:

+0.23 mi CL3 TH-88 (Sterling View Rd) extended and remeasured

TH39 and TH-92

I added these changes to the Certificate, as described in my email to you on March 12.

-0.05 mi CL3 TH-39, discontinued in 1994

-0.03 mi CL4 TH-39, discontinued in 1994

+0.06 mi CL3 TH-39 (Mead Rd) remeasured



TH-71

I strictly assumed 450' of Depot St to be class 3, even though that appears to be in the middle of the parking area. We only had a total of 0.14 mi (including the Village mileage) associated with TH-71 before the discontinuance, so even if 0.09 mi was actually reclassified, I will only be transferring 0.06 mi from class 3 to class 4 to ensure that the class 3 mileage matches the value you gave me. It's the class 3 mileage that is most important, which is why I used that

measure, though I think there is a possibility that both the class 3 and class 4 measures are off. We can confer about how to fix this later. The change on the Certificate is therefore written:

0.06 mi CL3 TH-71 (Depot Street Ext) reclassified to CL4

I apologize for not getting this information to you sooner! It has been a rather chaotic month.

Hi Ron,

I'm finally getting back to the Hyde Park Certificate, and I do have some questions about Depot Street Extension (TH-71):


The part that will remain class 3 is described as being (to paraphrase) the first 450' starting from TH-2. You also describe the class 4 section as beginning at the parking lot for the Lamoille Valley Rail Trail. Given that the measures on the most recent Town Highway Map are not very precise, I wanted to make sure I was pinpointing the location where TH-71 changes from class 3 to class 4.

First, I want to clarify some "internal" mileage adjustments that I made to more proportionately allocate the existing 0.14 mi in our records for TH-71 across the segments:


The most recent (2017) Town highway map ("BEFORE", see excerpt below) had 0.03 mi in the Village (in red) and 0.11 mi in the Town. Because the two are not incorporated separately for highways, I shifted 0.01 mi from the Village and added it to the Town segment between TH-70 and TH-71 (highlighted in the BEFORE excerpt). Now that segment has a 0.02 mi label, as it had 0.01 mi associated with it when mapped in 2017 (even though it didn't have its own mileage label, because the 0.01 was included in the 0.10 mileage label. In other words, TH-71 should have had two labels on the 2017 map (0.09 mi and 0.01 mi) west of its intersection with TH-90 on the 2017 map, and my recent re-allocation of mileage shifted 0.01 mi from the Village to the segment between TH-70 and TH-70. If that doesn't make sense, feel free to give me a call (but note that my number has changed again).

Another measurement issue is that the entire length of TH-71, based on our road centerline data extending to the property line of 184 Depot Street Extension, is actually closer to 0.17 mi instead of 0.14 mi. Does that mean we've had the incorrect mileage for this road, or that it previously ended before the property line? Our 1985 inventory mentions that it ends at 0.15 mi at the warehouse (the stone foundation on the VTrans survey of the Depot), just to add another possibility.





NOW: In our data before processing this year's changes:



Now, regarding pinpointing the class 3-4 transition:

If you refer to the attached map, I've added a black arrow indicating the point along TH-71 that is approximately 450' from the centerline of TH-2. Given that 450' = 0.085 mi, and if we round to the nearest 0.01 mi to make it 0.09 mi class 3, then there is only 0.05 mi remaining to change to class 4 in our records. So, I'm looking to you to help me understand which measures and locations are most certain before figuring out how to handle this.

Hi Ron,

Wow, that Selectboard's Return you sent today is *THE* missing link! It describes the discontinuance (TH-39), and it clarifies that the laying out (of TH-92) includes the entire right of way as surveyed.

So, what that means is that TH-92 should be longer than 0.09 mi as I suspected... A "remeasurement" will bring it up to 0.15 mi. Then the combined length of TH-39 and TH-92 will be 0.37 mi as you expected.

In other words, after everything with Mead Rd is "fixed"...

0.22 mi TH-39 + 0.15 mi TH-92 = 0.37 mi Mead Rd

The "fix" is therefore...

-0.05 mi CL3 TH-39, discontinued in 1994

-0.03 mi CL4 TH-39, discontinued in 1994

+0.06 mi CL3 TH-39 (Mead Rd) remeasured

You can see these changes in red on the attached map. And keeping both numbers 39 and 92 will make it a lot easier to track changes (and corrections) back through our records.

