



ORDER OF DISCONTINUANCE, LAYING OUT & ALTERATION OF ROADS

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2018 the Select Board of the Town of Brandon resolved to hold a public hearing relating to the following:

- 1. Discontinue a portion of Old Basin Road;
- 2. Throw up and discontinue that portion of Town Highway #29, also known as Old Basin Road, starting approximately .52 miles from the intersection of Van Cortland Road and continuing to the intersection of Basin Road.

WHEREAS, the Select Board of the Town of Brandon has the authority to initiate the discontinuance, lay out and alteration of a Town Highway on its own motion as authorized in Title 19 V.S.A. § 708;

WHEREAS, Notice was posted at the Town Office located at 49 Center Street, Brandon, Vermont, Lake Sunapee Bank located at 2 Park Street, Brandon, Vermont, and Forestdale Grocery located at Furnace Road, Forestdale, Vermont in accordance with 19 V.S.A § 709;

WHEREAS, Hearing was held on August 13, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. at the Brandon Town Hall, which were the date, time and place set forth in the Notice and the Select Board having examined the premises and heard all interested parties who appeared at said Hearing, determined and adjudged that the public good, common necessity and convenience of the residents of the Town of Brandon are not adversely affected in any manner by:

- 1. Discontinuing a portion of Old Basin Road;
- 2. Throwing up and discontinuing that portion of Town Highway #29, also known as Old Basin Road, starting approximately .52 miles from the intersection of Van Cortland Road and continuing to the intersection of Basin Road.

THEREFORE, it is hereby RESOLVED AND ORDERED that Old Basin Road, also known as Town Highway #29, be discontinued starting approximately .52 miles from the intersection of Van Cortland Road and continuing to the intersection of Basin Road. The portion of Road being discontinued is depicted on a survey titled "Bailey Property, Subdivision Survey", dated February 7, 2006 and recorded September 4, 2008 in Map Book 1 at Page 38 in the Town of Brandon Land Records. The former road bed of the proposed discontinued section will be conveyed to the underlying landowners.

This Order is executed pursuant to 19 V.S.A. § 711(a) dated at Brandon, Vermont, this 14th day of January, 2019.

Brandon Select Board Meeting September 10, 2018

1. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by Seth Hopkins at 7:01PM.

a) Agenda Adoption – Motion by Devon Fuller/Tracy Wyman to adopt the agenda. The motion passed unanimously.

2. Approval of Minutes

a) Approval of Minutes - August 27, 2018 - Select Board Regular Meeting

Motion by Tracy Wyman/Brian Coolidge to approve the August 27, 2018 Select Board meeting minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

3. Town Manager's Report

Dave Atherton provided the following update for the Segment 6 Project:

Last Three Weeks:

Park Street box cut, sand and subbase placement.

Lot 'A' box cut, sand and subbase placement.

Pavement placement within Lot 'A' and Park Street.

Installation of water main within Grove and Pearl Streets.

Underdrain, initiation of box cut, sand and subbase placement adjacent to former Brandon Auto and South thereof.

Concrete placement for headwall at former Brandon Autoculvert.

Concrete placement for traffic control mast arm at the intersection of Park Street and Roxte7 North.

Curb installation within Park Street and Lot'A'.

Sidewalk preparation at various locations, (Segment 'B').

Sewer and services installations from Pearl Street towards Prospect Street.

Parking lot improvements associated with Rite Aid.

Parking lot improvements to assisted living facility adjacent to Post Office, (South).

Storm water drainage installations adjacent to Crescent Park, Pearl Street.

Upcoming Two Weeks:

Sidewalk grading at various locations.

Sidewalk installation within Segment 'B', (Hannaford's and Dentist/ Bank, (Carver Street)). Continued roadway box cut, (subbase preparation) and underdrain installation within Route 7 Jiffy Mart, (South).

Continued installation of traffic signals and street lighting installations within Segment 'B'.

Continued installation of water services within Grove Street.

Completion of curb installations within Segment 'B', Central Park area/others.

Completion of concrete headwall installation former Brandon Auto Culvert (backfilling).

For Bridge 114, Alpine Construction poured the wall and wing at abutment No. 1 (in the park). Next week, after proper curing they will strip the forms and backfill the wall. They will then begin to excavate in the park for retaining wall No.1, which runs south along Route 7. Alpine will continue to construct the shoring for the arch stones replacement and repair work. They have drilled large rods into the arch for support and will be grouting in those rods and setting up the shoring framing. The footing for wing wall No. 2 in front of 4 Conant Square will be excavated in the next two weeks as well. The tying of the reinforcing steel will follow.

For Churchill Road Bridge, the contractor has excavated the north abutment to bedrock. Work is being done on a change order to anchor the footing to the bedrock and adjust the design for the bedrock. If the change order is complete next Monday/Tuesday, the plan is to pour the footing on Wednesday. After this is complete the stem wall on the north abutment still has to be done and the associated backfill after that.

The Town has received approval from VTrans Right-of-Way to proceed with the easement negotiations for the Union Street sidewalk construction. Mr. Atherton will be setting up appointments with landowners this week.

