19 V.S.A. § 305. Measurement and inspection

§ 305. Measurement and inspection

(a) After reasonable notice to the selectboard, a representative of the agency may measure and inspect the class 1, 2, and 3 town highways in each town to verify the accuracy of the records on file with the agency. Upon request, the selectboard or their designee shall be permitted to accompany the representative of the agency during the measurement and inspection. The agency shall notify the town when any highway, or portion of a highway, does not meet the standards for its assigned class. If the town fails, within one year, to restore the highway or portion of the highway to the accepted standard, or to reclassify, or to discontinue, or develop an acceptable schedule for restoring to the accepted standards, the agency for purposes of apportionment under section 306 of this title shall deduct the affected mileage from that assigned to the town for the particular class of the road in question.

(b) Annually, on or before February 10, the selectboard shall file with the town clerk a sworn statement of the description and measurements of all class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails then in existence, including any special designation such as a throughway or scenic highway. When class 1, 2, 3, or 4 town highways, trails, or unidentified corridors are accepted, discontinued, or reclassified, a copy of the proceedings shall be filed in the town clerk's office and a copy shall be forwarded to the agency.

(c) All class 1, 2, 3, and 4 town highways and trails shall appear on the town highway maps by July 1, 2015.

(d) At least 45 days prior to first including a town highway or trail that is not clearly observable by physical evidence of its use as a highway or trail and that is legally established prior to February 10, 2006 in the sworn statement required under subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of the municipality shall provide written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a duly warned meeting of the legislative body to persons owning lands through which a highway or trail passes or abuts.

(e) The agency shall not accept any change in mileage until the records required to be filed in the town clerk's office by this section are received by the agency. A request by a municipality to the agency for a change in mileage shall include a description of the affected highway or trail, a copy of any surveys of the affected highway or trail, minutes of meetings at which the legislative body took action with respect to the changes, and a current town highway map with the requested deletions and additions sketched on it. A survey shall not be required for class 4 town highways that are legally established prior to February 10, 2006. All records filed with the agency are subject to verification in accordance with subsection (a) of this section.

(f) The selectboard of any town who are aggrieved by a finding of the agency concerning the measurement, description or classification of a town highway may appeal to the transportation board by filing a notice of appeal with the executive secretary of the transportation board.

(g) The agency shall provide each town with a map of all of the highways in that town together with the mileage of each class 1, 2, 3, and 4 highway, as well as each trail, and such other information as the agency deems appropriate.

Call to Order: Mr. Arrison called the Weathersfield Select Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Reconvene Ancient Road Meeting from January 7, 2010. Mr. Arrison reconvened the Public Hearing to discuss Road A.

Mr. Melen said a letter was from Mr. Mark, the owner of Wellwood Orchard asking the Town to discontinue the Crown Point Road. Mr. Arrison asked Mr. Melen to put this letter in the file to be addressed in the future when we discuss reclassifying Crown Point Road. Mr. Fuller said when we discuss Crown Point Road next time we should walk it.

Mr. Arrison said the section between Perkins Hill Road and Cady Hill Road wasn't acted on last time because not all the landowners were notified.

Mr. Eaton said the trail is clearly on their property so he asked what an abutter is. Mrs. Bearse said an abutter has to touch or be very close to the road and therefore since it is all on the Eaton's property the Porter's and the Hall's were not notified. Mr. Fuller said one stone wall is the property line and the stone wall abuts the Hall's and the Porter's.

Mr. Eaton said he and his wife respect everyone's intent and they have never disallowed anyone access to it as a trail. He said their feeling is this needs to be thrown up and then have future discussion about the use.

Mr. Cobb made the motion to not list this section of Road A, Mr. Fuller seconded the motion.

Mr. Todd said the previous motions were all in the affirmative. Mr. Cobb amended his motion to list the road beginning at the intersection of Cady Hill and Weathersfield Center Road and proceeding in a southwesterly direction to the intersection Perkins Hill Road and Grout Road. Mr. Fuller seconded the motion which was defeated 0-5.

