


§ 305. Measurement and inspection


- (a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.
- (b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.
- (c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.
- (d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.
- (e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.
- (f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.
- (g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.



TOWN OF ANDOVER SELECTBOARD CHAUNCEY ROAD EXTENSION/RELOCATION AGREEMENT TO CLASSIFICATION

The Selectboard has been requested to issue a ruling regarding the classification of Chauncey Road and its related sections that have been relocated and extended.

The current location of what is commonly known as Chauncey Road and Chauncey Road Extension has been reviewed by the Selectboard. Town records, Selectboard Minutes, and the testimony of some Chauncey Road residents have all been taken into consideration.

We can find no documentation that clearly, legally establishes the Town's acceptance of this extended and relocated section of Chauncey Road as a town highway.

However, past Selectboard minutes indicate that it was the intent of a prior Town of Andover Selectboard to accept this as a Town Road. Also, the town has been maintaining the section of road in question for over twelve years. It seems logical that after more than a dozen years of public maintenance — of "dedication and acceptance", the defacto alteration/discontinuance of the old path around the elbow by the old culvert and its replacement by the present traveled path should be accepted.

In light of these facts, the Selectboard moves to officially reclassify Chauncey Road and the extended/relocated .35 mile section, as a Class 3 town highway in its entirety.



June 7, 1800 a four rod wide road was surveyed that included much of present Chauncey Road as well as its former continuation eastward to meet Thompson Road. (ATR 1-206)

That same day a four rod wide road was surveyed from near the cellarhole in front of Salazars' house to meet the first mentioned road (above) near the old culvert approximately 280' north of the Chauncey Road Extension sign. (ATR 1-206) David French then lived at the Salazar site. Both of these roads are mostly lined by stonewalls on both sides.

September 26, 1803 a three rod wide road was surveyed from the Salazar site westerly to intersect Finn Hill Road. (ATR 1-210) Much of this road is lined by stonewalls - especially at its eastern end near Salazars'.

May 10, 1809 the first survey above was altered at its south end to create the present path of Chauncey Road (well south of Chauncey's house). (ATR 2-202)

May 8, 1822 the road by Isaac Gibson's house [Salazar site] was discontinued - apparently all the way from the old culvert to Finn Hill Road. (ATR 2-225) I surmise the house had been abandoned or perhaps burned.

June 21, 1825 a two rod wide road (not a pent road) was surveyed pretty much within the path of the second 1800 survey noted above from the Salazar site to near the old culvert. (ATR 2-246)

That same day part of the Chauncey-Thompson Road was pented. (ATR 2-293)

April 21, 1826 there appears the apparent same penting as on June 21, 1825. (ATR 2-293)

April 25, 1826 part of the Chauncey-Thompson Road (eastern section) was discontinued, and part was pented. (ATR 2-293) June 15, 1826 the balence of Chauncey Road was pented. (ATR 2-295)

November 3, 1832 Chauncey Road (and probably the link to Thompson Road) was again made an open road at three rods wide. (ATR 3-5)

April 18, 1846 a new two rod wide road was surveyed (probably a bit south of the former section linking Chauncey and Thompson Roads). This was a pent road with a gate near the old culvert. (ATR 3-256) This survey refers to the road from Benja Baldwin (at Chauncey's) and running to Thomas Ross (at Salazars').

February 21, 1850 the pent road of April 18, 1846 was discontinued. (ATR 3-277)

Doton's 1856 map shows the road out to ? Mchustry? (Salazar site).

Walling 1860 map shows the road out to Salazars'.

Beers' 1869 map shows the road out to J.U. Reed (Salazars')

Beers' 1869 map shows the road out to J.U. Reed (Salazar site) and gives a measure of 179 rods [.56 mile], but it is not clear what that measurement refers to... (fix the whole word

or only a portion

May 27/29, 1869 a two rod wide pent road was surveyed connecting Joseph U. Reed (Salazar site) to B. & F.C. Baldwins' pasture. (ATR 4-101/102) This is shown on Survey #16, but that must be checked carefully, as there may be a mistake on the survey.

