

Road H

Starting at the end of Town Highway 63, the so-called Stokes Road, and proceeding in a southwesterly direction along what is commonly known as Carley Road to the Springfield town line and the intersection with Chevalier Trail in the Town of Springfield. 
Report of the Selectors for the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, on proceedings to lay out a Town highway in Weathersfield

On the third day of November, 2005, A.D., we, the undersigned Selectors of the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, a municipal corporation in Windsor County, State of Vermont, prepared a notice, in writing, of the proposed laying out of a public Town highway in the Town of Weathersfield, in accordance with the provisions of Title 19, Chapter 7, of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.

The highway to be laid out is described as follows:

Being a portion of the property conveyed to Ronald E. Brown and Sandra H. Brown, husband and wife, by Deed of the Horace Z. Childs Estate, dated March 23, 1990, and recorded March 27, 1990, in Book 76, Page 452, of the Weathersfield, Vermont, Land Records; and being a portion of the land and premises conveyed to Ronald E. Brown and Sandra H. Brown by Deed of the Horace Z. Childs Estate, dated May 27, 1990, and recorded in Book 86, Page 274, of the Weathersfield, Vermont, Land Records.

The premises conveyed are more particularly described as:



- Thence in a southwesterly direction along a curve having a length of 207.69 feet, a radius of 479.81 feet and a delta of 24° 48′ 3″ to an iron pin;
- C Thence S 15° 42' 45" W 158.98 feet to an iron pin;

Thence N 40°39′35″ E 243.64 feet along the boundary of Lot 1 to an iron pin at the end of the stonewall set in the southerly right-of-way limits of Maple Street.

The document relinquishing said roadway to the Town is recorded in Book 107, Pages 281 and 282, of the Land Records of the Town of Weathersfield.

This roadway is more commonly known as "Drumlin Road."

In a public notice dated September 15th, 2005, posted at the Weathersfield Town Clerk's office and the U.S. Post Office in Ascutney, and published in the newspaper of record for the Town on September 21st, October 5th, and October 19th, 2005, stating that the Select Board would meet at 9:00 o'clock, A.M., on the twenty-second day of October, 2005, at the site of the proposed Town highway, to consider laying out an existing private roadway, the so-called Drumlin Road, as a Town highway.

A copy of this notice was mailed, by certified mail with return receipt requested, to the following abutting property owners on September 19th, 2005:


they being the owners of the land abutting the said highway to be laid out. The notice was also recorded in the records of the Town of Weathersfield.

At 9:00 o'clock, A.M., on Saturday, October 22nd, 2005, the Select Board met at the intersection of Town Highway 25, Maple Street, and the so-called Drumlin Road for the purpose of examining the premises. Present were Chairperson C. Peter Cole, Vice-Chairperson Henry C. Cobb, Board Clerk Norman John Arrison, and Selector Patricia W. Daniels.

The public hearing was recessed until 10:00 o'clock, A.M., on October 22nd, 2005, at the Weathersfield Highway Garage, in Perkinsville, to hear the parties interested. When the Board convened the public hearing, no members of the public attended.

After the Select Board's examination of the premises, and discussing the same with those parties present, the following facts were determined:

1. On October 1st, 1992, Ronald E. and Sandra H. Brown were issued a land use permit, No. 2S0818-3, to create an eleven (11) lot subdivision off Maple Street in Perkinsville, Vermont. This permit is recorded at Book 83, Pages 132 through 136, inclusive, in the Weathersfield Town Land Records.



- 1. Call to order by Chairperson: Mr. Cobb called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Martin Memorial Hall. Mr. Cobb noted that in Mr. Cole's absence he would be Chair. Mr. Melen said the Public Hearing on October 22, 2005 was recessed until tonight at 7:15
- 2. Public Hearing Town Highway 32 (Tarbell Hill Road). Consider Proposal to Reclassify to Class II Town Highway: Mr. Cobb opened the Public Hearing for Tarbell Hill. Mr. Melen said this is to reclassify Tarbell Hill Road from a Class III to a Class II road. Mr. Melen said he needs to talk with Wayne Gammel about this and would like to recess the Hearing. Mr. Arrison made a motion to recess the Public Hearing on Tarbell Hill until November 17, 2005 at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Boyer seconded the motion which passed without dissent.
- 3. Comments from Citizens: Mr. Melen showed one of the new magnetic Town seals he had made up as the others were very old and had demagnetized. These are used on Town Vehicles. He also had new patches made for the Police uniforms that match the seals.

Ms. Julia Lloyd Wright asked about generating electricity from the Landfill, she said she saw a TV program where a NH town did this. Mr. Melen said this was not possible to do in our Town as the landfill was closed too long ago.

Ms. Lloyd Wright asked about using Bio fuel for the Town Vehicles. She said this was just a suggestion since it is being talked about.

Mr. Barry Newton questioned if the Town could do a courtesy grade on the Class IV section of Old Bow Road. He said the way the water drains from the Class III section it is ruining the Class IV section. Mr. Melen said this is not a Class IV section, once the Class III road ends it is a private road. Mr. Cobb asked to discuss this again when Mr. Hazeltine is present.