Mr. Melen said now the Board will sign the annual certificate of mileage at the first meeting in February and will submit this latest list with it. Mr. Cobb said this will now require more work later on. Mr. Melen said the Board has five years to revisit any and all roads that haven't been listed. Mr. Todd said he would like to suggest having some input from the Planning Commission in the future.

Mr. Korbet said he watched the Public Hearing on SAPA and there was discussion on Carley Road and no one was sure what action Springfield had taken. He gave the Board a copy of a map from Springfield when they downgraded their section to a trail in 1957.

Mr. Cobb made the motion to close the Public Hearing. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

Comments from Citizens: none

Constable Report: Ms. J L said there was confusion with the contract from the Claremont Animal Hospital – they charge a \$15 fee automatically for an intake fee in addition to the fee to keep the animal if they keep the animal. The Town was paying the \$15 but never charging it back.

Mr. Boyer made the motion to increase the impound fee by \$15. Mr. Cobb seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

Mr. Arrison asked what happened to motion camera that was supposed to be ordered.

Budget Workshop

General Fund: Mr. Melen said with the changes from last night (including the decrease in compensation for the incoming Manager) the budget is now in balance and the tax rate would go down. Last years tax rate was .202, this year would be .199.

There was discussion on ways of potentially saving money. Mr. Arrison said even if it doesn't get done before the budget is passed, it could be discussed throughout the year to keep the budget in check.

There was discussion again on how to provide the taxpayers with the town report - it will be brought up at the town meeting whether they should be printed and mailed or just printed and possibly even available in electronic format.

Mr. Fuller said the legal expenses total up to over \$18,000 last year and half way through this year we are over \$7,000. He feels we are spending too much money in Attorney fees. Consensus was to be

Mr. Boyer made the motion to accept the general fund budget for Fiscal Year 2011 for \$965,948, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Highway Fund: Mr. Melen said no changes on this since two meetings ago - at this time it represents an increase due to paving. But, it will be a about a one percent reduction in the tax rate because we will utilize other revenue.

Discussion on paving the Airport Road even with a grant we would have to spend \$20,000 (20% match).

After discussion on paving and it being noted we have told people we are not paving unless the paving is an article passed by the voters **Mr. Fuller made the motion** to remove the paving match for the Airport Road from the highway budget, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Motion passed 4 - 1 (Mr. Arrison the dissenting vote). The consensus of the Budget Committee is they agree Airport Road should not be paved before the other ones in Town that we have already started (Stoughton Pond Road and Tenney Hill Road).

Mr. Boyer made the motion to accept the Highway budget for Fiscal Year for \$1,040,619, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Long Term Debt schedule was changed, added \$25,000 to cold plane Weathersfield Center Road.

Mr. Arrison asked the reason to get rid of the medium duty truck at this time since the miles are pretty low. Mr. Hazeltine said we haven't put a transmission in it yet; it has 83,000 miles on it and will need a new transmission soon. He said the plow and plow hitch as it is completely gone – it doesn't make sense to put a new plow on this. Mr. Fuller said given the history of owning vehicles we don't really want we should trade this instead of sitting on it.

Animal Control Officer: reports received (three months), no discussion Highway: report received, no discussion Land Use Administrator: report received, no discussion Solid Waste: report received, no discussion Cash Flow: looks good at this time

New Business

Town Highway Bridge Recertification: Mr. Cobb made the motion to authorize the Town Manager to sign the Town Highway Bridge Certification, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mr. Arrison asked to have the spelling of our Towns name corrected. Motion passed unanimously.

Pole Relocation on Thrasher Road: Mr. Arrison said they are replacing poles and asked how can we be assured the second pole is removed? Mr. Melen said the problem revolves around a mandatory renter of the pole ie: the cable company. Mr. Arrison asked to put a cover letter with the approval asking them to remove the poles within one year. Mr. Cobb made the motion to approve the petition of the pole replacement and send a cover letter asking them to remove the poles within one year, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Minutes from Previous Meetings: Mr. Cobb made the motion to approve the minutes dated December 17, 2009, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Motion carried 4 - 0 with one abstention.