Burgett's 1876 map shows the road to the Salazar site. Child's 1883 map shows the road to the Salazar site.

A 1916 soil map shows the road to the Salazar site - with a house distinctly shown.

A 1922 National Survey road atlas shows the road to the Salazar site.

[The great 1927 flood led to a new official measurement of Andover's open public roads for purposes of State Aid funding. The measurement for Chauncey Road was fixed at .3 mile. This distance was unchanged at the time of the 1974 reclassification of public roads occassioned by Act 63.]

Below are dates of Selectboard Minutes that refer to the subsequent rather confused discussion about extending Chauncey Road.





The Trail will continue as a right-of-way at the width originally described in the town records. Said road was layed out in the Andover Town Records Book 1, Page 208 and altered in Book 1, Page 209 and Book 1, Page 187.

This road was originally referred to as the north end of the Rutland – Newfane Road (the "old County Road). The course is essentially N-NW from Gates Road and is approximately 2.06 miles and is described as follows:

TOWN OF ANDOVER SELECTBOARD PUBLIC HEARING On RECLASSIFICATION OF ANCIENT ROAD TH #78 (South end of Blanchard Road to North end of Gates Road) June 28, 2010

Selectboard Members Present: Harold "Red" Johnson, Margaret van den Berg, Stephen Saunders, Sherry Willumitis and Paul Stumpf

Selectboard Members Absent: None

Public Present: Peter and Jason Zurblis, Richard Quinn and Linda Bargfrede, Clerk.

The meeting was called to Order at 6:30 p.m. by Red Johnson, Chairman.

After a brief introduction the meeting was handed over to Margaret van den Bergh. Margaret explained that all of the ancient roads the Selectboard had decided to keep fell into a default category, Class 4. The Selectboard now wants to reclassify the ancient class 4 roads to Legal Trails for non-motorized recreational use. She explained that landowners do not need to clear these trails and the town has no desire to fix them up.

She stated that the first of these roads is the road that goes from the end of Blanchard Road, across Marsh Hill Road, across Little Pond Road a short distance further to the northerly end of Gates Road. Margaret walked this road recently with Peter Farrar and said it is double walled most of the way and in some places is almost 6 rod wide. Discussion ensued. Peter Zurblis asked her to define the end of Blanchard Road. Margaret showed Mr. Zurblis on the map where the ancient road begins at approximately the edge of his property. Mr. Zurblis also asked about liability. Margaret stated that there is no liability to either the property owner or the town. In addition, she stated that if there was a parcel of land that was landlocked, the road could be used as a driveway. Mr. Zurblis had no objection to reclassifying the road. Richard Quinn also stated that he had no objection but he would like to know exactly where this road crosses Marsh Hill Road in proximity to his driveway. Both Mr. Zurblis and Mr. Quinn were asked to report any problems they encountered on any trails. It was noted that "drafts" of the Trails Ordinance would be available at the Town Office if anyone would like one. There was no interest in doing a site visit by those attending however, Margaret said she would get Peter Farrar and call Mr.Quinn to arrange to show him where this ancient road crosses Marsh Hill Road. All were agreeable to this.

At 6:52 p.m. Sherry moved to adjourn. Margaret seconded. So moved.

Letters with 30 days notice were mailed by certified mail to: Andover Planning Commission, James and Elizabeth Beliveau, William Buckens, Jr., Guy and Tracey Del Grande, Katherine Harrigan, Edward and Cynthia Kielblock, Emily Kraft, and the Vermont Department of Forests, Parks & Recreation. Inadvertently a letter was not mailed to Bruce and Sylvia Meyer but Bruce Meyer was present at the Hearing. On August 25th, 2010 a Notice of Public Hearing was printed in The Message for the Week and a Warning with 30 days notice was posted on July 26, 2010 at the Andover Town Office. On September 13, 2010 a site visit was conducted at 6:00 p.m. and following such Public Hearing was held. The minutes of that meeting were recorded. The Selectboard of Andover was allowed 60 days in which to prepare their decision.

