The VTrans Mapping Section requested additional documentation regarding the legal establishment of TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) in a letter to the Town of Barnard Selectboard dated January 22, 2014. (A copy of this letter is enclosed.) To date, no additional documentation has been received by the VTrans Mapping Section and it is necessary to drop these roads from the Mileage Certificate and Town Highway Map of Barnard, until a subsequent time that documentation is provided as evidence of legal establishment, either through the statutory laying out process or through "dedication and acceptance."

The VTrans Mapping Section is acting under the authority provided in the following statutory provisions:

19 V.S.A. § 305(a) & (e). Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency



for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.

The Agency of Transportation has been unable to verify the existence of the southern section of TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) being 0.73 miles from the intersection with TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) south to the intersection of TH-48 (Hayes Brook Road) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) being 0.67 miles in length from the records provided by the Town. Accordingly, there is insufficient information available to determine that these roads are town highways under Vermont law and the VTrans Mapping Section is dropping the roads from the Mileage Certificate and Town Highway Map.

A revised Certificate of Highway Mileage has been attached noting the reduction in Class 4 Town Highway Mileage due to the removal of the 0.73 mile section of TH-90 and 0.67 miles of TH-91. The total reduction in Class 4 mileage is 1.40 miles.

The VTrans Mapping Section has dropped the southern section of TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) being 0.73 miles from the intersection with TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) south to the intersection of TH-48 (Hayes Brook Road) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) being 0.67 miles in length from Mileage Certificate and Town Highway Map, due to insufficient information available to determine that these roads are town highways under Vermont law.

A request for additional documentation as evidence of legal establishment was made in a letter dated January 22, 2014, with a follow-up letter on March 6, 2015 (attached) regarding these sections of road. Information was not forthcoming and the sections of highway were dropped from the map.

The Town of Barnard may resubmit these sections of road with the proper documentation showing legal establishment through the statutory process or via "dedication and acceptance" with the 2016 Mileage Certificate.

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.

(d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.

(e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.

(f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description, or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.

(g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

The VTrans Mapping Unit would like to follow-up with the Town of Barnard regarding several roads that were provided with the 2010 Certificate of Highway Mileage, in which VTrans has received questions from Patrick Berry, Commissioner of Fish & Wildlife at the Agency of Natural Resources in a letter dated February 24, 2012. Following the receipt and review of the letter from Commissioner Berry and review of the documentation provided in the original submittal of the 2010 Certificate of Highway Mileage from the Town of Barnard, we came to the conclusion that 3 of the highways needed clarification and the highway establishment was in question.

The VTrans Mapping Unit requested on May 5, 2012 additional documentation regarding the legal establishment of TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115), TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) that were added to the Mileage Certificate and Town Highway Map in 2010. No additional documentation or clarification regarding these roads was provided by the Town, with the exception of a letter from the Town Attorney stating "the town still believes that these roads are properly identified." There remain significant questions and concerns regarding the legal establishment of these roads as town highways, and I seek clarification and additional documentation provided and questions raised during review of these documents are articulated below.

VTrans Mapping is acting under the authority provided in the following statutory provisions:

19 V.S.A. § 305(a) & (e). Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the



agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. The roads that VTrans sought additional information for included TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115), TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120). I have reviewed the surveys and documentation provided by the Town again for these 3 roads. From the documentation that was provided by Barnard with the 2010 Mileage Certificate, there seems to be different alignments between the highlighted sections on the "Town of Barnard" map from April 1, 2005 and the individual surveys provided for each highway.

Here are the outstanding issues that cannot be verified through the use of the information thus far provided by the Town of Barnard:

TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115)

There are 2 surveys that were submitted as evidence of the laying out of Gardner Road, BRC-115, being Page 49, Entry A and Page 71, Entry A. Both of the surveys were plotted and there is a question to the origin of each of the survey traverses. In the initial review by VTrans in 2010, it was assumed that both surveys originate near the same point, being near the house of Alanson Packard, also referred to in the ANR documentation as Alonzo Packard. This point is assumed to be the site of the house noted as A. Packard in the southwest corner of District No. 9 on the 1869 FW Beers Atlas of Windsor County.

The transcription in the 2010 Barnard Mileage Certificate submittal for Page 71, Entry A notes an Alanson Parkhurst, but I believe there is an error in transcription and this should be Alanson Packard, as it seems to be written in the photocopy of the original document.

When plotted with both alignments meeting at the A. Packard house, there

matches the alignment of TH-44 or TH-45.

I request documentation that provides evidence of the legal establishment of this road as a highway.