Mr. Cobb made the motion to approve the minutes dated December 22, 2009. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which passed 4 - 0 with one abstention.

Mr. Cobb made the motion to approve the minutes dated January 14, 2010. Mr. Boyer seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

Warning: The Warning was discussed by article number, the recording secretary did not have access to a copy of the Warning therefore could not take minutes on the discussion that took place.

Mr. Cobb suggested holding a special Select Board meeting the Monday before the Town Meeting for an informational meeting on the repeal of the Zoning Bylaws and Subdivision Regulations. The consensus of the Board was to send out a notice to all voters notifying them of this meeting. Treasurers Report: Mr. Cobb made the motion to approve the Treasurer Warrants as follows:

1. Call to Order: Mr. Arrison called the Weathersfield Select Board meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday January 7, 2010.

2. Executive Session for the purpose of considering the appointment or employment of a public official: Mr. Boyer made the motion to go into executive session. Mr. Fuller seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

3. 6:30 p.m. Public Hearing, Ancient Roads Determination: Mr. Arrison gave a brief history and the reason for identifying ancient roads within Weathersfield. He said we have to have a map showing the roads we want to retain on a map and to the State of Vermont by February 10, 2010. If we add roads after that date, but before 2015, the process will be more involved and more expensive.

Mr. Melen read a letter of recognition that the Select Board will give to each member of the Ancient Road Committee. Mr. Boyer made the motion to direct the Chair to sign the letters of recognition. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

Mr. Arrison said we will discuss the roads one at a time. Ms. Lloyd Wright said on behalf of the Trails Committee she asks the Select Board to retain all of them for trails.

Mr. Melen read the Public Hearing and said the process is to see if the Town wishes to retain rights to the roads as a Class IV road and then they can go through the process to reclassify as a trail if they wish. Mr. Melen noted there is no required maintenance for a trail but the town does maintain the bridges and culverts on a Class IV road.

Mr. Todd asked the width's of a Class IV road vs. a trail. Mr. Melen said it is how ever they were originally laid out. Mrs. Bearse said most of the roads that will be discussed tonight are four rods but a few are presumed to be three rods.

Mr. Pratley asked if the town maintains the rights of a road is it a public way, Mr. Melen said yes – open to the public.

Mr. Snyder asked if the Town is planning on identifying any of these roads as unidentified corridors. Mrs. Bearse said any of these roads that are not retained by the Town will become unidentified corridors until discontinued or reclassified.

Mr. Wood asked the process of changing a Class IV road to a trail. Mr. Melen said the Select Board would have to hold public hearings, notify the abutting landowners and "visit" the area to make their determination.

Mr. Leever said he has a problem with vehicle traffic on Asa Grout Lane. Mr. Melen said the default setting is Class IV but citizens can petition the Select Board for reclassification to a trail.

Mr. DiDomenico asked the rights of the landowner if it is a trail. Mr. Melen said the Secretary of State says that abutting landowners may pent a road by installing an unlocked gate. Mr. Melen noted that if it is a trail then the landowner can not use vehicles on it either.

Mr. Fuller asked how many miles of Class IV roads and how many miles of trails we have in town. Mr. Melen could not answer that question; he said they are not tracked since no state aid is received for them.

Road A: starting at a point at the end of Town Highway 41, the so-called Hidden Glen Road, proceeding in a southeasterly direction roughly parallel to Route 131 to the eastern boundary of I-91; then starting at a point opposite on the western boundary of I-91 continuing in a southwesterly direction to the intersection of Town Highway 46, the so-called Goulden Ridge Road, with Town Highway 44, the so-called Goulden Ridge Road, then along Town Highway 44 to the intersection of Town Highway 44 and Town Highway 1, the so-called Weathersfield Center Road, thence crossing Town Highway 1 and continuing in a southwesterly direction to a mid-point on Town Highway 47, the so-

called Perkins Hill Road at the intersection to town Highway 73, the so-called Grout Lane thence continuing along Grout Lane and thence southwesterly in a line with Grout Lane for a distance of approximately one thousand, five hundred feet.

