REPORT OF DISCONTINUANCE OF HIGHWAYS TH # 70 Skyland Lane.

Beginning at a point 40 feet north of utility pole # 1311/10/10 and extending northerly to the end of Skyland Lane.

WHEREAS at Woodstock on the 4th day of December 2001, the Selectmen of the Town of Woodstock did give public notice that they had scheduled a public hearing for January 15, 2002 at 7:30 P.M. and a site inspection on the same day at 9:00 A.M. to consider discontinuing the northerly end of Skyland Lane.

WHEREUPON the said Selectmen did order and appoint that on the 15 th day of January, 2002 at 9:00 A.M., Eastern Standard time, they would conduct a site inspection at the aforesaid Skyland Lane Following this site visit, at 7:30 P.M. they would meet in their office at the Town Hall, to conduct a public hearing and hear the parties interested. They did give notice hereof in the Vermont Standard on December 13, 2001, mailing a copy of the notice to adjoining landowners, posting at the Town Clerk's office and giving a copy to the Planning Commission of said town and mailing a copy to the Commissioner of Forests & Parks.

ON the, 15 th day of January 2002, the Selectmen held said site inspection. At said site inspection, there appeared: John D. Doten Jr., Glenn Frederick and Philip Swanson, those attending the site inspection did review the section of road to be discontinued and decided to recommend to the Board of Selectmen that the section of this road to be discontinue begin approximately 93 feet northerly of utility pole # 1311/10/10 to allow room on the Town Highway for municipal highway equipment to turn around. The public hearing was recessed until later that evening at 7:30 PM as warned.

ON January 15 th 2002 at 7:30 PM, the selectmen resumed the public hearing, heard all parties; and concluded that the road serves one residence, the landowner of the residence owns all of the land abutting the said Skyland Lane and the road is a dead end highway ending in the driveway of the home. The Selectmen concluded that the public good and convenience would be served by discontinuing the remaining length of Skyland lane beginning at a point approximately 93 feet northerly of the afore mentioned utility pole #1311/10/10, said point being further described as N 43.35' 03.9" W 072.30' 33.6"

WHEREUPON it is ordered by said Selectmen that the aforementioned section of Skyland Lane TH 70 be forever discontinued and the land under said highway shall be set out to the abutting landowner.