The Agency of Transportation has been unable to verify the existence of the southern section of TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) being 0.73 miles from the intersection with TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) south to the intersection of TH-48 (Hayes Brook Road) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) being 0.67 miles in length from the records provided by the Town. Accordingly, there is insufficient information available to determine that these roads are town highways under Vermont law and the VTrans Mapping intends to drop these roads from the Town Highway Map and Mileage Certificate unless the Town of Barnard provides additional documentation that demonstrates the legal establishment of these roads as highways. In accordance with 19 V.S.A. § 305(a) the Town will have one year from the date of this letter to provide that information. VTrans Mapping also requests additional clarification and documentation regarding TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115), due to questions on the origin of the surveys that were provided.

TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119)

There are 3 surveys that have been submitted as evidence of the laying out of TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119), Page 22, Entry A, Page 29, Entry A, and Page 71, Entry B. In review of these surveys and the section of BRC-119 that was added in 2010, some of the section seems to be accounted for, but there is also a section that no surveys seem to match. The survey Page 22, Entry A seems to match the alignment of TH-44 or TH-45 and doesn't seem to reflect any of the alignment of BRC-119 as highlighted on the full size map of Barnard's highway additions. The survey on Page 29, Entry A, seems to match the curve section of BRC-119 as it connects onto the end of TH-45. The last survey is a short section of 610.5 feet (37 rods) and I am uncertain to where this section connects, as I lack the primary documentation to the location of Marshal Townshend's or to which school house is being referenced. There does not seem to be any documentation to support the laying out of the southern section of BRC-119 from the intersection with BRC-120 to the intersection with TH-48.

I request documentation that provides evidence of the legal establishment of this road as a highway.

TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120)

The survey that is used in the 2010 Mileage Certificate submittal for BRC-120, Page 22, Entry A when plotted represents a highway that is laid out in an alignment that trends from the northeast to the southwest. The alignment of TH-91 (BRC-120) was added from the highlighted map with an alignment that trends from the northwest to the southeast. Essentially, the survey does not represent the alignment of the highway that was added. The alignment of the survey better

There does not seem to be any documentation to support the laying out of the southern section of BRC-119 from the intersection with BRC-120 to the intersection with TH-48.

I request documentation that provides evidence of the legal establishment of this road as a highway.

TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120)

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The survey that is used in the 2010 Mileage Certificate submittal for BRC-120, Page 22, Entry A when plotted represents a highway that is laid out in an alignment that trends from the northeast to the southwest. The alignment of TH-91 (BRC-120) was added from the highlighted map with an alignment that trends from the northwest to the southeast. Essentially, the survey does not represent the alignment of the highway that was added. The alignment of the survey better agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

The roads that VTrans sought additional information for included TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115), TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120). I have reviewed the surveys and documentation provided by the Town again for these 3 roads. From the documentation that was provided by Barnard with the 2010 Mileage Certificate, there seems to be different alignments between the highlighted sections on the "Town of Barnard" map from April 1, 2005 and the individual surveys provided for each highway.

Here are the outstanding issues that cannot be verified through the use of the formation thus far provided by the Town of Barnard:

TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115)

There are 2 surveys that were submitted as evidence of the laying out of Gardner Road, BRC-115, being Page 49, Entry A and Page 71, Entry A. Both of the surveys were plotted and there is a question to the origin of each of the survey traverses. In the initial review by VTrans in 2010, it was assumed that both surveys originate near the same point, being near the house of Alanson Packard, also referred to in the ANR documentation as Alonzo Packard. This point is assumed to be the site of the house noted as A. Packard in the southwest corner of District No. 9 on the 1869 FW Beers Atlas of Windsor County.

The transcription in the 2010 Barnard Mileage Certificate submittal for Page 71, Entry A notes an Alanson Parkhurst, but I believe there is an error in transcription and this should be Alanson Packard, as it seems to be written in the photocopy of the original document.

When plotted with both alignments meeting at the A. Packard house, there

matches the alignment of TH-44 or TH-45.

I request documentation that provides evidence of the legal establishment of this road as a highway.

The Agency of Transportation has been unable to verify the existence of the southern section of TH-90 (Charles French Road, BRC-119) being 0.73 miles from the intersection with TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) south to the intersection of TH-48 (Hayes Brook Road) and TH-91 (Old Hathorn Road, BRC-120) being 0.67 miles in length from the records provided by the Town. Accordingly, there is insufficient information available to determine that these roads are town highways under Vermont law and the VTrans Mapping intends to drop these roads from the Town Highway Map and Mileage Certificate unless the Town of Barnard provides additional documentation that demonstrates the legal establishment of these roads as highways. In accordance with 19 V.S.A. § 305(a) the Town will have one year from the date of this letter to provide that information. VTrans Mapping also requests additional clarification and documentation regarding TH-88 (Gardner Road, BRC-115), due to questions on the origin of the surveys that were provided.