Mr. Arrison said information may not be complete, only searched back as far as 1830. Mr. Fuller said he has a hard time supporting this if more information will be found.

Mr. Leever said he lives on Asa Grout Lane and owns a good part of the property on Perkins Hill Road to end of Road A which is in a Land Trust. He said the Land Trust prevents building but guarantees access to the trails so there is no need for a road to be there.

Mr. Eaton asked if all abutting landowners have been notified, Mr. Melen said to the best of our knowledge. Mr. Eaton said he knows the Porter's and Hall's were not notified by mail. Mr. Eaton asked if we are talking about the entire Road A or bits and pieces. Mr. Eaton asked if they can pick and choose sections of the road or if they have to classify the whole road the same, Mr. Melen said the Select Board can pick and choose if they wish.

Mr. Johnson said a large portion crosses through his property and it is a road to nowhere. He said he was told the road was thrown up when the new road was put in. Mr. Arrison said the question is, is it in the public good to retain the road and that is what the Select Board is trying to do tonight.

Mr. Todd said the Planning Commission should have given their input since these are being considered for the public good. Mr. Melen said the Statute doesn't warrant having the Planning Commission participate so it wasn't sent to them.

Mr. Blackburn said he has heard the section of the road by Hidden Glen Road has been discontinued, Mr. Arrison said that is true – it has been discontinued.

Mr. Fuller said since the Hall's and Porter's were not notified of the Public Hearing he feels this road will need to be broken down in sections.

Mr. Snyder asked why not just discontinue them all. Mr. Arrison said some have historical significance.

Mr. Arrison said let's look at the section between I-91 and Goulden Ridge Road. Mr. Johnson said it doesn't border anyone else's property but his. Mr. Fisher made the motion to retain the section of Road A between I-91 and Goulden Ridge Road, Mr. Fuller seconded the motion. Mr. Arrison said he will respect the landowners wish and vote no. Motion 0-4, motion defeated.

Mr. Fisher made the motion to retain the section between Tenney Hill and the Interstate, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Motion was defeated 0 - 4.

Mr. Fisher made the motion to retain the portion of Road A at the end of the existing town road known as Grout Lane to the end of the original layout at the end, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mr. Fuller asked Mr. Leever if he wanted it as a trail, Mr. Leever said he would like it discontinued. Motion 0-4, motion defeated.

Road F: starting at a point on Town Highway 6, the so-called Ascutney Basin Road, where it crosses Youngs Brook, proceeding in a northeasterly direction to the West Windsor town line. Mr. William Smith questioned if this goes to the town line. Mr. Melen said no, it veers off. He said it abuts the wildlife management area but doesn't go into it. Mr. William Smith said vehicles drive in and out of there now.

Mr. Fisher made the motion to retain the section from Ascutney Basin Road to the West Windsor town line, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mr. Fuller asked who owns the land at the top chart we are looking at; Mr. Melen said it is the wildlife management area. Motion carried 4 - 0.

Road G: starting at a point on Town Highway 5, the so-called Little Ascutney Road, opposite the end of Town Highway 11, the so-called Lottery Lane, and proceeding in a northerly direction along the ledges to Town Highway 6, the so-called Ascutney Basin Road, at the point where it crosses Youngs Brook. Mr. Snyder said this map doesn't match the tax map and the descriptions do not match either.

Mr. Fuller recused himself. He said not all abutters were notified of this Public Hearing – at least three of them.

Mrs. Snyder said Little Ascutney Road was called Turnpike Road at one time. She said there is no identification of a road through the fields by her house.

Mrs. Houghton said they found information from the 1700's and there was a lot of land speculation, lots of deeds along the meadow but it is very difficult to prove. Mr. Goddard said he lives across the field and going in from the North to the corner of the stone walls there is a bar gate and distinct evidence of a road on the ground.

Mr. Fuller said he is asking for this to be discontinued. Mr. Pratley said he agrees with Mr. Fuller. Mr. Snyder said he prefers this is discontinued as well.

Ms. Lloyd Wright said there was a house there one time above the Snyder's and feels the road should be retained for access to the cemetery/burial ground.