I haven't looked at Hyde Park's Mileage Certificate yet to see whether these changes are already listed or not... but let me know if that is what you expected for those two highways, and I'll make sure they are clear on the Certificate.

OK more info on this road.

Mead Road is mapped (General Highway Map) as TH39 (0.27 mi - two segments 0.22 and 0.05) and TH92 (0.09 mi) totaling 0.36 miles.

Per the attached Selectboard's Return and from Slide 45 used in the Return, Mead Road is actually 0.37 miles (1,955 feet - measured on aerial images) and The "stub" of TH39 C4 0.03 & TH39 C3 0.05 miles are both discontinued because the Selectboard described the discontinuance as beginning at the intersection of the new and old road (Mead Road extension in 1994).

Not sure why the General Highway Map was not updated in 1994 but the GHM should match the tax map (attached).

TH39 should be on the General Highway Map as TH39 being 0.37 miles in length (1,955 feet).

Keeping two numbers (39 & 92) might be necessary since deeds probably exist at this point using TH92.

Hi Kerry ~

Attached is TH39 on the 2017 current General Highway Map. I spoke with the landowner today that worked with the Selectboard in 1994 for the extension of TH39 (Mead Road).

Unfortunately, the discontinuance of a short section of TH39 (the former end of the road) was not recorded properly with VTrans (that's how it appears at this point), so as of today there still remains the "stub" off the east side of Mead Road which should not be there.

I think the only way to resolve this is to have the Selectboard re-do the formal TH discontinuance process for this stub and they would also need to confirm the existing road is within the survey that exists - via an as-built survey (the original extension from 1994 is recorded in Slide 45 - shows the extension and stub) but I have no record of the road actually being constructed within the surveyed ROW.

Do you agree or do you see another way to correct the General Highway Map to show existing conditions (where the town currently maintaining is depicted on the town tax map - attached).

Hi Johnathan ~

The Selectboard is in the process of researching a number of existing town highways and deciding which ones to discontinue, reclassify, or, if it is now privately owned but publicly maintained, deciding if the Town should accept it officially as a new town highway.

To push that effort along, they have agreed to hire a staff person to assist in the legal research. A couple of years ago, someone from your office asked about "Mead Road" and town highway #'s 39 & 92. I don't think we ever helped clarify that situation - do you still have it as an unresolved map/acceptance issue that I could spend some time on?

Also, we have a road (TH#69 - Orchard Terrace) that our recent preliminary deed & survey research is showing as a private road (no mention of public ROW or any documents laying it out as a town highway). Do you have any records on this road and when it might have been added to the General Highway Map for the Village of Hyde Park?





On their own motion, on July 27, 1994, the Selectboard for the Town of Hyde Park appointed September 7, 1994 at 6:30 P.M. for inspection of the site of a proposed highway and the discontinuance of a part of a highway and 7:00 P.M. at the Town Offices of the Town of Hyde Park, Vermont, as the time and place where they would hear persons interested in the laying out of a town highway and for the discontinuance of a part of Town Highway No. 39. The highway to be laid out is described as follows:

Being a part of the same land and premises conveyed to Robert W. Mead and Donna L. Mead by the warranty deed of Kenneth E. Mead and Jennie M. Mead dated February 14, 1985 and recorded in Book 51 at Pages 609-610 of the Hyde Park Land Records. Being a strip of land 50 feet in width and being 25 feet on each side of the centerline depicted on a survey map entitled "Robert and Donna Mead, 5 Lot Subdivision, Hyde Park, Vermont," dated November, 1992 and filed in Map Book 3 at Page 122 of the Hyde Park Land Records.

The part of Town Highway 39 that is to be discontinued is described as follows:

Being that part of Town Highway #39 that is northerly of the intersection with the new highway referenced above which commences at a point that is 218 feet northeasterly of the southerly corner of the property of Robert W. Mead and Donna L. Mead and the easterly corner of the Jennie Mead property as depicted on the above-referenced survey map. The part of Town Highway #37 to be discontinued is from the point referenced above to the so-called Robert and Donna Mead "Homeplace".

