SEC. 305. MEASUREMENT OF HIGHWAYS

 $(\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}(\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}), \mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}(\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}})) = (\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}(\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}), \mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}(\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{A}}))$

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(a) A representative of the agency in the presence of the selectmen or their designee shall measure and inspect the class i, 2 and 3 town highways in each town at least once every ten years. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class, if the town falls, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectmen shall, after review by a representative of the agency, file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2 and 3 town highways, then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2 or 3 town-highways are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency.

(d) The selectmen of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description or classification of a town highway may appeal to the board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the board.

Title 19, V. S. A. Section 2502 Added 1985

Sec. 2502. TOWN SCENIC ROADS: DESIGNATION AND DISCONTINUANCE

(a) On recommendation of the planning commission of a municipality, or on the initiative of the legislative body of a municipality, a legislative body may, after
one public hearing warned for the purpose, designate or discontinue any
town highway or portion of a town highway, as a town scenic highway. Such action by the
legislative body may be petitioned by the registered voters of the municipality pursuant to the provisions of section 1973 of Title 24.

(b) A town scenic road may be reconstructed or improved in a manner consistent with the standards established by the transportation board, pursuant to section 425 of Title iO. A class I, 2 or 3 scenic highway shall still be eligible to receive aid pursuant to the provisions of this title.

(c) The legislative body of a municipality may appeal for a variance from standards promulgated by the transportation board. In these appeals the board's decision shall be final.

DISCONTINUANCE OF HIGHWAY NOTICE a portion of Sharon Town Highway #24

"The Sharon Board of Selectmen proposes to discontinue a portion of Town Highway number 24, an old abandoned section of town highway, whose total length approximates 480 feet. This highway was created when Town Highway #5 was realigned at which time this loop, which was the old road bed, was designated as TH #24.

Town Highway #24 begins approximately .7 miles easterly of the town line where IH #24 bears off to the north east along and abutting land owned by Adolph Schlerf and Irene Schlerf, it then crosses a bridge approximately 135 feet from the intersection of IH #5, and the highway continues easterly along the north stream bank parallel to IH #5 for approximately 345 feet, through land owned by Wilfred Moore and Vivian Moore, until it rejoins IH #5 just past the large culvert under IH #5. The portion of IH #24 to be discontinued begins at the Northerly end of the bridge and proceeds approximately 345 feet along the northerly stream bank until it rejoins the existing IH #5.

The Sharon Board of Selectmen has by resolution of June 19, 1990 set the date of Monday August 6, 1990 at 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of examining said section of highway and thereafter meet at 7:30 p.m. that same evening at the Sharon Town Offices to hear interested parties regarding the discontinuance of said highway section."

The Special Meeting for the purpose of examining the discontinuance of a portion of Town Highway #24 convened at 6:00 PM, August 6:1990 at the westerly intersection of TH#24 with TH#5.

The Selectmen walked the beginning portion of the highway and observed the balance of the highway from a position on TH#5. No other persons were in attendance at the highway site. The Selectmen observed that: the portion proposed for discontinuance is a short loop to the northerly side of TH#5 which was created when TH#5 was realigned and streightened; the old road bed is recognizable as having been a road; the old road bed is overgrown; the section is impassible by vehicles; and access to the Howe Hill Cemetary requires usage of the westerly portion of TH#24.

The Meeting reconvened at 7:30 PM, August 6, 1990 in the Sharon Town Offices. In attendance were:

The Selectmen and others in attentance discussed the observations, history, and status of the portion of TH#24 proposed for discontinuance. No comments or testimony objecting to the discontinuance was heard.

The Selectmen of Sharon Found that:

- 1) The portion proposed for discontinuance is a short loop to the northerly side of TH#5 which was created when TH#5 was realigned and streightened.
- 2) The old road bed is recognizable as having been a road.
- 3) The old road bed is overgrown.
- 4) The section is impassible by vehicles.

- 5) Access to the Howe Hill Cemetary requires usage of the westerly portion of TH#24.
- 6) The portion of TH #24 needed for access to the Howe Hill Cemetary is not included within this discontinuance action and will remain designated as Town Highway #24.

With the above observations, testimony and findings in mind, Richard Praetsch, Selectman, made the following motion:
