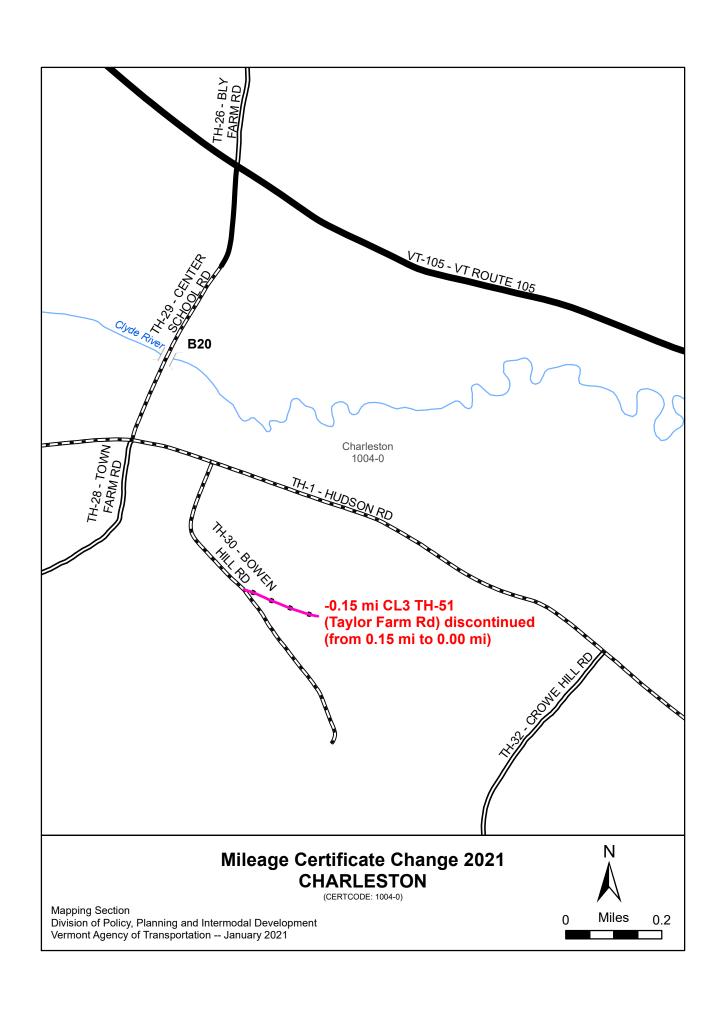

Order and Report Of Selectboard, Town of Charleston

Re: Taylor Farm Rd, October 2020

Pursuant to V.S.A. Title 19, a public hearing was held on October 8, 2020 at 5:30 pm at the Charleston Town Clerk's Office with regard to taking action as described below to discontinue the following town highway located entirely within the Town of Charleston.

Discontinue Class 3 town highway 51, which begins at Bowen Hill Rd and is 0.15 miles in length. Town Highway 51 is known as Taylor Farm Rd.

Resolved that if the Selectboard determines that the public good, safety, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Charleston require that said highway be discontinued, this action will be so ordered.

Prior notice as required by law was duly provided by certified mail to all adjoining landowners and interested parties on September 3, 2020:

- Grace Frizzell (adjoining landowner)
- Mark & Linda Marsh (near neighbor, as a courtesy)
- Vermont Commissioner of Forests, Parks & Recreation

Notice was hand-delivered to the Charleston Planning Commission on the same day. Also on September 4th, notice was further provided by posting at the Charleston Town Clerk, East and West Charleston Post Offices, Scampy's Deli, and charlestonvt.org. A notice was posted in the Chronicle, the newspaper of record, in the September 23, 2020 edition.

The Selectboard conducted a site visit to the road at 5:30 pm on October 8, 2020 immediately preceding the public hearing. Landowner Grace Frizzell also attended along with farmer Lynwood Crown, who uses the property.