Mr. Fisher said if there are some people that were not notified of the Public Hearing we should not act on this. Mr. Daniels asked if between tonight and February 9th people get back to the Select Board can they still act on something. Mr. Melen said once the Public Hearing is closed no further evidence can be taken.

Mr. Boyer made the motion to retain Road G as a Class IV road, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Motion was defeated 0-3.

Road H: starting at the end of Town Highway 63, the so-called Stokes Road, and proceeding in a southwesterly direction along what is commonly known as Carley Road to the Springfield town line and the intersection with Chevalier Trail in the Town of Springfield. Mrs. Houghton said Carley Road was laid out in 1972, she said there was a Public Hearing posted but no records were found that the Hearing was ever held. She said in 2002 Carley Road was classified as a Class IV road.

Mr. DiDomenico said he owns land in this area and in Springfield too and the snowmobile club uses this land.

Mr. Carlin said he's been here for five years and this has been a "private" road but people do drive up from Springfield. He asked if the landowners could close it to vehicles, Mr. Arrison said the Town could if it was a trail. Mr. Fuller said it was already noted that it was a Class IV road in 2002.

Mr. Fuller made the motion to retain Road H, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

Road I: starting on the east side of Town Highway 4, the so-called Reservoir Road, just north of Town Highway 38, the so-called Butterfield Hill Road, and proceeding in a northeasterly direction in a straight line crossing lands now owned by the Town of Springfield for a distance of five thousand, eight hundred twenty-five feet. Mr. Leever said he abuts the end of the road and supports making this a Class IV road.

Mr. Fuller made the motion to exempt the piece from Butterfield Hill Road down to the Reservoir Road. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which passed 4 - 0.

Mr. Boyer made the motion to retain the section from Butterfield Hill Road to the end of the laid out road. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Road J: starting at a point on the west side of Route 5 opposite the intersection of Town Highway 53, the so-called Ferry Road, then proceeding west and southwesterly to the right-of-way for I-91 as marked by two boundary markers on the eastern boundary of I-91. Mr. Fuller made the motion to retain Road J from US Route 5 to I-91, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mr. Dana said he supports having this as a Class IV road. Mr. Melen read a letter received from Joy Smith supporting to retain this. Motion carried 4 - 0.

Old Bow Road: starting at a point on the east side of Town Highway 51, the socalled Bowen Hill Road, then proceeding east then northeasterly along the roadway now known as Old Bow Road to a point marked by two boundary markers on the west side of I-91. Mr. Melen noted this is Old Bow Road which has been discussed in the past.

Volume 3, Page 321, D1: starting at a point on the south side of Town Highway 25, the so-called Maple Street, and proceeding south along what is commonly known as Drumlin Road for a distance of two thousand, nine hundred twenty-one feet. Mr. Boyer made the motion to retain Volume 3, Page 321, D1. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

Ms. Lloyd Wright said as Chair of the Cemetery Commission she would like the town to retain this as it is the original access to the Towle Cemetery. She said otherwise the Cemetery Commission would like an official deed allowing assess to the Towle Cemetery. Mr. Gurney and Mr. Limlaw said they are ok with having a deed; they do not have a problem with their land being used as an access to the cemetery.

Mr. Fuller made the motion to retain Volume 2, page 99, D2, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Motion was defeated 0 - 4.

Mr. Boyer made the motion to retain the section from Yewell Lane to Skyline Drive. Mr. Fisher seconded the motion which was defeated 0 - 4.

Volume 2, Page 139: starting at a point at the end of Town Highway 72, the socalled Dake Hill Road, and proceeding due south a distance of three thousand, one hundred nineteen feet to the discontinued right-of-way referred to as Blood Brook Road. Mr. Daniels said he lives at the end of Dake Hill Road and he has never seen any physical evidence of a road from his house to Cooks Pond Road. Mrs. Daniels said she hasn't spoken with the Stevens' who are also abutters but she feels it should be discontinued.

Mr. Fuller made the motion to retain Volume 2, Page 139, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Vote was 1-3, motion defeated.

