
19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection


§ 305. Measurement and inspection

- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

Hey Chris,

I hope all is well with you these days! Things have been a bit unusual for us as we adjust to telecommuting.

I'm processing the Stowe Certificate now, and there are a few almost-trivial things (but lengthy to articulate) that I want to run by you:

TH-21

0.10 mi is, in our records at least, technically class 3 highway that is designated NUTS (not up to standard) which is why it is included in the class 4 mileage totals instead of the class 3 mileage totals. We only have 0.09 mi in our records for class 4 TH-21. To remove the mileage associated with this segment of TH-21 it would be:

0.10 mi CL4 NUTS TH-21 reclassified as LT

0.09 mi CL4 TH-21 reclassified as LT

The adjacent paved CL3 segment of TH-21 has 0.25 mi associated with it in our records, but the map measure is 0.24 when rounded to the nearest 0.01 mi (and 1984 inventory has 0.23 mi). Similarly, the CL3 segment to the east has 0.56 mi associated with it, but both the map measure and 1984 inventory have 0.53 mi.

Can you think of any explanation for these differences other than imprecise measures in the past? As best as I can tell, the current map represents the same roadways as the 1949 map excerpt below, and the totals still sum to 1.0 mi. What do you think about including remeasurements for the CL3 sections of TH-21? The paved section from 0.23 to 0.24 mi? The other section from 0.56 to 0.53 mi? We don't normally bother with minor changes like this unless we are VERY confident that there isn't another explanation for the difference in mileage (e.g. realignment)...which is why I'm checking with you to make sure there isn't something I've missed. It doesn't require additional documentation, it would just makes the map measure more closely match the mileage record, and "we're already in the area".

If so, I would add this adjustment to the Certificate, initial the change, and file our correspondence confirming this with the certificate.

TH-44:


The Notice specifically describes 1.34 mi stretch between the northeastern Biello property line to the end of Luce Hill Rd, which (probably not coincidently) has a map measure of 1.34 mi.

Exhibit A seems to show almost the entire "untraveled" section of CL4 TH-44 as being reclassified (~1.5 mi map measure) penetrating into the Biello property.

The Order of Discontinuance only says ~1.50 mi of TH-44 is discontinued to Trail, but I can't find anything that clearly indicates or distinguishes between the two descriptions. Can you clarify this for me?

TH-48:

We have 0.63 mi on record for TH-48. The map measure is 0.67 (If the parcel data and town boundary is accurate). We can simply reclassify the 0.5 of the miles we have on record, which would leave 0.13 mi CL3, which matches the CL3 section if it extends up to the State Forest sign on the far side of the parking lot (see highlighted line in the image below). That leaves officially 0.50 mi CL4 highway that has a map measure of 0.54 mi. We are not overly concerned about precise CL4 mileages, so let me know if you think this merits an official "remeasurement" while we are "in the area". Otherwise I will process it as you've already written it.

On a motion by Ms. Hagerty, seconded by Mr. Van Dyke, the Board approved the Liquor Consent Items as listed.

Set FY20 Tax Rates

Mr. Safford presented the Fy20 Tax Rates as prepared by Town Appraiser Tim Morrissey. Based on the budget approved by the voters, the voter approved tax exemptions and the Grand List adopted by the Board of Listers the FY20 municipal tax rate should be set at \$0.4253 for the Town General Fund Tax Rate and \$0.0049 for the Voter Approved Tax Exemption Rate for a combined final rate of \$0.4302. This represents an increase of \$0.0124 over FY19. The State has set the Homestead Education Tax Rate at \$1.5430 and the Non-Homestead Tax Rate at \$1.6877.

On a motion by Mr. Van Dyke, seconded by Mr. Adams the Board set the FY20 Town General Fund Tax Rate at \$0.4253 and the Voter Approved Exemption Tax Rate at \$0.0049 for a total FY20 Municipal (non-school) Tax Rate of \$0.4302.

Needle Disposal Program

Emily Rosenbaum, president of Jewish Community of Greater Stowe, requested that the Town institute a sharps disposal program after finding needles in the parking lot and greenspaces of their synagogue. They would like to have a safe way to dispose of needles so someone does not get hurt. Chief Hull has outlined a program that would include installation of sharps disposal units in the Akeley Memorial Building, Stowe Arena Stowe Free Library and Stowe Public Safety Facility. These units would be checked and replaced by Stowe EMS, with an initial cost of approximately \$500 and an estimated yearly maintenance cost of \$200 depending on the level of use. Additionally, a public information brochure will be distributed letting people know how to dispose of their sharps safely and what to do if sharps are found. Selectboard members asked that language on the brochure be changed to clarify that when citizens find sharps they can call the police rather than handling the sharps themselves. -It was agreed that after implementation, the Town would report back to the Selectboard - on -the level of usage.

On a motion by Ms. Hagerty, seconded by Mr. Van Dyke, the Board approved the sharps disposal program as outlined by Chief Hull with modifications to the educational brochure as discussed.

At 5:24pm Chair Noyes tabled the Selectboard meeting, to reconvene at Cotton Brook Road for a site visit and public hearing.

Cotton Brook Road Reclassify From Class 3 to 4 Site Visit & Public Hearing

The Selectboard meeting reconvened at Cotton Brook Road at 6:00pm.

The Board discussed changing the Road Classification from Class 3 to Class 4 from the end of the parking lot to the southern end of the road at the Waterbury town line. By reclassifying it to Class 4 the Town would not be responsible for plowing the road in the winter, which it currently does not do. Bridges and culverts would still be the Town's responsibility to maintain. The property along Cotton Brook Road where it would be reclassified is all owned by the State of Vermont as State Forest. A representative from the State of Vermont was at the location to discuss a possible gate for the road during mud season. The State would support it during mud season but not during the winter – due to its use as a snowmobile trail.