LAYING OUT OF A NEW TOWN HIGHWAY

At the time and place set forth in the notice, the Selectboard took testimony from Robert Mead, Donna Mead and David Potter. The property owners, other interested parties and other members of the public were given an opportunity to cross-examine the witnesses, to give testimony on their own behalf, and to present their own evidence.

After consideration of the evidence and noting that they had inspected the proposed highway, the Selectboard makes the following findings of fact:

- The proposed highway to be laid out provides access to a
 lot subdivision to be used for residential homes.
- 2. The grade of a part of the new town highway is unsatisfactory.
- 3. Other than the grade which needs to be improved as noted in the previous paragraph, the roadway was constructed with an adequate base.

- 4. The roadway was constructed with an adequate drainage system.
- 5. The roadway has been surveyed and the survey map has been recorded in the Hyde Park Land Records.
- 6. The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park are best served by the establishment of the proposed roadway.

It is ordered that the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park require that the abovedescribed roadway be laid out in accordance with this order. It is directed that before the Town will accept the road, the grade be modified to standards acceptable to the Town. It is further ordered that the Town of Hyde Park shall have no duty to maintain or snowplow the above-described roadway until such time that three of the lots in the proposed development have three dwelling houses that are occupied as permanent residences. Until such time that three structures are completed and occupied as principal residences, Robert and Donna Mead will be solely responsible for the road maintenance and snowplowing.

DISCONTINUANCE OF A PART OF TOWN HIGHWAY #37

With respect to the discontinuance of a part of Town Highway #37, the Selectboard took testimony from Robert and Donna Mead. The property owners, other interested parties and other members of the public were given an opportunity to cross-examine the witnesses, to give testimony on their own behalf and to present their own witnesses.

After consideration of the evidence and noting that they had

inspected the part of Town Highway #37 to be discontinued, the Selectboard makes the following findings of fact:

- The part of Town Highway 37 to be discontinued provides access only to one house.
- The part of Town Highway #37 to be discontinued doesn't provide access to any other public highways.
- The part of Town Highway 37 to be discontinued doesn't provide access to any public or private recreational areas.
- There was no evidence presented at the hearing opposing the discontinuance of a part of Town Highway #39.
- The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park requires that the portion of Town Highway #39 as described above be discontinued.

It is ordered that the portion of Town Highway #39 described above be discontinued. Stephanie Bourdeau abstained from the voting.

On their own motion on September 16, 2019, the Selectboard for the Town of Hyde Park appointed October 17, 2019, at 3:00 P.M. at the Town Offices of the Town of Hyde Park, Vermont, as the time and place when they would hear persons interested in the laying out, reclassification and discontinuance of the above town highways. A description of each affected town highway follows:

MUNSON ROAD TH27 description – TH27 is a Class 4 town highway commonly referred to as Munson Road in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the north side of Cleveland Corners Road TH7 approximately 0.20 miles westerly of the intersection of Garfield Crossroad TH54 and Cleveland Corners Road TH7. Munson Road TH27 is 0.05 miles in length.

UNNAMED TH73 description – TH73 is an unnamed Class 4 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the north side of Cleveland Corners Road TH7 approximately 0.06 miles westerly of the intersection of Garfield Crossroad TH54 and Cleveland Corners Road TH7. Unnamed TH73 is 0.05 miles in length.

ORCHARD TERRACE TH69 description – TH69 is a Class 3 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the easterly side of Commonwealth Avenue TH68. The town has maintained approximately 130 feet of private driveway extending from the end of the 0.09-mile mapped length of TH69, thus the 130 feet becoming an unclassified town highway. The entire unclassified town highway located on the lands of Robert Falker are the subject of this Order.

BORNEMANN ROAD TH17 description – TH17 is a Class 3 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the west side of Garfield Road TH7. The last 800 feet of Bornemann Road, beginning from a town plow turnaround area near Sighs Drive and extending northerly is currently not maintained by the Town. The remainder of Bornemann Road from the TH6 (Garfield Road) to the noted plow turnaround area will remain a Class 3 and be 0.33 miles in length.

WEBSTER ROAD TH38 description – TH38 is a Class 3 and Class 4 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park. The Class 4 portion is the subject of this Order and it begins at the intersection of a private road, Larson Lane, and extends northwesterly approximately 1.04 miles to its termination at Grimes Road TH36.