The Town filed a Notice of Intervention for the Conti/Babcock Solar project on 9/6/18.

Devon Fuller confirmed Bridge 114 will be completed this fall, which should allow traffic flow to be better. Dave Atherton stated the bridge is not part of the traffic problem because they are maintaining traffic from both sides. The north side of the bridge will be night work that will alleviate traffic issues. Mr. Fuller asked what will be done with the old Churchill Bridge. Mr. Atherton advised the 1920 bridge is gone and the top bridge was owned by VAST and they have removed it.

Doug Bailey requested clarification of the Conti/Babcock notice of intervention. Dave Atherton advised this is similar to what was filed for previous solar projects to assure that the Town is involved in the process.

Ray Jobst noted Park Street looks very good. Mr. Atherton stated the skim coat that was placed on the top will be reclaimed in the work next spring.

Edna Sutton asked if there will be more opportunity for discussion of the Conti solar project as there is not a time frame on the project and she is concerned with the residents being kept informed. Dave Atherton advised the Public Utility Commission's (PUC) website has information on the application process for projects. Seth Hopkins noted there is a requirement that notifications are sent from the developer and the Town will continue to discuss this project at the meetings. Mr. Atherton stated he has talked with some of the landowners and has encouraged them to view the PUC website for updates on the project.

It was questioned if there will be a new gazebo built for central park. Mr. Atherton advised there will be a new gazebo built and it will look very similar to the previous one, but will be much sturdier and will be more centered in the park.

4. Comments for Items Not on the Agenda

Seth Hopkins thanked Dave Atherton and Daryl Burlett for the speed in addressing a concern about the Steinberg Road signage due to a spelling error.

Devon Fuller requested status of the Park Street storm water plans. Mr. Atherton advised they are still with Aldrich & Elliott.

5. Discuss Discontinuance of the Northern Section of Old Basin Road

Doug Bailey recused himself from the Select Board. Seth Hopkins noted that the Select Board had a site visit and held a hearing on this subject on August 16th and is required to act on this subject within 30 days.

Motion by Devon Fuller/Tracy Wyman to discontinue the northern section of Old Basin Road.

The motion passed unanimously.

Tracy Wyman stated there needs to be adequate turnaround at the end. Ray Jobst had photos available to show there is a radius turn that will accommodate vehicles and he has made a cut that will allow for a turn around by the snowplows. Dave Atherton and Daryl Burlett will visit the site to confirm that it is an adequate turn around. Mr. Wyman also noted there should be a sign that indicates "No Outlet" at the beginning of the road. It was noted there is currently a sign indicating "Dead End". Doug Bailey, petitioner, also suggested the size of the turnaround or any additional changes that need to be made will be done to make it easy for people to turn around. Seth Hopkins noted this action is per Title 19 VSA 701 and 771.

6. Approve Purchase and Sale Contract for Real Estate Conveyance

Dave Atherton advised this item is the approval of the 1061 for the Purchase and Sales contract that was approved at the last meeting. This is a notice that is required.

Motion by Devon Fuller/Tracy Wyman to approve the 1061 for the Purchase and Sales contract that was approved at the last meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

7. Fiscal

a) General Fund Warrant - September 10, 2018 - \$74,622.04

Motion by Devon Fuller/Brian Coolidge to approve the General Fund warrant of September 10, 2018 in the amount of \$74,622.04. The motion passed unanimously.

Devon Fuller questioned the invoice for Beldon Company, Inc. and it was noted this is the final payment for the Champlain Street Pump Station.

b) Route 7 Construction Warrant - September 10, 2018 - \$674,400.18

Motion by Devon Fuller/Brian Coolidge to approve the Route 7 Construction warrant of September 10, 2018 in the amount of \$674,400.18. The motion passed with one abstention – Tracy Wyman.

c) Bridge 114 Warrant - August 27, 2018 - \$49,630.87

Motion by Tracy Wyman/Doug Bailey to approve the Bridge 114 warrant of September 10, 2018 in the amount of \$49,620.87. The motion passed unanimously.

The Select Board recessed at 7:20PM and reconvened at 7:24PM.

Motion by Tracy Wyman/Brian Coolidge to enter into executive session at 7:24PM in accordance with 1VSA 313(a)(3) – Appointment or Employment of a Public Officer or Employee to include the Town Manager. The motion passed unanimously.

8. Executive Session: 1V.S.A 313(a)(3)

Motion by Doug Bailey/Tracy Wyman to come out of executive session at 7:27PM. The motion passed unanimously.

Motion by Doug Bailey/Devon Fuller to appoint the Town Manager, Dave Atherton, as the Deputy Health Officer. The motion passed unanimously.

9. Adjournment

Brandon Select Board Hearing Discontinue Portion of Old Basin Road August 13, 2018

Board Members Present: Seth Hopkins, Devon Fuller Doug Bailey, Brian Coolidge, Tracy Wyman

1. Open Hearing

Seth Hopkins, Board Chair, opened the hearing for public comments at 6:40PM.