Mr. Newton said he has one dog still at Springfield Animal Hospital that he has not been able to place.

Mrs. Daniels said she spoke with Mrs. Grover yesterday and Chief Grover is still in Boston but doing well. He is expected to be there about another two weeks. Mrs. Daniels said she has his address if anyone would like it to give her a call.

Mr. Arrison said he talked to Steven Melanson about the lights at the Town Garage and he said there is glare from the lights. He asked when they need to be replaced they consider the glare that it causes. Mr. Melen said the lights will probably need to be replaced soon.

7:15 p.m. Mr. Cobb opened the Public Hearing on the Continuance on Drumlin Road. Mr. Melen said there are eleven findings of fact and one condition. Mr. Boyer made the motion to lay out Drumlin Road as a Town Highway, Mrs. Daniels seconded the motion. Mr. Arrison asked where the description came from. Mr. Melen said Gary Rapanitti. Motion carried 4-0.

4. Review Minutes from Previous Meeting (s): Mr. Arrison made the motion to approve the minutes dated September 22, 2005, Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mrs. Daniels noted corrections. Motion carried 4-0.

Mr. Arrison made the motion to approve the minutes dated October 20, 2005; Mr. Boyer seconded the motion. Mr. Cobb noted corrections. Motion carried 4 -0.

5. Request to waive fee to amend a Conditional Use Permit, Getaway Mountain Campground: Mr. Cobb recused himself, Mr. Arrison was Chair for this discussion. Mr. Arrison said he spoke with Mrs. Bearse and she said the application has been processed but no action has been taken. The fee is \$200.00. Mr. Arrison also asked for a copy of the State Statute on Fire Works.

Mr. Melen said the only time the Board has waived a fee in the last six years is for a non profit or charitable organization.

Mr. Cobb said the applicants letter to the Board stated that these functions have not created a problem in the past however he feels they have created a problem in the past and he has expressed his concerns. He also said by the letter saying they are willing to have their conditions amended to make everyone happy it sounds like it has been approved and it hasn't been approved yet.

Mr. Boyer said this is an amendment and he feels they should pay the fee.

Mrs. Daniels made the motion to abate the fees for Getaway Mountain Campground application for an amendment. Mr. Boyer seconded the motion which was defeated 3-0.

6. Monthly Activity Reports:

Constable: Mr. Newton went over his written report that he submitted. Mr. Arrison asked Mr. Newton if our ordinance was written ok, Mr. Newton said yes. Mr. Cobb asked how the unlicensed dog list was coming, Mr. Newton said it is down to about 2/3 of a page.

Land Use Administrator: No discussion

Police Chief: Chief Brown said the new police vehicle is now on the road.

2. Condition No. 11, of said permit, states, in part:

The Homeowners' Association shall be responsible for necessary maintenance of the stormwater management system and the project road until such time they may be taken over by the Town.

- 3. On February 4th, 2000, Ronald E. and Sandra H. Brown executed a 'quit claim' deed to the Town of Weathersfield, assigning fee simple ownership of a strip of land, fifty feet (50') wide containing the so-called Drumlin Road, to the Town. This is recorded at Book 107, Pages 281 and 282, of the Weathersfield Town Land Records.
- 4. There is a survey of the roadway, Project No. 04-594, completed by Gary Rapanotti, L.S., dated September 8th, 2005, recorded with the Town of Weathersfield.
- 5. The roadway is gravel surfaced.
- 6. During construction, the Town's Highway Superintendent inspected the roadway, which complies with Town standards.
- 7. The roadway serves a low density residential subdivision, with eleven (11) lots.
- 8. A gravel pit, leased and operated by the Town of Weathersfield, is located at the end of the roadway.
- 9. Based upon the Board's on-site observations, the roadway is currently accessible to emergency vehicles.
- 10. The roadway is fairly level, with no sharp grades.
- 11. There are two (2) private roads connecting with this roadway, Pine Pitch Road which serves three (3) properties, and Grouse Lane, which is currently undeveloped.

After considering the laying out of a Town highway, and after hearing the parties interested, we find that:

- A. The convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Weathersfield requires that the so-called "Drumlin Road" be laid out as a Town highway; and
- B. The public good of the inhabitants of the Town of Weathersfield requires that the so-called "Drumlin Road" be laid out as a Town highway; and

Now, therefore, we order that the private roadway now known as Drumlin Road be laid out as a Town highway, subject to the following condition:

The Town shall be responsible for immediately constructing a cul-de-sac at the end of the Town Highway, as depicted in the recorded survey, in accordance with Town Highway Standards.

Upon full compliance with the terms of the condition, preceding, the Town of Weathersfield will accept the roadway as a Town highway, and maintain the roadway as such.

Report of the Selectors for the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, on proceedings to lay out a Town highway in Weathersfield

On the third day of November, 2005, A.D., we, the undersigned Selectors of the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, a municipal corporation in Windsor County, State of Vermont, prepared a notice, in writing, of the proposed laying out of a public Town highway in the Town of Weathersfield, in accordance with the provisions of Title 19, Chapter 7, of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.