Crown Point Road: starting at a point on the Cavendish town line south of Town Highway 32, the so-called Tarbell Hill Road, along what is historically known and marked as the Crown Point Road to a point southerly at the Springfield town line. Mr. Fisher made the motion to retain Crown Point Road, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion.

Mr. Goddard said this whole section is four rod. Mrs. Bearse said she disagrees, the ends are four rods but the section in between may be only three rods.

Mr. Leever said he supports retaining this as a Class IV road and possibly reclassifying as a trail. Mr. Wood said he does as well. Mr. Fuller said this is a prime piece of history.

Motion carried 3 - 0 with one abstention.

There was discussion as to if there is time to notify the abutters that were not notified tonight. Mrs. Bearse said she knows the Potter's were aware of the Public Hearing because they called her. Mr. Fuller made the motion to recess the Public Hearing until January 21, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at Martin Memorial Hall. Mr. Boyer seconded the motion which passed without dissent.

Mr. Goddard asked what the Ancient Road Committee is to do at this time. After discussion it was decided that the Select Board will decide and let them know how they should proceed.

4. Request Plowing of the Plain Cemetery Road, Town Highway 18: Mr. Melen said the Board received a letter from Ruby L. Pinders regarding plowing. He said the Town has been claiming aid on it from the State as a Class III road.

Mr. Fuller said he measured it and it is only eleven feet wide, he doesn't feel the town should maintain it. He noted that there are water issues stemming from site work.

Mr. Boyer made the motion to maintain Town Highway #16, Mr. Fisher seconded the motion. Motion 0-4, motion defeated.

Mrs. Daniels said she thought the Martin Memorial Hall Trustee's budget was going to be discussed tonight. Mr. Melen said the Highway and General Fund budgets would be discussed next Thursday the 14th at 7:00 p.m.

1. Call to Order by Chairperson: Mr. Arrison called the Weathersfield Select Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday June 18, 2009 at Martin Memorial Hall.

2. Public Hearing – Proposal to Reclassify Town Highway – Old Weathersfield Center Road: Mr. Melen read the public notice that was posted in the Eagle Times (the newspaper of record) on June 3rd and again on June 18th. He also noted that one filing in writing was received from Mr. Ankuda on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. Kamel. He read the letter for the record and noted it was dated June 11, 2009. Mr. Melen also said that notices were sent to abutting property owners.

Mr. Bowen was present on behalf of the Cyr's and asked the Board if they obtained any experts or surveyors regarding the location of the road. Mr. Arrison said no. Mr. Bowen asked the Board if the only evidence they have is the description found in the land records and through the site visit. Mr. Arrison said that is correct. Mr. Bowen asked the Board to give consideration to the survey; Mr. Arrison said the survey has been taken as evidence. Mr. Bowen asked why the Board didn't take the survey into consideration. Mr. Arrison said he doesn't dispute the statement that many roads on the paper took a different route but the road we followed may or may not have been an actual road. He said the Board feels the original town records are the ones to go by. Mr. Bowen said he realizes some areas were rough but felt the rock walls marked the road.

After discussion Mr. Melen said the Town has no obligation to resurvey they can however respond to a request from landowners in the future for a new survey and another classification (reclassification).

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Mr. Fuller asked if a Class IV road was a three rod road. Mr. Melen said most roads in town are four rod roads and the classes define the level of maintenance, a trail does not have any maintenance.

There was discussion that the stone walls may or may not have been in place before the road. Mr. Bowen confirmed this was not being classified as an ancient road, Mr. Melen said that is correct.

Mr. Spear said he was Mr. Cyr's son in law and asked when he inherits the 100 acres how does he get to the land. Mr. Melen said this does not eliminate or prohibit use of the right of way, it just says the town will not maintain it. There was discussion if the land would be land locked if the 27 acre parcel was sold to another party. Mr. Melen said Mr. Spear should discuss this with an attorney.