After examining the premises and hearing any interested parties, the Selectboard has determined that it is in the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Andover to reclassify the above noted Ancient Road from Gates Road (TH #35) at the northerly point of property belonging to James and Elizabeth Beliveau in a southwesterly direction to an intersection near Route 11 and the Windham Town Line, to a Legal Trail. The Trail will continue as a right-of-way at the width originally described in the town records. Said road was layed out in the Andover Town Records Book 1, Page 208.

This road was originally referred to as the south end of the Rutland – Newfane Road (the "old county road"). The course is southerly approximately .95 miles to the town line near where Route 11 enters Windham.

A site visit was conducted prior to the Public Hearing. Those wishing to attend left the office at 6:05 p.m. and returned at 6:36 p.m. The hearing was called to order at 6:40 p.m. by Red Johnson, Chairman.

Red read the Notice of Public Hearing.

Bruce Meyer asked why he was not notified as an abutter when the information is on file at the town office. He stated that there are maps on file also concerning this matter. He also stated that Peter Farrar had done work on this years ago. Margaret told him the time for public input on ancient roads was last year. If an error was made it can be resolved. Andy Hill asked why the Board wants to change the classification on these roads from class 4 to legal trail. Paul Stumpf said there are two distinct factions in this matter. One group wanted to keep all ancient roads as is and the other wanted them all to go away. The Board wanted to come up somewhere in the middle. Margaret said some of the roads in question are obvious on the ground while others are surprises. Paul said the Board is trying to create an ordinance to keep the roads and limit the use. Jack Snyder stated that he had used O's Road for a long time. O's Road was obvious all the way through. He said the person that bought the property knew the road was there when he purchased it. Butch Jelley stated that anyone can use a Class 4 road but section 7 of the Trails Ordinance states that VAST must get permission from the Town as well as the landowner each year. His concern is that if property is sold the new landowner might not give permission. Julie Moore said she was representing Guy and Tracey Del Grande. She stated that she is buying the brick house and there are two trails coming through her yard. She doesn't want two trails in her yard. Julie Moore stated that the town maintained portion of O's road ends at her house. She wants to divert the old road around the house and have it reconnect further up the hill. Paul asked if she was unhappy with the proposed relocation. Julie said no. Bill Buckens asked the difference between a legal trail and a class 4 road. Margaret said the class 4 road can't be used in a way inconsistent with the way it has been used for the past 15 years. The legal trail will not be for motorized vehicles. There is no liability to the town or property owners. Mike Westine asked if the trails were for non-motorized or non-wheeled vehicles. Margaret said the exception is the current trails that are being used by VAST. Those trails can continue to be used by snowmobiles. Margaret also told those attending that it was the desire of the Selectboard to reclassify all of the Class 4 ancient roads to legal trails. Paul said any class 4 road can be upgraded by petition and agreement of the Selectboard. Sherry said many towns had let their old ancient roads go but we wanted to keep them for recreational purposes. Andy Hill said he does not understand the advantage of changing the classification from class 4 to legal trail.

Sherry said in the case of AR28 (O'S Road) the property owner, at his own expense, had the survey done to alter the course of the road. Andy Hill wanted a non-binding show of hands showing those in favor of leaving the roads as class 4. 12 hands were raised. Sean Snyder stated that last year on the rerouted section of the snowmobile trail on O's Road the terrain was steeper and not as passable. Bruce Meyer said last week 3 four wheel drive vehicles came down by his house. They had signs that said Vermont off Road Tours. He said it was evident that they had come down the discontinued portion of road that connects with the Marsh Cross Road. Nick Baker said this group of people were from the Woodstock area and had caused problems in several towns and had been taken to court and won their cases because they were traveling on old town roads which they can find easily on the internet and with a GPS. Nick said class 4 roads need to be posted in order to be able to keep these vehicles off the old roads.

Red asked if there was any further discussion concerning the reclassification of AR10 or the relocation and reclassification of AR28. He explained that the Selectboard has 60 days to present their Decision in this matter.

At 7:19 p.m. the meeting was adjourned.