At 6:20pm Chair Noyes tabled the Selectboard meeting, to reconvene at Old Country Road for a site visit and public hearing.

Old Country Road Reclassify from Class 4 to Legal Trail

The Selectboard meeting reconvened at 6:30pm at Old Country Road.

A section of Old Country Road from the northeastern boundary of the Biello property and the top of Luce Hill Road is unpassable by a standard passenger vehicle and the Town has not historically maintained it. A section of it serves as Trapp Family Lodge cross country ski trail. The Biello property owners were present to discuss, and -raised the idea about fixing up the road to use it as a secondary means of access to houses on the other end of the road. It was felt the road would us not in good enough condition for use by motor vehicles and it would cost prohibitive to upgrade the road for motor vehicles. - The Town will look at its emergency plan for this area and how they would rescue people if the bridge were to go out. Selectboard members and the Biello's also discussed where the line should be, the Town proposed at the property line so that the Biellos had access to their entire property, but they would prefer just past their cabin driveway. Town Planner Tom Jackman will work with the Biellos to determine the line and include it in the Order of Discontinuance.

At 6:50pm Chair Noyes tabled the Selectboard meeting, to reconvene at Sanborn Road for a site visit and public hearing.

Sanborn Road Section Reclassify from Class 4 to Legal Trails

The Selectboard meeting reconvened at 7:00pm at Sanborn Road.

This 0.2 mile section of Sanborn Road between Lower Sanborn and upper Sanborn Road is unpassable by a standard passenger vehicle and Town has not historically maintained it. Towns are required to maintain bridges and culverts on class 4 roads and new stormwater regulations will also require Best Management Practices for controlling sediment runoff on class 4 roads. No maintenance is required on Legal Trails unless a municipality chooses to, and the Town would maintain ownership of the right-of-way.

At 7:10pm Chair Noyes tabled the Selectboard meeting, to reconvene at the Akeley Memorial Hall to resume the meeting.

At 7:19pm the Selectbaord meeting reconvened at Akeley Memorial Hall.

Testimony and Finding of Fact on Road Reclassification

There were no members of the public to give testimony. The Town will prepare -Orders of Discontinuance and Orders of Reclassification for the July 22, 2019 meeting and discuss the location of a gate for both Cotton Brook Road and Old Country Road.

Manager's Report

Public Works Director Harry Shepard gave an update on the Village Class 1 Sidewalk and Overhead Utility Relocation project. He noted that the second major underground utility crossing was happening tonight, with a third crossing at 151 Main to the Parsonage happening Tuesday night. At this point, he estimates about 50% of the conduit has been installed, and vaults and substations are in place. There is one more drainage structure on Maple Street and then night work will move to South Main Street. It is anticipated to last about a week and then night work will be complete until the fall. Dust control on

Selectboard Meeting 07/08/19

Maple Street has been a challenge and we are hopeful that temporary paving will be happening soon. Paving in the Lower Village is anticipated to occur next week.

On a motion by Mr. Van Dyke, seconded by Mr. Adams, the Board went into executive session to discuss personnel and legal matters at 7:20pm.

The Board came out of Executive Session at 7:55pm.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 7:56pm.



Two seriously injured in Route 15 crash

Two people were seriously injured in a head-on collision on Route 15 in Morristown Monday afternoon.

Two of the three drivers involved in the crash, Malcom Putvain, 18, of Wolcott and Rebekah Martin, 27, of Jeffersonville, were both severely injured. Both were in critical condition the day after the crash; by Wednesday Martin's condition had been upgraded to serious.

The third driver, Dylan Perry, 17, of Hardwick, was unhurt.

The crash occurred on Route 15 just west of the Mountain View Snack Bar at about 4:30 p.m., police said. Putvain was driving east on Route 15, and Perry and Martin were headed west.

Evidence at the scene and eyewitness testimony indicate that Putvain's 2000 Honda Civic crossed the center line, clipping

Perry's Ford Focus before hitting Martin's 2012 Toyota Camry headon, Morristown police said.

Emergency personnel had to extract both Martin and Putvain from their vehicles; both were rushed to Copley Hospital by ambulance, then airlifted by helicopter to the University of Vermont Medical Center in Burlington.

Police said both Martin and Putvain had surgery soon after they reached the hospital and were out by 10:30 Monday night. Both were in UVM's intensive care unit, listed in critical condition on Tuesday. By press time Martin had been upgraded to serious condition.

The UVM Medical Center defines critical condition as "vital signs are unstable and not within normal limits. ... Indicators are unfavorable." Serious condition is defined as "Vital signs may be unstable and not within normal limits. Patient is acutely ill. Indicators are questionable."

Police confirmed after the crash that Martin was pregnant; according to a GoFundMe page (bit.ly/martin gofundme) set up by family members, she was 36 weeks pregnant, and the unborn baby did not survive.

After the crash, Route 15 was closed down until after 10 p.m., and local traffic was detoured.

The Vermont State Police crash reconstruction team was called in to assist in the investigation. Morristown police, fire and emergency medical services departments responded, as did the Lamoille County Sheriff's Department, the Hyde Park and Wolcott fire departments and Northern Emergency Medical Services.

Police have not said yet what factors may have contributed to the

Anyone who saw the crash and has not yet spoken to police is asked to call Morristown Police Detective Jason Luneau at 888-4211.