Mr. Cobb made the motion to classify the road on the Kamel property as described in the Warning as a trail, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mr. Fuller asked if anyone objected. Mr. Bowen said he objected because the road was surveyed by an expert and he feels there is a road laid out and the Board chose not to hire their own survey to support the Cyr's survey. He said the Town is rejecting a survey done by licensed professional. Mr. Fuller asked if Town disputed that there is a road there or may have been a road there. Mr. Melen said in November the Board walked where the road may been. Motion passed 3 - 1.

3. Comments from Citizens: None

4. Review Minutes from Previous Meeting(s): Mr. Cobb made the motion to approve the minutes dated June 4, 2009, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Ms. Sargent read corrections that had been submitted to her via email. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Request to Reverse Delinquent Tax Penalty – George and Shirley Ritchie: Mr. Ritchie said he would like to address the Board and ask that the penalty he received be relieved. He admitted he paid one week late but feels the penalty is too steep (8%). Mr. Melen noted the penalty percentage is set at town meeting and can be changed at a town meeting. After discussion, Mr. Cobb made the motion to waive the penalty for \$61.49 for George and Shirley Parker on parcel # 120019. Mr. Boyer seconded the motion, the motion failed 0 - 4.

6. Request to discuss Animal Control- Stanley Lafko: Mr. Arrison noted that Mr. Lafko was not present. Ms. Julia Lloyd Wright said she would like the Animal Control Ordinance enforced. Mr. Cobb recommended setting s save a heart trap, without bait, and then there would be confirmation it is the Lafko's cat on her property without being baited. Chief Brown said he spoke with Mr. Lafko and he feels the cat is being baited with food and cat nip. The consensus of the Board was to set a save a heart trap and Mr. Melen will get with the Constable to have this done.

7. Ascutney Volunteer Fire Department

-Application to Conduct Coin Drop: Mr. Boyer made the motion recommending the Ascutney Volunteer Fire Department be granted permission to have coin drop on Route 5 on August 1, 2009, Mr. Cobb seconded the motion. Mr. Fuller said he does not like this idea as a general way to collect money, he said he has

1. Call to Order by Chairperson: Mr. Arrison called the meeting and Public Hearing to order at 6:33 p.m.

Public Hearing, Proposal to Reclassify the Old Weathersfield Road: Mr. Bowen 2. said the Vermont Supreme Court has stated that a road exists where a road was built. He said this is a Class IV road because any road without a designation is a Class IV road.

Mr. Dibernardo provided maps, surveys and copies of deeds for the Board to review.

Mr. Arrison said even though there is some evidence of a road he didn't see any evidence at the northern end that led to a road and said it may have been just a skid row. He said the break in the bar way didn't look like a road went through. Mr. Cobb said he saw very little between the cellar hole and the Springfield line that convinced him there was a road. Mr. Fisher agreed with Mr. Cobb. Mr. Dibernardo said it is possible the stone walls were built after the road was laid out.

Mrs. Bearse asked the purpose of the reclassification. Mr. Bowen said there are 103 acres that is land locked. Mr. Bearse said the landowner can access their land through a Right of Way, the Town is not allowed to land lock land to landowners but the public does not have access to it.

Mr. Arrison called the site inspection to order at 2:00 P.M. on Saturday, November 22nd, 2008, at the Michael Kamel residence, located at 478 Weathersfield Center Road.

Mr. Melen reminded all the present that the site inspection was not on the record, and that any information which the parties wished to enter as evidence would have to be stated during the public hearing, at 6:30 P.M. on Thursday, December 4th, 2008.

Mr. Melen also advised all present that Mr. Gurney met the intent of 'interested party,' as his land abutted the Town highway right-of-way.

Mr. DiBernardo distributed copies of the plat he prepared for the highway right-of-way. Those present, with the exception of Mr. Melen, proceeded to conduct a site inspection of the right-of-way in question.

After the group had left, Frank Manafort, who leases the hay fields that the right-of-way allegedly crosses, arrived at the site. Mr. Melen showed him the plat, and advised him of the public hearing. After speaking with Mr. Melen a few minutes, Mr. Manafort left.

The Select Board and the rest of the attendees returned to the Kamel residence at 3:15 P.M. on November 22^{nd} , 2008, and the site inspection was concluded.