RICHARDSON ROAD TH41 description – TH41 is a Class 3 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the west side of Davis Hill Road TH40. TH41 is approximately 0.45 miles in length.

STERLING VIEW ROAD TH88 description — TH88 is a Class 3 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the north side of VT Route 15. The proposed laying out of an extension of TH88 begins at the current termination of TH88, which is approximately 0.74 miles from VT Route 15, ending near the private road commonly referred to as Maplewood Drive. The proposed extension is approximately 1,100 feet in length and is currently a paved private road with a loop-style turnaround, the entire length being proposed to become a Class 3. With the extension, TH88 will have a length of miles.

Depot Street Extension TH71 description — TH71 is a Class 3 town highway in the Town of Hyde Park, located on the west side of Depot Street TH2 and extending 0.13 miles to its terminus. The beginning section of the Class 3 is 0.03 miles in length as depicted on the Village of Hyde Park General Highway Map. The Class 3 continues westerly as depicted on the Town of Hyde Park General Highway Map for 0.01 miles to TH70 (a.k.a. Mill Street) then continues 0.10 miles westerly to its terminus. The reclassification from Class 3 to Class 4 begins at the parking area for the Lamoille Valley Rail Trail, located 450 feet from the centerline of TH2, and will continue westerly as a Class 4 to the property line of N/F Lathrop at 184 Depot St Extension.

Crabapple Lane (unclassified town highway) description – Crabapple Lane is proposed to be a Class 3 town highway and is more particularly described in a survey map entitled "Crabapple Lane, Hyde Park, Vermont" Scale 1 inch = 100 feet, dated October 2019, prepared by Little River Survey, Inc., Patricia Kules, L.S., Registered Land Surveyor, Stowe, Vermont" to be recorded in the Hyde Park Land Records with required deeds as appropriate.

The hearing was held and completed on October 17, 2019. Notice of the October 17, 2019 hearing was given to the Hyde Park Town Planning Commission, a copy was posted at the Hyde Park Town Offices, a copy was published in the September 19, 2019 issue of the News & Citizen, a newspaper of general circulation in the Lamoille County area, and copies were sent to the following property owners and others interested in the premises over which the town highway is proposed:

At the time and place set forth above, the Selectboard took testimony from the property owners present, and other members of the public were invited to attend and testify at the hearing. The public was also given an opportunity to cross-examine the witnesses, to give testimony on their own behalf and to present their own witnesses.

After consideration of the evidence and noting that they had inspected the proposed highways prior or following the public hearing, the Selectboard makes the following findings of fact:

MUNSON ROAD FINDINGS:

- The highway to be discontinued provides access to Cleveland Corners Road for one
 residential home and no public lands or services. No objection has been received
 following the public notice of discontinuance. The Town has no plans for public
 infrastructure or community services that would benefit from retaining the
 highway right-of-way for public use.
- 2. The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park are best served by discontinuing this Class 4 town highway.

UNNAMED TH73 FINDINGS:

- 1. The highway to be discontinued provides access to Cleveland Corners Road for one residential home and no public lands or services. The State of Vermont recommended that the Class 4 Town Highway be reclassified to a public trail to retain the public right-of-way because a large pond exists on the parcel. However, the Class 4 does not reach the pond and an additional 350-foot long easement would be required to access this 6.6-acre private pond. No other public support for a public trail nor the landowner's support for granting an easement were expressed during the public hearing. No other comments were received following the public notice of discontinuance. The Town has no plans for public infrastructure or community services that would benefit from retaining the highway right-of-way for public use.
- The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde
 Park are best served by discontinuing this Class 4 town highway.

ORCHARD TERRACE FINDINGS:


- 1. The highway to be discontinued is currently not listed as a public highway but begins at the terminus of TH Orchard Terrace at the Falker/Andrews boundary line and has received public winter maintenance while serving one residential home and no public lands or services. The Town has agreed with the landowner to not plow the driveway on the N/F Falker parcel for two years. No objection has been received following the public notice of discontinuance. The Town has no plans for public infrastructure or community services that would benefit from retaining the highway right-of-way for public use.
- The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde
 Park are best served by discontinuing the unclassified portion of Orchard Terrace,
 and if it exists, any portion of the Class 3 town highway, located on Bob Falker
 property.