Mr. Hopkins stated the hearing is relative to the discontinuance, laying out & alternation of roads document regarding the Old Basin Road portion of Town Highway #29, starting approximately .52 miles from the intersection of Van Cortland and continuing to the intersection of Basin Road.

The hearing was open to public comment.

Marietta Sheehan advised she had witnessed a fire when driving down her road and was concerned if she had not noticed it, it could have been disastrous. She is against closing the road due to it being an alternate way of getting off the road in the event of something like a fire. Ms. Sheehan also questioned how Mr. Bailey is bothered by four-wheelers.

Ray Jobst noted the road has been impassable for many years and would not be an alternate route in the event of a fire. Ms. Sheehan questioned how the four-wheelers are getting through.

Doug Bailey stated the four wheelers are going through from the other end of the road or are going across John Sagendof's property. Ray Jobst stated to be able to get any vehicle across that road or to convert it to a drivable road would require a lot of work and funds. Mr. Jobst noted he does not have a problem with people coming across his property.

Joe Jankosky stated he drives all over Vermont and there are many roads the same as Old Basin Road. He questioned why the road cannot be left the way it is.

Doug Bailey stated the problem is more than the four wheelers. The Town is trying to control the numerous points of entry. There have been break-in problems and there is an assumption that some of the problems are from the four-wheelers.

Cheri Jankosky stated the road has always been this way and questioned it is being changed. If Basin Road is having a problem with four-wheelers now and they stop them

from coming that way, they will start coming up Van Cortland Road and it will create the problem on that road.

Tracy Wyman stated if that section were open on both ends, the four wheelers would come down that road. He asked why everyone was looking to leave it a class 4 road.

Doug Bailey stated he had deeded off four house lots to be sold and his development is over and now that the two landowners have purchased the final lots, they would not like a lot of travel on their properties.

Jonathan Sagendof stated four-wheeler traffic has increased and questioned if this situation can be dealt with differently. He stated this would become Van Cortland Road's problem as well.

Mrs. Jankosky asked if it is deemed not a Class 4 road whether there would no longer be an opportunity for it to be opened. She also noted that the owner at the end has allowed the snowplow to turn around and expressed concern a future landowner might not be as amenable.

Doug Bailey advised the road is basically a footpath, but it is one of those things that it is not going to make much difference whether the Town drops that end.

Tracy Wyman questioned the property owners' concerns from that end, if something is put at the end of the road for a turnaround. Other than a point of access for walking out, what is the benefit of leaving it a Class 4 road? Mr. Wyman noted that Mr. Jobst had discussed the cost of improving the road with Markowski and they had indicated it would be at least \$100,000.00 to improve the road to get a path of some degree through there. Dave Atherton also noted there are wetlands to consider.

Seth Hopkins stated the Old Basin Road from Van Cortland Road is a Class 4 road and the Town has agreed to maintain it for snow plowing. Dave Atherton advised the Town maintains most of the Class 4 roads, but the Town does not have an obligation to do winter plowing.

Doug Bailey stated this area has been fenced for 50 years and Mr. Bailey has only had one person request permission to cross his land. There have been four-wheelers that have come through and left his gates open that allowed his livestock to get out. His project is complete and he pays taxes on the land, so there is no monetary gain for him personally in closing the road.

Ray Jobst advised that he has graded the road in the past as being part of the neighborhood, but the Town is now taking care of that part of Old Basin Road. Michael Lee noted other residents have also taken turns grading the road in the past.

Dave Atherton advised the Select Board has 60 days to take action on this item.

Brandon Select Board Hearing (Discontinuance of a Portion of Old Basin Road) August 13, 2018

Devon Fuller summarized that if the Town throws up the road, there is concern with getting out in an emergency, that there is a good turn around area for a snowplow and that once the road is thrown up, it could not be brought back. On the other side, there is interest in throwing up the road to remove the four-wheeler access and that the portion of the road proposed to be thrown up would be too expensive for the Town to upgrade.

Mr. Atherton suggested it would be good to have a cul-de-sac at the end of the road for the snowplow to turn around. In order to update that section of the road, there would be many things that would need to be changed. Mr. Wyman asked if this area were thrown up, would it eliminate the potential for the remainder of Old Brandon Road to be upgraded to a Class 3, if that was the Town's decision in the future. Mr. Atherton confirmed that it would not affect a change of the remainder of Old Brandon Road in the future. Mr. Jobst noted there is currently a turn around for a snowplow.

Mr. Lee stated that he and his wife would not have a problem with the discontinuance as long as there is a good turn around for the snowplow and traffic, and that there could still be potential to upgrade the road class in the future.

Seth Hopkins noted a Class 3 road has to be in good and sufficient repair for all seasons and there are certain standards that are required before a road can be upgraded to a Class 3. Mr. Hopkins stated the Town has to prioritize its highway budget and the Select Board refers to the Public Works Director's judgment for the roads. Dave Atherton advised there are rules and regulations for culverts. The width of the road would also be a problem.

Seth Hopkins noted the Select Board would take action on this subject either at the August 27th or September 10th Select Board meeting.

2. Close Hearing

Seth Hopkins closed the hearing at 7:06PM.