Notes on the Tyrrell Road and its connection to present North Hill Road in Andover, Vermont:

In 1804 a road was laid out and surveyed that connected John Tyrrell's homestead with the old road west of present North Hill Road. (ATR 1-198)

This latter road has no survey of record though it is mentioned as the road "over the mountain" in 1786 (ATR 1-251). It appears in numerous deeds and is the one altered repeatedly in the early 1800's until the present path of North Hill Road was settled on.

Some of these alterations include: that of 1815 (ATR 2-209); that of 1820 (ATR 2-216); and that of 1826 (ATR 2-294/295).

As these changes were made, the impacted owners modified the Tirrell Road to maintain their connection with North Hill Road.

The latest surveyed link appears to be that of 1828 (ATR 2-384). BUT probably the most important evidence is from 1831 (ATR 2-418) when the Selectmen allowed the owners to erect a number of gates on the road in question between the Richmond farm (west end of Newton Road area) via the Derby farm (area of linking road surveyed in 1828) to the Carlton farm (along/east of present North Hill Road).

It should be noted the northerly part of the 1804 Tyrrell Road survey was discontinued in 1827 (ATR 2-297/298) to the area of the Richmond farm (off Newton Road).

The road linking Newton Road to North Hill Road was used for many years and most of it is walled and readily visable. It is in poorer shape on the south end owing to the various alterations involving North Hill Road and to some steep sections that have been badly washed out over the years - but the road referenced in 1831 has not been discontinued.

Margaret:

Perhaps it would help to include (if it hasn't been sent already) the sketched location of all of the Tyrrell Road - to show we are not talking about that entire survey. Also to include the c.1798 Isaac Allen Road (ATR 1-127) which may either be an alteration (practically) of the "over the mountain road", or the point where the Tyrrell Road connected with older roads in 1804 - the three roads come close together on paper and I suspect they merge on the ground.

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 P.M. by Red Johnson. Red stated that the purpose for the meeting was to hear public comment on the Selectboard's proposal to reclassify the ancient roads on the Warning to Legal Trails. He asked that people limit their comments to 5-6 minutes and that we discuss each road one at a time in the order listed on the Warning. He then turned the meeting over to Margaret van den Bergh.

General Discussion:

First Red thanked Peter Farrar for all the time he has put into the research of these ancient roads. She gave a brief history on the process of identifying and mapping our ancient roads which was mandated by the state. All of the ancient roads were classified as Class 4. In order to reduce the impact on the environment the Board agreed that these old roads should become Legal Trails and to accomplish this they enacted a Trails Ordinance to control the use of these trails. Margaret described an incident that occurred last fall where licensed vehicles were used on trails off Potash Brook Road which caused a lot of damage to that road. The Board wants to protect our ancient roads from further damage and making them Legal Trails is a way to accomplish that. The Vermont Department of Transportation and our Attorney advised us to do the reclassification. Once the Public Hearing is held the Selectboard has 60 days to make a Decision. Red stated that the Board is trying to balance between the landowner and the public. Class 4 roads are not maintained but they are open to vehicular traffic. Property owner's private access will remain, just not public access. There will be no motorized vehicles allowed on the proposed Legal Trails. Bob Soboleski asked if the road has not been used for 30 years why not just discontinue it to avoid liability to the property owner. Paul Stumpf stated that all the roads in question are ancient roads not actively used and some are hard to find but the Board has decided to keep them because they are used by hunters, hikers and other folks. He also stated that there is no liability to landowners for land that is being used recreationally in the State of Vermont. Don Edgar asked if the group that damaged the road last fall came in on a Class 4 road or a trail. Margaret stated that they came in from Chester on a Class 4 road. They were not ATVs. They were licensed 4 wheel drive vehicles. Bob Soboleski asked what kind of listing there would be with the State. Margaret said they would be identified on the Town Highway Map as Legal Trails. Paul said the Board had no intention to upgrade or maintain any of these trails. He also said if a group was started in town and they wanted

to cut some trees to make the trail more accessible they would have to come before the Selectboard for permission to do so. This would be done on a case by case basis. The public cannot alter these roads without permission.

There being no further general discussion Red proceeded to the items on the Warning.