BORNEMANN ROAD TH17 FINDINGS:

- 1. The highway to be discontinued is the northerly end of the TH only and presently serves one residential home and no public lands or services. Other users of the town highway that have a legal interest in the access to Bornemann Road will retain an easement after discontinuance, if such legal interest existed prior to discontinuance. No objection has been received following the public notice of discontinuance. The Town has no plans for public infrastructure or community services that would benefit from retaining the highway right-of-way for public use. The Class 3 ends in the middle of a large parcel and does not connect to another municipality or serve and public places or community services. The Town presently only plows to the turnaround area at Signs Drive (a private road) and has not plowed the last 800 feet of Bornemann Road recently.
- The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park are best served by discontinuing the last 800 feet of TH17.

WEBSTER ROAD TH38 FINDINGS:

1. The Class 4 highway to be reclassified as a Public Trail provides access between the Class 3 portion of Webster Road (and to VT100) and Grimes Road TH17, a Class 3 town highway. The Class 4 portion now provides access to three residential homes and three undeveloped parcels, but no road surface is evident for most of the Class 4 length. No objection has been received following the public notice of discontinuance and letters of support for public trail status related to home owners have legal access and decreasing the use of the highway right-of-way by truck traffic that is directed to this route as it appears to be a thru road on road maps. The Town has no plans for public infrastructure or community services however, as the Class 4 presently connects two Class 3 town highways, the retainage of the public right-of-way for future use benefits the public use.



The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park are best served by reclassifying the existing Class 4 portion of Webster Road to a Public Trail.

RICHARDSON ROAD FINDINGS:

- The highway proposed to be discontinued provides access to public utilities and
 fire service water supply sources. Landowner objections to discontinuance were
 received and considered by the Board. The Town has no plans for new public
 infrastructure or community services along this town highway but future
 development along the road will benefit from continued public town highway
 maintenance.
- The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde
 Park are best served by retaining the existing Richardson Road as a Class 3 roadway.

STERLING VIEW ROAD FINDINGS:

- The highway to be extended will directly serve 11 single-family homes and will
 provide a safe and adequate town vehicle turnaround at the end of the 0.8-mile
 road. The loop portion is approximately 0.20 miles, resulting in a total Class 3 road
 length from VT15 of 5,100 feet or 0.96 mile.
- The Town currently has no adequate turnaround within a public right-of-way. The property owner has recently paved the loop portion and the additional roadway is in overall good condition with no major stormwater improvements or bridges.
- 3. The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park are best served by the extension of Sterling View Road to include a turnaround area for public use where none exists today.

DEPOT STREET EXTENSION FINDINGS:

- The town highway Class 3 portion extends past the new Lamoille Valley Trail
 parking lot but the town highway maintenance now ends at the LVRT parking lot.
 The Class 4 portion will remain to service parcels that are westerly of the LVRT
 parking area.
- The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde
 Park are best served by the reclassification of the end of Depot Street Extension to
 a Class 4 roadway.

CRABAPPLE LANE FINDINGS:

- The roadway to be accepted as a public highway, Class 3, has been surveyed and the survey map will be recorded in the Hyde Park Land Records as referenced above following the issuance of this Order.
- Crabapple Lane presently serves 13 single-family homes and has been publicly
 maintained by the Town of Hyde Park for over 20 years, however, no formal
 highway laying out process was completed.
- 3. The proposed town highway length is 1,000 feet with a turnaround area for public town road maintenance.

4. The public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park are best served by the establishment of Crabapple Lane as a town highway Class 3.

