**Title 19, V. S. A. Section 305
Added 1985**

SEC. 305. MEASUREMENT OF HIGHWAYS

(a) A representative of the agency in the presence of the selectmen or their designee shall measure and inspect the class 1, 2 and 3 town highways in each town at least once every ten years. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectmen shall, after review by a representative of the agency, file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2 and 3 town highways then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2 or 3 town highways are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency.

(d) The selectmen of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description or classification of a town highway may appeal to the board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the board.

**Title 19, V. S. A. Section 2502
Added 1985**

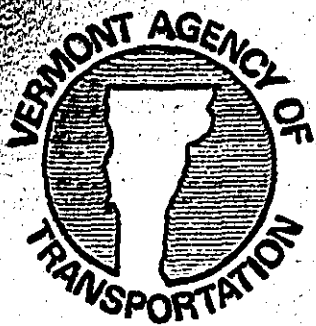
Sec. 2502. TOWN SCENIC ROADS; DESIGNATION AND DISCONTINUANCE

(a) On recommendation of the planning commission of a municipality, or on the initiative of the legislative body of a municipality, a legislative body may, after one public hearing warned for the purpose, designate or discontinue any town highway or portion of a town highway as a town scenic highway. Such action by the legislative body may be petitioned by the registered voters of the municipality pursuant to the provisions of section 1973 of Title 24.

(b) A town scenic road may be reconstructed or improved in a manner consistent with the standards established by the transportation board, pursuant to section 425 of Title 10. A class 1, 2 or 3 scenic highway shall still be eligible to receive aid pursuant to the provisions of this title.

(c) The legislative body of a municipality may appeal for a variance from standards promulgated by the transportation board. In these appeals the board's decision shall be final.

Enclosed is your 1991 Certificate of Highway Mileage. THIS CERTIFICATE MUST BE COMPLETED in order to determine and distribute state aid for Town Highways. Please remember that mileage changes, with documentation, can be sent to the Planning Division any time during the year.

In 1989, when your Town Highways were inspected and remeasured by Jay H. Kilton, Road Inventory Supervisor, the following highways were found to NOT meet Class 3 standards:

<u>NUMBER</u>	<u>MILEAGE</u>	<u>REASON NOT CLASS 3</u>
T-31	0.340	Not up to Class 3 standards.
T-62	0.070	Not up to Class 3 standards.
T-47	0.140	Not up to Class 3 standards. (Locked Gate)

These highways were subsequently reinventoried in 1990 by Jay H. Kilton, Road Inventory Supervisor, and found to still not meet Class 3 standards. These sections of highways will be deducted from your Class 3 mileage and transferred to the Class 4 section where they will be noted by an asterisk. These sections are still Class 3 by law, but are Class 4 functionally, therefore not eligible for Town Highway State Aid until brought up to Class 3 standards.

SELECTMEN PRESENT JOHN NEWTON, ROBERT O'BRIEN, BRUCE CHAPIN, DAVID HAMILTON.

PUBLIC PRESENT ROBERT LILES, PETER NEWTON, CHARLIE PECK, TARA BROWN, AMY SEESE, MARGO SEESE, JOYCE PELOS, HERBERT STARK, LORRAINE STARK, PETER ANDUS, AND RALPH COLEMAN.

1. MINUTES OF MAY 14th SELECTMEN MEETING WERE APPROVED.
2. SIGNED ORDERS NUMBER 124 thru 132.
3. SHERIFFS REPORT FOR 4/15 thru 28/90 WAS READ.
4. JOYCE PELOS CAME BEFORE THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN AND REPORTED ABOUT HER WATER PROBLEM, FEELS THE SAND PILE IS THE MAJOR PROBLEM WHICH HAS SALT IN IT. SHE STATED HER WELL 150 DEEP. SHE HAD HER WELL TESTED BY THE VERMONT DEPT. OF HEALTH LABORATORY. DATE THAT THE TEST WAS MADE WAS 2/28/90/ THE SELECTMEN ASKED HERBERT STARK OF HIS OPINION AND MR. STARK STATED THAT THE PROBLEM MIGHT BE A BROKEN SEAL OR CASING. THE SELECTMEN ASSURED MRS. PELOS THAT THEY WOULD LOOK INTO THE MATTER.
5. AMY SEESE AND TARA BROWN CAME BEFORE THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN FOR THE TEENAGERS OF THE TOWN REQUESTING PERMISSION TO HOLD ONE OR TWO DANCES PER MONTH IN THE TOWN HALL. IF THE SELECTMEN GIVE THEIR APPROVAL THEY WOULD LIKE THE FIRST DANCE JUNE 29, 1990. THEY WILL BRING THEIR PROPOSAL TO THE SELECTMEN AT THE JUNE 11th MEETING.
6. PETER NEWTON CAME BEFORE THE SELECTMEN WITH A REQUEST FROM THE TOWN OF JAMAICA TO INITIATE THE LEGAL PROCEEDINGS TO THROW UP TOWN ROAD NUMBER 12 WHICH NOW IS A TRAIL. THE TOWN OF JAMAICA SELECTMEN MIGHT HAVE TO MEET JOINTLY WITH THE SELECTMEN OF WINDHAM. SEEING THAT THE TRAIL LIES BOTH TOWNS.
7. RALPH COLEMAN CAME BEFORE THE SELECTMEN ASKING THAT IF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ZBA COULD GET A KEY TO THE FRONT DOOR. THE SELECTMEN VOTED TO ISSUE A KEY TO RALPH COLEMAN.
8. SELECTMEN DISCUSS THE SIDE WALK SITUATION IT WAS NOTED THAT REPAIRS ARE BADLY NEEDED IN FRONT OF JAMAICA HOUSE, TOWN HALL, AND FROM THE CHURCH DOWN TO CLARA ROBINSON'S DRIVEWAY. JOHN NEWTON AND BRUCE CHAPIN WILL CHECK OUT THE SIDEWALKS AND REPORT BACK THEIR FINDINGS AT THEIR NEXT REGULAR MEETING.
9. ROBERT LILES REPORTED THAT GLADYS BROOKS, ALLEN MONROE, RAYMOND LANDMAN, STEPHEN CLARK, MARY ADAMS, JENNIFER CONNOR, CHARLES MURRAY, MARK WORTHEN ARE WILLING TO HELP OUT ON THE BI-CENTENNIAL COMM.