1. AR #19 (TH #63) – South side of the Weston-Andover Road across from Popplewood to the Lewayne Forbes Homestead.

Dave Bargfrede asked if legal trails are not open to motorized vehicles how will people continue to access their fields and woodlots. Margaret stated that landowners can utilize these roads as in the past. Paul said landowners can drive wheeled vehicles on them as they always have.

2. AR #5 (TH #64) – Known as Broadway. From the south side of the above AR #19 to the Northwest end of Bridge #25 on Middletown Road.

No comments.

3. AR #24 (TH #66) – Middletown Road to Broadway north of the big culvert.

No comments.

4. AR #17 (TH #66) – From Broadway behind the Simonsville Cemetery to Hill Top Road.

No comments.

5. AR #7 (TH #77) – From the end of the Class 3 portion of Biancaniello Road to the Sullivan Homestead.

Tony Biancaniello asked if this road goes all the way to Ludlow. Margaret stated that this road does not go all the way into Ludlow. Tony stated that he is in favor of the reclassification.

6. AR #31 (TH #84) – From the northwest end of Bridge #6 in Boynton Hollow along the river to the Ludlow Town Line.

Margaret said this road starts on the Sydorowich side of the river and may cross the brook on to the Attiyeh property. Margaret read a letter from Jenny Attiyeh stating that she supports the reclassification. She hopes that this will prohibit the use of motorized vehicles on the trail, including snowmobiles. Bob Soboleski asked about snowmobile usage. Margaret stated that the trails that VAST has utilized prior to this reclassification will be grandfathered. They will not be able to access other trails without Selectboard permission. Don Edgar said this area is pristine land and traffic could escalate given these trails. He said we should try to protect the Williams River proper as much as possible. Margaret said reclassifying these from Class 4 to Legal Trails is the way to do that.

7. AR #15 (TH #73) – From the end of the Class 3 portion of Cobb Road to the East Hill Road directly across from Steinle Road.

Margaret said there was an error in the Warning. The Warning stated this road comes out directly across from Chauncey Road. It should have said Steinle Road. Mr. Lawrence said he doesn't know where this road is on his property. Margaret said it cuts by the Dougherty's driveway and skirts around the field. She said 1/3 is in the woods and the last 1/3 goes across Pond's field. Peter Farrar said there is just a description that says along the stonewall. Paul said the Board can work with Mr. Lawrence on future location.

8. AR #8 (TH #75) – From the end of Codere Road running approximately .20 miles in a southeasterly direction.

No comment.

9. AR #23 (TH #74) – Off the right side of Steinle Road approximately .10 miles from the intersection with East Hill Road and continuing in a southeasterly direction along the Potash Brook to the Chester Town Line.

The Board was asked if the trail could be opened up to ATVs by petition to the Selectboard. Margaret said she suppose it could.

10. AR #13 (Tirrell Road) – From the end of Newton Road in a south and easterly direction running approximately 1.27 miles connecting to the North Hill road north of the Spruce Drive intersection.

Bob Soboleski said why not just disregard these roads instead of reclassifying. The State passed this on to the towns because of the legal battles. Margaret said many of these old roads were eliminated. The ones they kept had the most value or were connectors and not close to houses. Margaret said there is a good survey for this particular road and it can easily be found with a GPS.

General Discussion:

Bob Soboleski asked what will happen down the line – will there be signs and a cost to taxpayers. Margaret said there would be no upkeep and therefore no cost to the town. Paul Stumpf said that if a group got together to work on a trail it might be good. Don Edgar thought the State might want some input. Margaret said the trails can be posted just like other roads. Tony Biancaniello wanted to know if cars can park by your house. Paul said it would be the same as now with hunters. There have been no complaints to date as far as he knows. Tony asked if there are other roads or if this is it. Margaret said after 2015 anything else would be gone. Nathan Pond said he puts up electric fence and wondered if this will stop his grazing program. Chris Bernier stated that anyone can petition the Selectboard at a later date to have a trail thrown up. Any zoning issues would need to be a public process. Bob Soboleski asked if the town gets any additional money from the state for trails. Margaret said the State gives us no money for Class 4 roads or trails. Bob also asked if there is a detailed map available. Margaret said the State is creating one.