Now, therefore, it is ordered that the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Hyde Park require that:


- 1) Munson Road TH27 Class 4 be discontinued it its entirety;
- 2) Unnamed TH73 Class 4 be discontinued it is entirety;
- 3) Orchard Terrace's unclassified or classified section be discontinued where existing on lands of N/F Falker;
- 4) Bornemann Road TH17 Class 3 be partially discontinued beginning at the existing Class 3 turnaround area at the Sighs Drive and northerly;
- 5) Webster Road TH38 Class 4 be reclassified to a Public Trail;
- 6) Richardson Road TH41 Class 3 to have no change in its existing Class 3 status;
- 7) Sterling View Road TH88 Class 3 to be extended by laying out an additional 020 miles as Class 3 which includes a loop turnaround for highway maintenance, and that the abovedescribed land be opened as a Class 3 Town Highway for the purposes noted in this return;
- 8) Depot Street Extension Class 3 to be partially reclassified to Class 4 from the LVRT Trailhead Parking Area and westerly to its terminus;
- 9) Crabapple Lane as described above be laid out accordingly, and that the above-described land be opened as a Class 3 Town Highway for the purposes noted in this return.





Susan opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m.

1. **Welcome, Changes to the Agenda and Public Comment** – Added PO# 2019-07 & Non-Employee Contract for Grange performer.

- 2. CONTINUATION of public hearing on road laying out and reclassifications. Motion by Roger A to open the road hearing recessed on 10-17-2019. Seconded by Roland. Voting: 4 in favor, 0 against, motion passed. Ron reported that two letters were received as part of the hearing testimony; one from Vermont FPR and one from Sterling View Co-Op, Paul Nesky. VT FPR recommends that Class 4 roads that access ponds be reclassified to public trails. The Board felt that since the TH74 length is only 225 feet, and there is not any public access to the nearby pond which is over 300 feet from the end of the Class 4, that discontinuance would not create any new access issue and Garfield Road is nearby for parking should access be granted by the landowner. Bob Falker, Orchard Terrace, asked if the 130 feet was near the hedges and Susan reported that the public road, Orchard Terrace, will end on the Andrews' parcel if the rest of the unclassified road on the Flaker parcel is discontinued and town plows will no longer travel on Falker's parcel. Motion by Roger A to close the road reclassification public hearing on the nine roads and move into deliberations. Seconded by Roland. Voting: 4 in favor, 0 against, motion passed.
- 3. Fire Department Stipends for Officers and Hourly Pay Schedule Roger Audet suggested that the officers should divide up a lump sum rather than having a fixed amount by rank. Roger A noted that the loyalty to volunteer for the Town is fading but he recognized that some compensation is good, maybe a lump sum of \$1,000. Roger noted that the Selectboard volunteers a lot without much compensation. Chief Webster suggested that \$750 annual stipend is recommended for the Chief and then reduced by officer rank, to recognize officers for additional time at the fire station and doing paperwork for required reports. Susan explained that towns are moving to paid employees gradually that are supported by volunteers. Roger A stated that all equipment is new and somewhere there could be a breaking point. Chief Webster agreed society is headed that way toward paid firefighters. Roger A said that he sees people are having trouble paying taxes. Roland suggested that the proposal could go to town meeting. Chief Savage stated that his officers are against this, but they estimate a 25 hour per week job on top of their personnel business, and he sees the required hours going up each year. Ryan Nolan noted that the responsibility for safety on the scene are also increasing for the fire officers. Chief Savage stated he sees paid firefighters in the future for many small-town fire departments. Susan asked what the best path for communities is to follow with increasing costs, such as joining departments with a full-time Chief, is that realistic to start working on now. Chief Webster noted Cambridge and Johnson had discussed it but did not pursue it. The Board agreed to continue to discuss the topic and Chief noted he is coming to the Board for his full budget presentation in December.
- 4. NHP/Eden Fire Department Draft Disposition of Assets MOU, 10/03 Meeting & Vehicle Insurance. Chief Savage reported that his insurance would pay the resale value not full replacement cost. Chief Savage will be getting more information on insurance. The MOU did not have many changes from the October 3rd joint