Selectboard Chair Peter Moskovites opened the October 8, 2020 public hearing at 5:42 pm by stating that discontinuance was been requested by the only adjoining landowner in a letter dated August 10, 2020 in which she referred to problems with "people trespassing in these buildings, stealing parts and using the property as a dumping ground." The purpose of the hearing was to hear testimony on the proposed change.

Those in attendance were: Selectboard Chair Peter Moskovites, Selectboard Members Larry Young and Patrick Austin, Road Foreman Bernie Pepin, and Selectboard Clerk Colleen Kellogg. There were no other residents, property owners or other members of the public in attendance or on the conference line and no written testimony received. With no testimony to consider, the hearing was concluded at 5:55 pm by the Chair. The Selectboard agreed to take up the matter at their regular business meeting that evening at 6:00 pm. The matter was on the Selectboard Meeting Agenda, which was properly warned and noticed.

At the October 8th Selectboard meeting, Mr. Young offered a motion to honor the request to discontinue Taylor Farm Rd, seconded by Mr. Moskovites, with the following discussion: Mr. Moskovites said that one landowner owns both sides of the road, which ends at a dilapidated farmhouse, and that to make the road private would have no impact on its future use. Keeping the road open has been problematic for the town since there is no place for a truck to turn around safely, and the condition of the buildings represent a safety hazard. Mr. Austin said a change from a Class 3 to a private road is more drastic than usual, and suggested that reclassification to a legal trail with permission to gate it would serve the landowner's purpose. Mr. Moskovites said the road was essentially a driveway to a home and goes nowhere. Mr. Young said town maintenance vehicles have had safety issues on the road for as long as he's been on the board. A vote was called for, with Moskovites and Young voting yes and Austin voting no. The proposal was approved.

It is therefore the decision of the Town of Charleston Selectboard that the 0.15-mile town highway #51 known as Taylor Farm Rd, which begins at Bowen Hill Rd, shall be discontinued. As a result, the total Class 3 mileage in Charleston is reduced from 30.36 to 30.21.

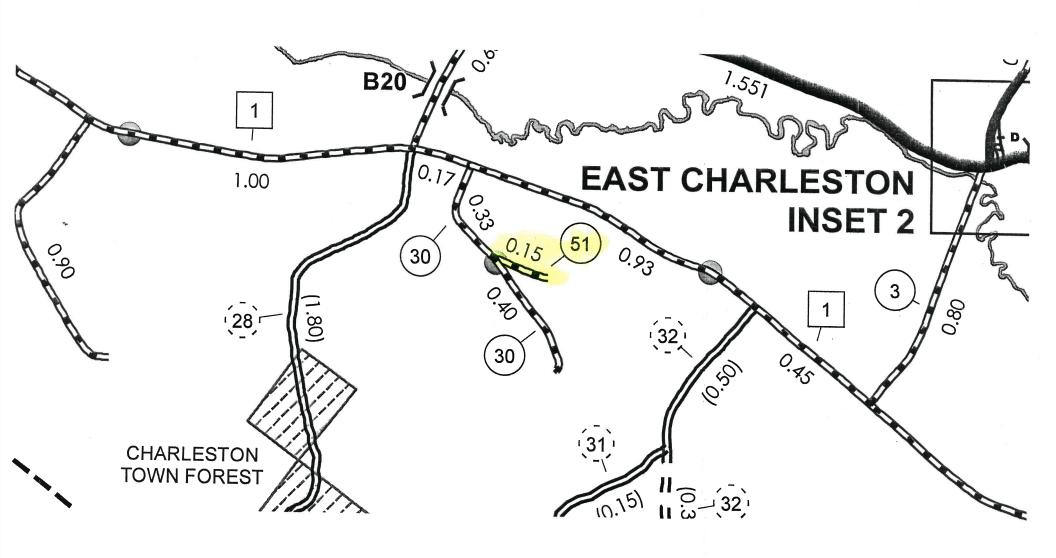