The highway to be laid out is described as follows:

Being a portion of the property conveyed to Ronald E. Brown and Sandra H. Brown, husband and wife, by Deed of the Horace Z. Childs Estate, dated March 23, 1990, and recorded March 27, 1990, in Book 76, Page 452, of the Weathersfield, Vermont, Land Records; and being a portion of the land and premises conveyed to Ronald E. Brown and Sandra H. Brown by Deed of the Horace Z. Childs Estate, dated May 27, 1990, and recorded in Book 86, Page 274, of the Weathersfield, Vermont, Land Records.

The premises conveyed are more particularly described as:

Beginning at a point marked by an iron pin set at the end of a stonewall at the southerly right-of-way limits of Maple Street; thence S 40° 30′ 35″ W 240.56 feet to an iron pin;

Thence in a southwesterly direction along a curve having a length of 207.69 feet, a radius of 479.81 feet and a delta of 24° 48′ 3″ to an iron pin;

Thence S 15° 42' 45" W 158.98 feet to an iron pin;

Thence in a southwesterly direction along a curve having a length of 112.20 feet to an iron pin set, marking a common boundary of Lots 10 and 11 [the last four (4) courses marking the common boundary of Lot 11 and the northwesterly right-of-way limits of Drumlin Road];

Thence S 4° 24′ 15″ W 216.4 feet to a point marking the corner of Lots 9 and 10 [the last two (2) courses marking the common boundary line of Lot 10 and the northwesterly right-of-way limits of Drumlin Road];

Thence continuing S 4°24' 15" W 29.13 feet to an iron pin;

Thence S 85° 35' 45" E 50 feet to an iron pin at the boundary of Lot 6;

Thence N 4° 24′ 15″ E 200.07 along the boundary line Lot 6 and said right-of-way to an iron pin set at a stonewall;

Thence continuing N 4° 24' 15" E 10.53 feet to an iron pin;

Then continuing in a northeasterly direction along a curve having a length of 234.29 feet, a radius of 1,187.47 feet, and a delta of 11° 18′ 16″ along the boundary of Lot 5 and said right-of-way to an iron pin, marking the common corner of Lots 2 and 5 and the southeasterly right-of-way limits of Drumlin Road;

Thence N 15° 42' 35" E 158.98 feet along the common boundary of Lot 2 and said right-of-way to an iron pin;

Thence in a northeasterly direction along a curve and the boundary of Lot 2, 46 feet to an iron pin, marking a common corner of Lots 1 and 2;

Then in a northeasterly direction along a curve having a length of 140.60 feet, a radius of 429.81 feet, and a delta of 24° 48′ 03" along the boundary of Lot 1 to an iron pin;

Thence N 40°39' 35" E 243.64 feet along the boundary of Lot 1 to an iron pin at the end of the stonewall set in the southerly right-of-way limits of Maple Street.

The document relinquishing said roadway to the Town is recorded in Book 107, Pages 281 and 282, of the Land Records of the Town of Weathersfield.

This roadway is more commonly known as "Drumlin Road."

In a public notice dated September 15th, 2005, posted at the Weathersfield Town Clerk's office and the U.S. Post Office in Ascutney, and published in the newspaper of record for the Town on September 21st, October 5th, and October 19th, 2005, stating that the Select Board would meet at 9:00 o'clock, A.M., on the twenty-second day of October, 2005, at the site of the proposed Town highway, to consider laying out an existing private roadway, the so-called Drumlin Road, as a Town highway.

A copy of this notice was mailed, by certified mail with return receipt requested, to the following abutting property owners on September 19th, 2005:

they being the owners of the land abutting the said highway to be laid out. The notice was also recorded in the records of the Town of Weathersfield.

At 9:00 o'clock, A.M., on Saturday, October 22nd, 2005, the Select Board met at the intersection of Town Highway 25, Maple Street, and the so-called Drumlin Road for the purpose of examining the premises. Present were Chairperson C. Peter Cole, Vice-Chairperson Henry C. Cobb, Board Clerk Norman John Arrison, and Selector Patricia W. Daniels.

The public hearing was recessed until 10:00 o'clock, A.M., on October 22nd, 2005, at the Weathersfield Highway Garage, in Perkinsville, to hear the parties interested. When the Board convened the public hearing, no members of the public attended.

After the Select Board's examination of the premises, and discussing the same with those parties present, the following facts were determined:

1. On October 1st, 1992, Ronald E. and Sandra H. Brown were issued a land use permit, No. 2S0818-3, to create an eleven (11) lot subdivision off Maple Street in Perkinsville, Vermont. This permit is recorded at Book 83, Pages 132 through 136, inclusive, in the Weathersfield Town Land Records.

2. Condition No. 11, of said permit, states, in part:

The Homeowners' Association shall be responsible for necessary maintenance of the stormwater management system and the project road until such time they may be taken over by the Town.