- meeting with Eden, it was mostly insurance clarification that is needed and adding space for all Selectboard members to sign the MOU. Chief Savage will check in with Eden to see if they have notes from the meeting. Chief Savage reported that the \$14,000 for air bottles is a best price for 16 bottles with Hyde Park's half being \$7,000 for FY2020 and there is a possibly a need for \$8,000 in FY2021 for additional air park equipment.
 - 5. Hyde Park Electric Rates Selectboard discussion on community impact of electric rate increase. Susan explained that she has gotten calls about the electric rates and agreed to put on the agenda. Carol Robertson reported that the proposed rates are going through the Public Utility Commission noting that no rate increase has occurred over 9 years, and the electric department is operating very efficiently with an excellent staff. Carol noted it was hard to compare rates because different providers have different rate structures. Rates are based on need to meet safety requirements, low staff numbers but platinum level employees like Karen and John take on the extra burden, and she predicted that the rates will move to the middle of the pack as other companies are yet to increase their rates. Carol stated that she hopes the new rates will remain stable, if possible, and the current rate increase is being reviewed by the PUC for 10-29 at 6:30 p.m. in the municipal office's meeting room. Carol was confident with current solar expenses but is concerned that the State will double the Tier 2 requirements for utilities to use renewable energy which could force a second major solar field for Hyde Park Electric. Susan asked about the viability of small municipal companies and whether a coop is likely in the future. Carol agreed that reliability is key for small municipals, like Hyde Park, and having a good staff with the right equipment could result in more efficiency and continued high reliability. Carol noted that leaving VESPPA this November relieves Hyde Park electric of debt risk but still allows Hyde Park to access services for a per-use fee. A letter from Tom Sheppard was received noting that a high percentage of residents are retired, and the impact of electric rate increases is harder. Carol stated that the increases are often mandated on the department, noting that most of Hyde Park customers use 400 kW per month. Tom Sheppard confirmed that his letter was now on the record which Susan confirmed it was, noting that the Board would review it. <u>Dave Gagnier appeared at this point.</u>
- Highway Projects Contracting work vs. adding more "construction" to highway department. The Board agreed programming general tasks would be good to look at as an option to budgeting for individual line items. The change may not happen this year, but more use of "small road projects" seemed to be a good option so a project cost could be more easily tracked with the town accounting system. Ron will review with Finance Director Alyson Cusson.
- 31 7. Highway Winter Plow Operators – Ron noted three individuals are on the list for on-call consideration. 32 Dave noted that the seasonal on-call people should be working to plow snow and not working in the garage 33 just to get to 40 hours or more. The Board discussed when to release the 5th person during a work week 34 and the need to manage the budget for the 5th person. The Board discussed having a 5th person year-round 35 and Dave noted that the additional hours for the budget would come from existing labor hours for roadside 36 mowing that still needed to be done, so no gain in work hours unless a large increase in the budget to 37 retain the seasonal road mowing labor as is. Ron will prepare a cost estimate for having a 5th highway crew 38 member year-round for the November board meeting, with and without using existing labor funds. Motion 39 by Dave to approve \$17.00/hr for the three winter on-call labor rates. Seconded by Roger A. Voting: 5 in 40 favor, 0 against, motion passed.
- 41 8. Personnel Policy The Board will discuss amendments at a future work meeting.

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



Hi Kerry

We have a request to discontinue and a request to reclassify portions of TH38, but any action was deferred by the Selectboard until warmer weather in 2019. Prior requests were rejected to maintain the Class 4. This could affect the classsification of TH38 from Grimes Road to the Larson Lane/Webster Road intersection.

A subdivision application produced a new survey for TH38 which differs from the current VTrans information. The below image shows the surveyed TH38 in the yellow highlight alignment. I'll send the survey to you after the holiday break. The yellow highlight has no roadway improvements at the current time - your blue line from the two ends of my yellow highlight is a maintained private road to two homes and is located within in a private 50-foot easement. Larson Lane is a private road.


Question for Ron: Does the Town have plans to make any changes to the CL4 ROW?




Hi John,

Very interesting issue just came up on a call from Hyde Park. See his screenshot at the bottom of the email in which they had just done a survey due to recent construction and they found out that the road (AOT Class 4) is in the wrong spot and that the road is not the Right of Way. The ROW is not being used and there is a private section of road. At some point, he will send you guys the survey that was done but wanted to tie AOT into this issue.

For 911 it's a bit weird, but I drew it in as Class 3 to then private to then class 4 to indicate the true road location that is being used. This is one of those scenarios where we won't add the ROW class 4 as that would certainly confuse 911 call takers or those who use our maps. This Class 4 section also has the same HWY # and it's not clear where Webster Rd becomes Quiet Lane so I picked the Westerly most Tree/Meadow line for now until that becomes clearer.



Blue portions on this photo essentially are Class 4 roads that are "not used" and not really a thing on the ground.