Site Visit:

Bob Sydorowich asked about site visits. Margaret said site visits are available now if wanted or anyone can call Paul Stumpf, Peter Farrar or her for a site visit in better weather. No one requested a site visit at this time.

Margaret restated that the Selectboard has 60 days to make their decision to reclassify or keep as is. Once that decision is made the information will be forwarded to the State.

At 1:55 p.m. the meeting was adjourned.

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 P.M. by Red Johnson. Red stated that Act 178 started the Ancient Roads Project. He explained the process from the research of town records, to mapping by the state. He stated that many of the old roads had been eliminated as they were basically alterations of roads and ran parallel with existing roads or were roads that really went nowhere or went through someone's homes. He explained the Selectboard's position of wanting to reclassify the remaining Class 4 roads listed above to Legal Trails to be preserved for recreational purposes. He stated that the Selectboard had adopted an ordinance to assist in controlling the use of these legal trails and prohibiting the use of motorized vehicles on these trails. He said there had been many public hearing and town meeting discussions on this topic over the past several years.

Red stated that we would discuss one road at a time. He asked those wishing to speak to identify themselves for the record and to keep their comments as brief as possible to allow everyone time to present their comments. Red then introduced Margaret van den Bergh, the member of the Selectboard spearheading this project.

Margaret stated that the question before us tonight is to hear public comment on the reclassification of the above noted Class 4 roads to Legal Trails. She stated that if these public rights-of-way were left as Class 4 they were open to vehicular traffic. She also stated that even if the roads are reclassified landowners will still have access as they always have.

Margaret then referred to the warning as follows:

1. TH #82 – South side of Dorman Road across Trout Brook to Lewayne Forbes woodlot.

No comments.

2. TH #62 – From the end of the Class 3 portion of Trombley Road in a north and easterly direction to the Chester Town Line.

No comments.

3. TH #72 – From the south side of East Hill Road just east of the Paavo Kalinen Homestead in a southerly direction to the Albrecht house.

Margaret stated that this road is being used as the driveway to the Albrecht house. She said the Albrechts were in favor of the reclassification. There were no other comments.

4. TH #81 – From the west end of the natural bridge on Newton Road in a south and westerly direction.

Darrin Stowell asked if this road could be reclassified back to Class 4 by way of a petition in the future. Margaret stated that is a possibility. Tyler Keith said he had used this road for years with his registered ATV; will this mean he can't ride this road anymore. Margaret stated that the road will not be open to the general public but you can still ride there with landowner permission.

5. TH #71 – Beginning approximately 0.28 miles south of the Class 3 portion of Stigers Road; thence running in an easterly direction approximately 0.50 miles to the Chester Town Line.

Margaret said part of this road is used by VAST. She said VAST was grandfathered under the Trails Ordinance. Robyn Whiting asked if this road intersects with the powerline. Margaret said it could. Lee Forbes said it does not directly connect with Boone Road. Fiona Morton said it is hard to pinpoint these trails because the map does not show parcels or houses.

6. TH #67 – Beginning on Broadway approximately 0.34 miles south of the intersection with TH #63 and continuing in a southwesterly direction across Middletown Road for a total distance of 0.43 miles.

No comments.

7. TH #69 – Beginning on the east side of Route 11 across from the Old Parmelee Road in an east southeasterly direction approximately 0.76 miles where it intersects with TH #68.

Margaret stated that additional research had determined that this road does not intersect with TH #68 (Boone Road). In actuality this roads intersects with TH #36 (Howard Hill Road) north of the Boone Road intersection with Howard Hill. Ted Reeves, representing Okemo Golf, stated that he did not oppose the reclassification but he wanted to go on record as wanting to reserve the right of the property owner in case there is ever a decision to develop the land this road is on in the future. He stated that there are currently no plans what-so-ever in that regard but he wanted to be sure that the road could be reclassified back via a petition in the future if plans change. Margaret stated that would be possible. Ted said he would like the same comments applied to item #10, (TH #68).

8. TH #76 – Beginning in the eastern side of the Okemo State Forest and continuing in a southerly direction across the end of Dorman Road for a total length of approximately 0.71 miles.

A letter in favor of the reclassification had been submitted by Susan Kelly which was read for the record. There were no other comments.

9. TH #14 – Beginning at the end of the Class 3 portion of Jarvis Road and continuing in a northerly direction for approximately 0.69 miles.

No comments.

10. TH #68 – Beginning on the east side of Route 11 approximately 0.168 miles south of State Bridge #35 and continuing in a east southeasterly direction to the Howard Hill Road (TH #36) directly across from Boone Road(TH #18) for a total distance of .89 miles.

Butch Jelley said he would like someone to show him where this road is. He has never seen it. He said you need to know where it starts to begin with. Margaret said the Board may work on discontinuing this road anyway. She said it is very steep and really doesn't go anywhere. There is another road (TH # 69) which is a better trail in this same area. Butch asked how they can make a judgment when they can't find the road on the ground. Margaret said you can use surveys in the old records even though you can't find it on the ground. Peter Farrar said he would be willing to show Butch the old surveys. Ted Reeves reiterated his comments as noted above in #7. Margaret said we need to act to reclassify as the first step in the process.

11. TH #79 – Beginning approximately .20 miles south of Route 11 at the Chester Town Line and continuing in a west northwesterly direction across Stigers Road for a total distance of approximately 0.55 miles.

Fiona Morton said it looks very close to their house on the map; perhaps into their driveway. She asked about a site visit. Margaret said they could do one. Margaret said there is a mechanism to alter a road but it would require a survey. Fiona asked about landowner liability. Margaret stated that there is no liability to property owners if someone is hurt while using one of these old roads. Paul Stumpf reiterated that there has never been a case where the landowner was found liable for injury to someone using the land recreationally in Vermont. Margaret stated that this does not mean that you can intentionally create a danger to those using the roads.

12. TH #70 – Beginning on the north side of Boone Road approximately 0.15 miles west of the Chester Town Line and continuing in a northeasterly direction for approximately 0.14 miles.

Margaret said this is access to the town forest. There were no further comments.

13. TH #83 – Beginning at the west end of the natural bridge on Newton Road and continuing in a west northwesterly direction intersecting with the western end of Newton Road.

David Bargfrede said this old road is in the deed to his property as a right-of-way. He is concerned that if the road is reclassified to a trail it will lessen the value of his property. Margaret said the right-of-way is retained even if the road is reclassified. David said he thought it would be reasonable to leave the lower end of this road Class 4 and reclassify the upper portion to legal trail status. Margaret said reclassification would prevent the general public from driving on this road. She said anyone can drive on a Class 4 road. Darrin Stowell stated that by easement by necessity David would still have access. Milton Block asked why the Selectboard was so against leaving this a Class 4 road. Margaret said because Class 4 can be accessed by vehicles. Robyn Whiting asked the Board how they determined which roads to

reclassify and which ones to leave as Class 4. Margaret said she would contact the town attorney and the Board would consider David Bargfrede's request.

14. TH #43 – From the west end of Dorman Road in a northwesterly direction for approximately 0.08 miles to the Okemo State Forest.

Margaret stated that the State of Vermont wants access to Okemo State Forest via this road. Eventually they would like to create a space for parking for those wishing to access the state forest. The State of Vermont can certainly use this road as access. Fiona Morton asked about parking. She was concerned that people would park in her driveway because the road near her house may go directly through her driveway. Margaret said people can park on the public right-of-way.

15. TH #61 – Beginning on the southwest side of Weston-Andover Road approximately 0.22 miles south of the intersection with East Hill Road and thence; turning in a north and westerly direction then southerly for a total distance of approximately 0.14 miles.

Pat and Dan Hearn asked how this road is classified as Class 4. Essentially this road is an access to the Hearn house. Dan asked about maintenance. Margaret said the town has no responsibility to maintain a Class 4 road.

Margaret asked if there were any further comments. There were none. Fiona Morton and Butch Jelley had requested site visits during the course of the hearing. These will be conducted by appointment.




